ENFORCE THE MANDATORY ADMISSION ON CAPS

The Federal Ministry of Education has instructed the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) to enforce the mandatory use of the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS) for all tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

This directive follows the submission of a report by an Inter-Ministerial Committee,

established to investigate allegations of certificate racketeering involving foreign institutions, particularly in Cotonou, Benin Republic.

The then Permanent Secretary, now Head of Service of the Federation, Mrs. Didi Esther Walson-Jack, conveyed the Minister's request for implementation of the report's recommendations. JAMB has automated the CAPS platform to eliminate biases and abuses associated with manual admissions. However, some institutions have been admitting outside the platform, preferring to perpetuate unacceptable practices.

The directive reinforces JAMB's commitment to closing avenues for illegal admissions.

Candidates are warned not to accept admissions not offered through CAPS, as the Board will fully implement this ministerial directive.

ALL INSTITUTIONS MUST SUBMIT THEIR MATRICULATION LIST THREE MONTHS AFTER MATRICULATION

All tertiary institutions in Nigeria must submit their matriculation lists to the Federal Ministry of Education through the dedicated channel of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) not later than three months after matriculation ceremonies.

This directive from the Federal Ministry of Education aims to ensure compliance with innovations introduced by JAMB to address admission irregularities.

The adoption of the measure by the Federal Ministry of Education follows allegations of certificate racketeering

2024 ADMISSIONS: AVOID PAST PITFALLS – JAMB



As tertiary institutions prepare for the 2024 admission exercise, the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has reiterated that any admissions conducted outside the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS) will be deemed null and void. The Board emphasized that institutions must strictly follow established admission guidelines and adhere to the decisions made

during the recent 2024 Policy Meeting on Admissions. This is crucial to avoid previous mistakes that led to the condonement of illegal admissions—a practice the Federal Government is moving to eliminate permanently. JAMB urged all institutions to heed the warnings from the Hon. Minister of Education regarding the risks associated with bypassing Federal Government guidelines and

neglecting JAMB advisories on admissions.

In addition, the Board highlighted the importance of adopting paperless communication for official correspondence by utilizing the Integrated Brochure and Syllabus System (IBASS). This digitized platform facilitates communication between JAMB, tertiary institutions, and regulatory agencies in the education sector.

The IBASS platform also serves as an essential tool for disseminating prescribed admission quotas and outlining course requirements.

Moreover, JAMB reminded all institutions that users accessing CAPS for the 2024/25 admission exercise must log in using their official email addresses (e.g., vc@ui.edu.ng or vc.ui@gmail.com). Personal or private email addresses will no longer be permitted to access the CAPS platform.

CLARIFICATION ON DISCLOSURE OF ADMITTED CANDIDATES OUTSIDE CAPS (2017 - DATE)

The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has observed a large number of candidates thronging its offices to resolve issues related to the disclosure of candidates admitted outside the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS) from 2017 to date. While we appreciate the enthusiasm, we must correct the misconception that the focus is on

candidates' actions. The true emphasis lies with the institutions, which must disclose all candidates admitted outside CAPS before the August 31st, 2024 deadline. This directive requires immediate attention and compliance.

We urge institutions to carefully review our initial letter and ensure full

compliance, as failure to disclose will result in severe consequences. Candidates are also reminded not to accept admissions outside CAPS.

The Board reiterate that candidates not disclosed by institutions would not be entertained. The Board will not tolerate any Condonement of undisclosed admissions moving forward.

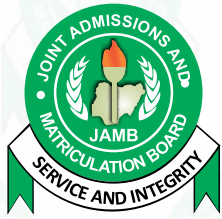

LINDAIKEJIBLOG, SUNDAY, AUGUST 11, 2024: Nigerian Govt Dissociates Self from Purported Same-Sex Marriage School Debate: The Federal Ministry of Education has disassociated itself from a purported school debate organized by the Creative Africa Initiative, titled "Same-Sex Marriage Should be Legalized in Nigeria." In a statement released on August 10, 2024, the ministry's director of press and public relations, Folasade Boriowo, revealed that the organisation had forged the ministry's letterhead paper and had no involvement with the debate.

