They came in droves, from far and wide: Men and women. Old and young. The not-so-old and the not-so-young. Academics. Royalties. Clerics of both faiths. Legal luminaries. Diplomats. Politicians and political office holders. Proprietors of universities. Business leaders. Military and paramilitary brass hats. They all converged on Ilorin on Wednesday and Thursday last week to honour a true man of honour, Professor Is'haq Olanrewaju Oloyede, on his retirement from the services of the University of Ilorin, having attained the mandatory professorial retirement age of 70.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.

RE: CONDONMENT OF ILLEGAL ADMISSIONS BY JAMB

This is a reminder regarding Circular No. JAMB/ADMS/DO/192/V.I, dated July 31, 2024, which addressed the termination of the condonement process for illegal admissions without registration numbers. In that circular, the Board requested that institutions declare such candidates by August 31, 2024. This marked the first phase of the exercise, and a subsequent deadline for registration and completion of the condonement process will be announced.

2. The second phase of the exercise, which pertains to the condonement of illegal admissions for candidates with registration numbers has now commenced. The Board has the necessary details and records for these candidates from earlier registrations.

3. By this development, **institutions are hereby required to now (or never) disclose, through the CAPS mail:**

- i. All candidates who were admitted illegally before 2017, that have JAMB registration numbers and whose records are on their system, within the next one (1) month beginning from 1st of September 2024.
- ii. All candidates who fall within the 2017-2020 window for the Condonment of Undisclosed Illegal Institutional Admissions (CUIIA) that have JAMB registration numbers and had not been included in the earlier declaration made by the institution. This is to be done within the next one (1) month beginning from 1st of September 2024.

4. The dateline for all these disclosures will be 30th of September 2024 after which no declaration will be entertained.

5. The Board would like to emphasize that any admissions granted during the specified periods (pre-2017 and 2017-2020) will no longer be recognized or condoned unless disclosed within this one-month window. Only students listed in the declared submissions will be permitted to register with the Board. A deadline for the completion of all condonement processes will be established.

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6. These measures are implemented to address previously abused admission windows while reaffirming that CAPS remains the sole authorized platform for admissions. Institutions are strongly advised to adhere to these guidelines.
7. While urging you to accord this circular the attention it deserves, accept the best regards of the Board, please.

FRILLS OF FESTIVAL OF FERVORS FOR OLOYEDE AT 70 Tunde Akanni PhD

When Dr. Abdul Kareem Oloyede, son of the retiring Prof Is-haq Olanrewaju Oloyede walked up to the stage to thank everyone who had made it to the two-day ceremonies organized in honour of his dad, his speech almost turned out to be a character sketch of the honouree. "Daddy would give you an assignment... Once he begins to feel that you're not likely to be prompt with timing, the next thing is a call from him. That call is to inform you that he has done the same job." Dr Abdul Kareem however wished his retiring dad a good life and hoped he would make the best of it. "He is a most loving dad. One that would do his best to offer excellent support, advice and guidance. Always there..."

The strongest reinforcement to Prof Oloyede's character of relentlessness was the pleasantly surprising announcement by the Sultan of Sokoto, Alhaji Muhammadu Sa'adu Abubakar III. The Sultan had encountered a most daunting experience trying to make it to Ilorin. His flight was arbitrarily rescheduled even as the notice of rescheduling was rather short. Making it to Ilorin for Oloyede was a task that must not only be done but timeously too, he

had resolved.

According to the Sultan, he had watched with relish Oloyede's relationship with Prof Olaolu Ali, SAN, who, not a few will readily conclude is Oloyede's alter ego. Until this occasion however, Sultan confessed, he had never seen Ali wear a turban. It was Ali's style of announcing his new status as, Kuliya Ngeri of Ilorin. Never in want of wit, Ali had reiterated to the Oloyede festival audience packed full in the University of Ilorin's biggest auditorium that he would like to self-indulge by being the only one that could casually pronounce Oloyede's name without any of his earned titles. He went to emphasize loudly that he was also at the event representing the Emir of Ilorin, thus wearing, according to him, two mega caps. Ali's messages sank in well into the audience.