The ministry noted that the forged letter, which proposed a debate on the sensitive topic, raised serious concerns. The letter featured an outdated reference number linked to a defunct department and displayed an old letterhead paper with superimposed font.

LEADERSHIP, SUNDAY, AUGUST 11, 2024: BUK Wins Top Prize At 2024 ACT Leadership Challenge: Bayero University Kano (BUK) has made history by emerging as the winner of the 2024 Aspire Coronation Trust (ACT) Foundation Leadership Challenge. This prestigious achievement was announced during the 2024 Enactus National Competition held on July 23 in Lagos, where BUK's team outshone over 20 other universities from across Nigeria.

The winning project, a revolutionary portable inverter system, was developed by a talented group of five BUK students under the mentorship of Professor Shamsudddeen Umar and Dr. Zainab Nuhu. This innovative

inverter, which harnesses the power of lithium batteries connected in series and parallel, generates an impressive 1,000 watts of electricity – enough to power essential appliances like light bulbs, fans, and small electronic devices.

The BUK team, comprising Ahmad Abdullahi, Rafiat Olajide, Nimatullah Hassan, Idris Haruna, and Aminat Adebisi, presented their groundbreaking project at the Civic Centre in Lagos. Their invention was lauded by the panel of judges as the best project in the competition, showcasing exceptional ingenuity and practical application.

PUNCH SUNDAY, AUGUST 11, 2024: NELFUND: Varsity Students Celebrate, Stock Foodstuffs with N20,000 Loan: University students who recently received the N20,000 stipend from the Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND) are celebrating the unexpected financial boost. Many took to social media to express their surprise and gratitude, while others shared how they used the funds to purchase essential food items. For some, the stipend alleviated the financial burden on their parents, who struggled to support their tertiary education.

Financial constraints are a significant challenge for many students in public tertiary institutions in Nigeria, often forcing young people to drop out due to lack of funds. However, NELFUND's recent disbursement of N20,000 each to 20,371 students from six institutions has brought relief to some. The beneficiary institutions include Bayero University, Kano; Federal University, Dutsin-Ma; University of Ilorin; University of Benin; University

of Ibadan; and University of Maiduguri.

YABALOADED.COM, MONDAY, AUGUST 12, 2024: "Nothing But Fraud": JAMB Sends Important Message To Students Running Part-Time Programmes: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has issued a statement to Nigerians enrolled in Part-Time programmes at various tertiary institutions across the country. According to JAMB, any daily Part-Time programme is fraudulent. The Board clarified that genuine Part-Time Programmes are typically held on weekends or specific periods, such as Friday evenings.

JAMB made this announcement on August 6 via its official X handle, @JAMBHQ, in response to a student's claim of completing a daily Part-Time Ordinary National Diploma (OND) programme at Lagos State Polytechnic. The Board alleged that the institution was masquerading as a regular programme as Part-Time.

JAMB emphasized that Part-Time Programmes cater to individuals with scheduling constraints, and are not meant to be attended daily like regular programmes. The Board stated, "Daily Part-Time Programme is nothing but fraud. Authentic Part-Time Programmes run on weekends or specific periods, whereas regular programmes operate daily, Monday to Friday, and occasionally on Saturdays. The question is how an institution can offer a regular programme disguised as Part-Time, especially without regulatory approval. Such programmes are invalid and will not be tolerated."

PREMIUM TIMES, MONDAY, AUGUST 12, 2024: [NYSC Cancels National Service Certificate Of University's 101 Graduates](#): The National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) has revoked and invalidated the national service certificates of 101 University of Calabar (UNICAL) graduates. The affected individuals include 99 who were illegally mobilized for national service between 2021 and 2023 and two who received exemption certificates illegally.

The NYSC management reaffirmed its commitment to ensuring that only qualified individuals receive national service certificates, stating that unqualified persons, including those from unaccredited universities, will not be recognized.

PUNCH, TUESDAY, AUGUST 13, 2024 [Kano Varsity Warns Students Against Cultism, Examination Malpractices](#): The management of Sa'adatu Rimi University of Education Kumbotso in Kano State has warned its students against engaging in cultism.

The Vice-Chancellor of the university, Prof. Yahaya Bunkure, issued the warning during a press briefing on Tuesday. He stated that the university would not permit students to be members of or belong to unregistered associations. "Any students found violating this directive would be subject to the rules and regulations governing the institution."

"We have our code of conduct, which every student, whether male or female, must adhere to, as we do not tolerate examination misconduct or any form of indiscipline. "For any student to join any club or association, such organisations must be duly registered and in compliance with the codes and conduct of the institution," he said.

He revealed that the Joint Admission and Matriculation Board has allocated 2,000 admission slots to the university for the 2024/2025 academic session.

PUNCH, TUESDAY, AUGUST 13, 2024:

[FG Revokes Two Smart Schools Contract In Kebbi, Bayelsa](#): The Federal Government says it has revoked the contract for the construction of a smart school in Kebbi State and re-awarded it to another contractor.

Minister of State for Education, Dr. Yusuf Sununu, also disclosed that the construction work of the smart school in Bayelsa State is also undergoing a revocation process.

Dr. Sununu disclosed this on Tuesday in Abuja, while taking a tour of the FCT Smart School in Karshi, accompanied by the Minister of Education, Prof. Tahir Mamman.

"The two schools that are lagging; that of Kebbi State have been revoked and awarded to another contractor, and Bayelsa is also undergoing due process to revoke the contract and be rewarded so that no state will be left behind in the smart school application of technology in education, (sic)" he said.

He also decried the failure of some states whose smart schools have been completed and handed over, to supply the federal government with 75 teachers for training on how to run the schools.

He therefore called on other states to emulate the FCT administration which is already providing roads and hostel accommodation to expand the scope of the smart school in its domain with a full complement of staff.

PUNCH, WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 14, 2024: [Student Loan: EFCC Releases N50bn To NELFUND](#): The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) has donated N50 billion to support the Nigerian

Education Loan Fund (NELFUND), an initiative of the President Bola Tinubu-led administration aimed at providing funding for indigent students' education. NELFUND's Managing Director, Akintunde Sawyerr, expressed gratitude for the donation, which was disclosed during a courtesy visit to the EFCC headquarters in Abuja on August 13,

2024.

Sawyerr acknowledged the EFCC's contribution, stating, "We appreciate the N50 billion injected into NELFUND from the proceeds of crime recovered by the commission. We are here to express our gratitude and request EFCC's oversight of our activities."

EFCC Chairman Ola Olukoyede commended President Tinubu for initiating NELFUND, describing it as a "policy issue against crimes." He emphasized the importance of transparency in NELFUND's dealings, urging the management team to ensure clean hands and transparent systems. Olukoyede also requested regular reports on the disbursement of funds, ensuring the N50 billion donation is utilized effectively and not "re-looted."

The EFCC's donation aims to support NELFUND's mission to address the educational needs of indigent students, recognising the significance of education in preventing financial crimes.

THISDAY, WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 14, 2024: [Nigeria's Out-of-School Crisis: UNICEF Calls for Increased Funding, Data-driven Advocacy](#): Azuka Menkiti, Education Specialist at UNICEF's Abuja Office, urged education stakeholders to prioritize adequate funding for secondary education and develop reliable data to advocate for support from state governors and donor agencies. She made this appeal at a two-day regional stakeholders' meeting in Ibadan, Oyo State, focusing on out-of-school children and retention, transition, and completion models for South West states.

Menkiti emphasized the need for states to engage community and religious leaders to address social norms that prevent children from attending school. She highlighted the importance of scaling up foundational literacy and numeracy programs to ensure children are prepared to learn and supported by

conducive learning environments.

The program aims to help states develop effective models to enhance retention, transition, and completion rates in secondary education, building on a decade-long intervention focused on girls' education. Menkiti noted that UNICEF is particularly concerned with children at risk of dropping out, especially in southwest states with high school attendance rates.

The meeting brought together commissioners, SUBEB chairmen, and permanent secretaries from southwest states to review models and determine their suitability for their respective states. Menkiti emphasized the need for credible evidence to advocate support and encourage states to develop plans and policies that support children's education.

Hamzat Omolaja, Director of Social Mobilization at Lagos State Universal Basic Education Board (LSUBEB), expressed optimism about the meeting's impact on addressing out-of-school children. He highlighted the board's commitment to ensuring every child has access to education through initiatives like 'Leave No Child Behind' and 'Project O', which aims for zero tolerance of out-of-school children.