The Sultan's turn to talk was yet another twinning opportunity for Oloyede and Ali. He promised to attend the turbanning ceremony of Ali to the loud applause of the entire auditorium. He then went on to express his personal appreciation of Oloyede's integrity, industry and all, largely the live version of the words of commendation in the unusually long presidential tribute from President

Bola Ahmed Tinubu to Prof Oloyede. Beyond the tributes, the Sultan also prayed for Oloyede and stated how proud he had always been associating with Oloyede. To crown it all, His Eminence personally announced the title of Kuliya of Sokoto for Oloyede. Loud shouts of surprise and praise for both the Sultan and Oloyede suffused the hall immediately. Suddenly, two Kuliya in the same hall, both soulmates! Earlier in the year, like a bolt from the blues, Ali, most deservedly, had also been announced as a professor of practice to the profound delight of the mutual friends and admirers of both Oloyede and Ali for which many congregated at Ile-Ife for a grand reception.

The entire stretch of the two-day Oloyede Festival put together by all the universities in Kwara State otherwise referred to as KU8+ was as bounteously colourful as it was punctuated by poetic timing. The flier announcing the programme had stated that the second leg of the ceremony would feature the public presentation of the book written in honour of Prof Oloyede. Initially conceptualized as one volume comprising two parts, the project was so heavily oversubscribed that the organisers were compelled to

MINISTERIAL DIRECTIVES ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE INTER-MINISTERIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON DEGREE CERTIFICATE MILLING: REQUEST FOR IMPLEMENTATION

You are aware that the Federal Government through an inter-ministerial committee had investigated the issues of certificate racketeering involving some foreign institutions around Nigeria. The investigations also looked at the issue of illegal admissions by institutions in Nigeria and the issuance of fake certificates by the institutions. The Hon. Minister of Education has now directed the implementation of the recommendations contained in the report of the investigation committee.

2. I therefore convey the directives of the Honourable Minister to the Board for implementation of the following recommendations (a copy of the letter from the Hon. Minister is attached):

- i. Enforce the mandatory requirement for all tertiary institutions in Nigeria to exclusively conduct their admissions processes through the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS) under the auspices of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
- ii. Mandate all tertiary institutions in Nigeria to regularly submit their matriculation lists to the Federal Ministry of Education not later than three months after matriculation ceremonies through the dedicated channel of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).

3. Consequently, the Board reiterates the Policy that under no condition shall any candidate be admitted outside CAPS. Furthermore, the recent circular No. JAMB/ADMS/DO/192/V.I dated 31st July 2024 by the Board, emphasizes that no illegal admission will henceforth be condoned and any institution found to have admitted any candidate outside CAPS will be made to face appropriate sanctions. This is in addition to the forfeiture of the said admission with its legal implications.