DAILY TRUST, WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 14, 2024: Specialisation Limiting

Employment Opportunities for Graduates – JAMB Registrar:

Professor Is'haq Oloyede, Registrar of the Joint Admission and Matriculation Board (JAMB), has expressed concerns that the specialisation of courses in Nigerian tertiary institutions is limiting employment opportunities for graduates. He particularly criticized the unbundling of Mass Communication, advocating for a more broad-based approach to education.

Speaking at the 15th-anniversary celebration of the University of Ilorin's 89.3FM Radio Station, Oloyede emphasized that Specialisation should be restricted to postgraduate levels, as Nigeria's developmental stage requires a broader educational focus. He noted that the country has a high number of graduates seeking employment, and narrowing their expertise to a specific discipline would further limit their job prospects.

Oloyede highlighted the importance of maintaining Mass Communication as an undergraduate course, stressing that it is crucial for the country's development. He also emphasised the role of university radio stations in disseminating educational programs and information to students and surrounding communities.

In his remarks, the University of Ilorin's

Vice Chancellor, Professor Wahab Egbewole, commended the achievements of the campus radio, attributing its success to Oloyede's visionary efforts. The event's theme, "The Future of Radio, AI, and the Transformation of Broadcasting," sparked discussions on the evolving landscape of broadcasting and the role of radio in Nigeria's development. Appoints Substantive Vice-Chancellor For Nigerian University:

The Governing Council of Usmanu Danfodiyo University, Sokoto (UDUS) has approved the appointment of Bashir Garba, a professor, as the new vice-chancellor of the institution.

The appointment was approved at the 168th meeting of the university's governing council on Wednesday, 14 July, according to a statement by the university's Pro-Chancellor and Chairperson of Council, Attahiru Jega.

Prof. Jega, a former Chairperson of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC), noted that Prof. Garba, a professor of Applied Chemistry, is expected to assume office on 1 September for a single term of five years.

GUARDIAN, MONDAY, AUGUST 12, 2024: 2024 SSCE: WAEC Withholds Results of 215, 267 Candidates for Malpractice:

The West African Examination Council (WAEC) has announced the withholding of results for 215,267 candidates due to malpractice during the 2024 Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (SSCE). This decision comes as WAEC begins releasing results for the 2024 WASSCE, which took place from April 30 to June 24.

According to WAEC Nigeria's head, Amoh Dangut, a total of 1,814,736 candidates from 25,126 secondary schools across Nigeria registered for the examination. He reported that 1,685,889 candidates (93.39%) have had all their papers processed and released; 119,327 candidates (6.61%) have some subjects still being processed and 215,267 candidates (11.92%) have their results withheld due to examination malpractice, 4.37% decrease from the 16.29% recorded in the 2023 WASSCE for school candidates.

WAEC's decision to withhold results aims to maintain the integrity of the examination process and ensure fairness for all candidates. Also in Premium Times, Monday, August 12, 2024; Punch, Monday, August 12, 2024.

CRIMINOLOGY

Criminology is the scientific study of crime, criminal behaviour, and the criminal justice system. It is an interdisciplinary field that draws on knowledge from sociology, psychology, law, anthropology and other disciplines to understand the nature, causes and consequences of criminal behaviour.

Criminology postulates biological, psychological and sociological theories that explain why individuals commit crimes. It also uses quantitative and qualitative research methods to study crime and criminal behaviour while helping to shape government policies on crime prevention, law enforcement and corrections.

Criminologists must adhere to ethical standards in their research and practice, ensuring confidentiality, informed consent and the respectful treatment of participants. They work closely with law enforcement and the judicial system of any country.

Graduates with a degree in criminology can pursue various career paths, including Law Enforcement, Correction Officers and Private Investigators, Victim Advocate, Legal Assistants, Social Workers and Academia.

In summary, criminology is a multifaceted discipline that seeks to understand crime from various perspectives and applies this knowledge to improve the effectiveness of the criminal justice system and enhance public safety.

Branches of criminology include criminal law, correction, victimology, cybercrime, forensic science, policing and law enforcement, etc.

UTME subjects required are Use of English, Mathematics, Government and Economics. Check www.ibass.jamb.gov.ng for a specific institution's requirement.

O' Level requirements are a credit pass in English Language, Mathematics, and any three art or

social science subjects. For special waivers from institutions, check the brochure on www.ibass.jamb.gov.ng.

Several universities in Nigeria offer criminology as a four-year course, including University of Ibadan; University of Lagos; University of Ilorin; Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka; University of Jos, Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria; Adekunle Ajasin University, Akungba. This directive would ensure that only eligible candidates are graduated as well as participate in the National

Youth Service Corps (NYSC) programme.

JAMB has introduced measures including the matriculation list to ensure transparency and accountability in the admission process, closing doors to illegal admissions.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.

CONDONMENT OF ILLEGAL ADMISSIONS BY JAMB

The Board has discovered widespread and unwholesome practices whereby some institutions were colluding with candidates to falsify vital records such as backdated year of entry and subsequent age adjustments to utilise certificates of genuine candidates with similar names and to facilitate condoning illegal admissions carried out before 2017 to enable participation of fake candidates in the National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) scheme.

2. Similarly, the Board has observed that some institutions continue to admit candidates outside CAPS after 2020 and subsequently apply for Condonment of Undisclosed Illegal Institutional Admissions (CUIIA) backdating such recent admissions to 2020 to fit within the timeframe of CUIIA. This is an abuse of the waiver granted by the former Minister of Education, on the recommendation of JAMB.

3. The Board has considered measures to close these abused windows while still reaffirming that CAPS is the only authorized platform for admissions. The following has been decided: -

- a. The Board will no longer entertain absorption of (pre-2017) illegal admissions through the window of "Condonment of Illegal Admissions without Registration Number". The Window (for mop-up of pre-2017 unofficial/unrecorded admissions) has been on now for 7 years and is being abused.
- b. The Board is terminating the aspect of the CUIIA process (2017-2020 illegal admissions) that allows completely unregistered (without registration) candidates to be introduced to the system.

4. Consequently, **institutions are hereby required to now (or never) disclose, through the CAPS mail:**

- i. All their candidates who were admitted illegally before 2017, whose records are on their system, within the next one (1) month beginning from 1st August 2024.
- ii. All their students who fall within the 2017-2020 window for the Condonment of Undisclosed Illegal Institutional Admissions (CUIIA) that had not been included in the earlier declaration as required via letter No. JAMB/R/225H/VOL.17 dated 6th December 2021. This is to be done within the next one (1) month beginning from 1st August 2024.

5. The dateline for all these disclosures will be 31st August 2024 after which no declaration will be entertained. Any admission purportedly given within these periods (pre-2017 and 2017-2020) will no longer be recognised or condoned unless disclosed within this one-month window. Only students on the declared list will be allowed to register with the Board. The window for all condonments will be closed at a date to be communicated soon.

6. This recent move is aimed at curbing illegal admissions and falsification of records. Any institution found to have admitted any candidate outside CAPS after 2020, will be made to face appropriate sanctions in addition to the forfeiture of the said admission with its legal implications.

7. Institutions are therefore advised to comply with this directive as there will not be any further condonement of hitherto unrecorded candidates who did not even register with JAMB not to talk of sitting for any examination.

MINISTERIAL DIRECTIVES ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE INTER-MINISTERIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON DEGREE CERTIFICATE MILLING: REQUEST FOR IMPLEMENTATION

You are aware that the Federal Government through an inter-ministerial committee had investigated the issues of certificate racketeering involving some foreign institutions around Nigeria. The investigations also looked at the issue of illegal admissions by institutions in Nigeria and the issuance of fake certificates by the institutions. The Hon. Minister of Education has now directed the implementation of the recommendations contained in the report of the investigation committee.

2. I therefore convey the directives of the Honourable Minister to the Board for implementation of the following recommendations (a copy of the letter from the Hon. Minister is attached):

- i. Enforce the mandatory requirement for all tertiary institutions in Nigeria to exclusively conduct their admissions processes through the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS) under the auspices of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
- ii. Mandate all tertiary institutions in Nigeria to regularly submit their matriculation lists to the Federal Ministry of Education not later than three months after matriculation ceremonies through the dedicated channel of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).

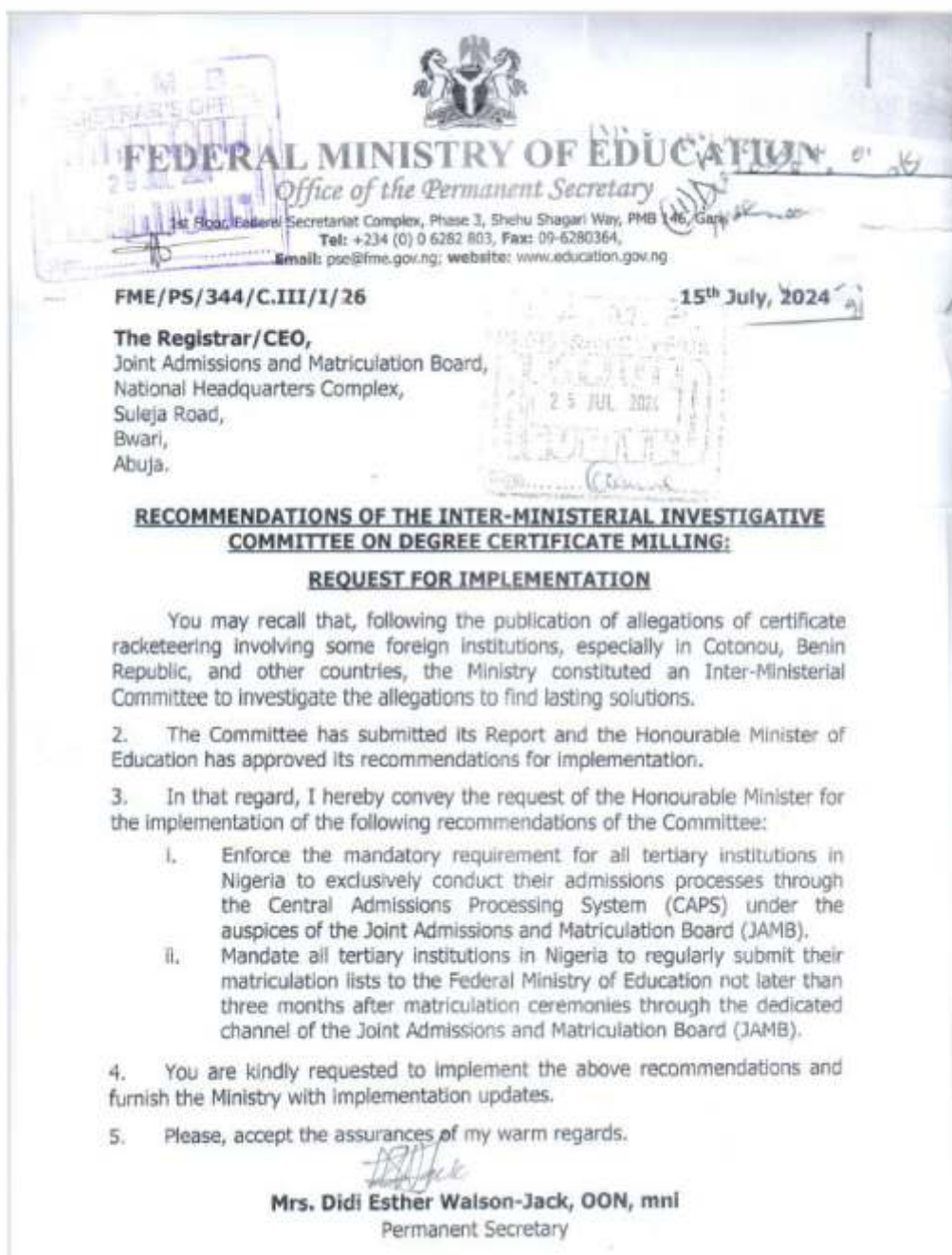
3. Consequently, the Board reiterates the Policy that under no condition shall any candidate be admitted outside CAPS. Furthermore, the recent circular No. JAMB/ADMS/DO/192/V.I dated 31st July 2024 by the Board, emphasizes that no illegal admission will henceforth be condoned and any institution found to have admitted any candidate outside CAPS will be made to face appropriate sanctions. This is in addition to the forfeiture of the said admission with its legal implications.