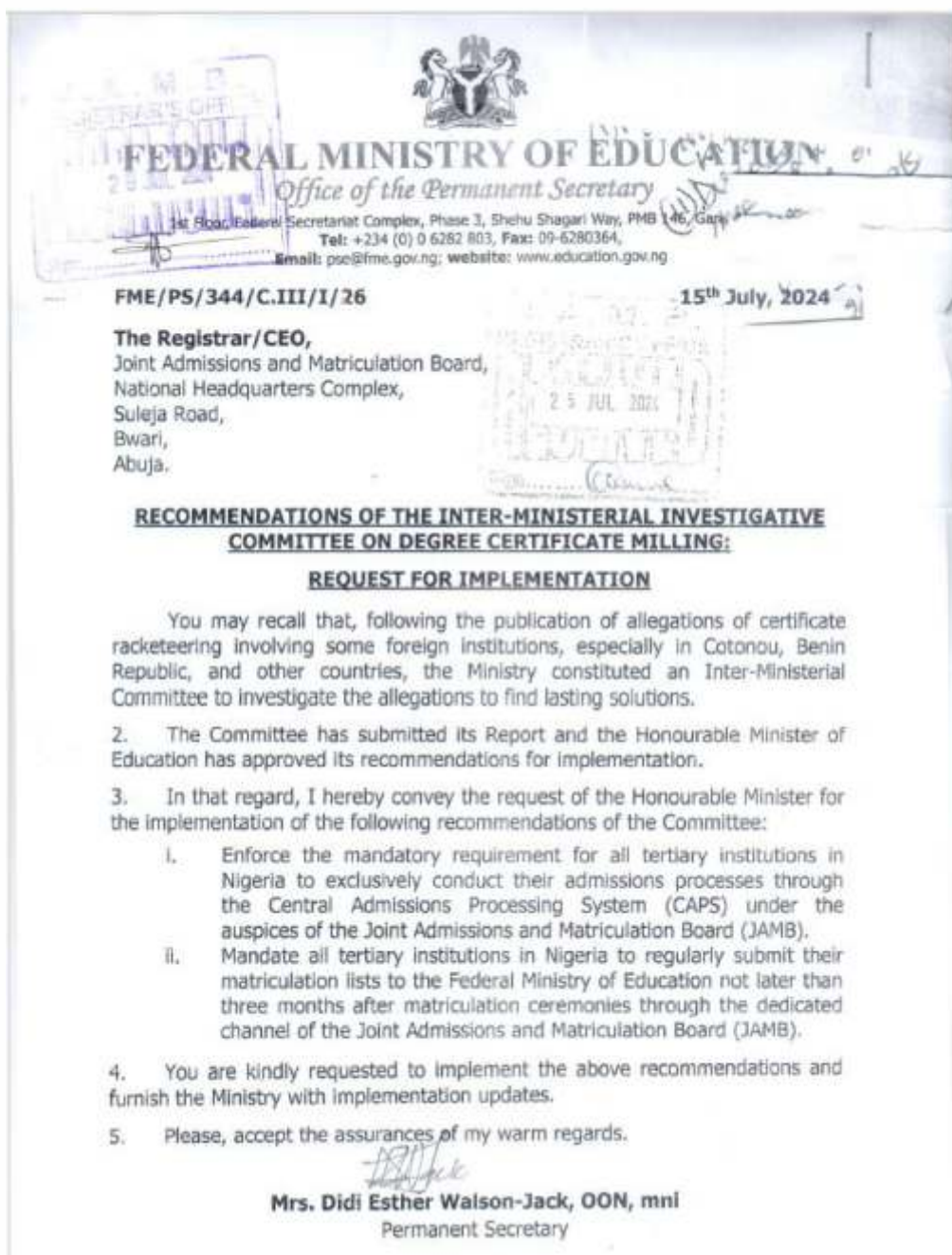
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4. Each Institution is expected to promptly respond to JAMB analysis of its matriculation list so that the list and the responses could be forwarded, as directed, to the Honourable Minister of Education.
5. To further discuss this matter, the Board is arranging a virtual meeting involving all the institutions and the officials of JAMB. The details will be communicated to you.

settle for two volumes, one containing tributes and the other containing scholarly works. The event was scheduled for the 10th hour on the 10th of October, the birthday anniversary of the man of the day.

Prof Olaolu Ali with all of his numerous capacities managed the public presentation of the two volumes. In addition to the vitality of the Naira rain, almost everyone expected to launch the book was either physically present or well represented.

The 10/10 event had a keynoter that came all the way from Ghana in person of Prof Olusola Bandele Oyewole, Secretary General of the Association of African Universities, AAU, Accra, Ghana. It was another colourful tribute Prof Oyewole presented. He recalled how Oloyede, serially sacrificed his own status for others to rise. He did not forget to announce in clear terms that he remained a great beneficiary of Oloyede's selflessness. Further to Prof Oyewole's claim on Oloyede, the Vice-Chancellor of African School of Economics, Prof Mahfouz Adedimeji posited that one leadership lesson derivable from the retiring don's career was the need to be like coffee in hot water. "If hot water is applied to potatoes, eggs and coffee they react differently...coffee dominates and changes the challenging environment and its rich aroma fills the place. We can all feel this aromatic coffee as Prof Oloyede has mastered the art and science of converting daunting challenges to opportunities",

Although a distinct volume was dedicated to tributes, event 10/10 induced almost as many tributes as may be published in another volume. Indeed the height of it all was the call for yet another publication. That call came from the governor of the home state of Prof Oloyede, Prince Dapo Abiodun, of Ogun State represented by Senator Salis Shuaib incidentally representing the senatorial constituency of Prof Oloyede. In a most outstanding appreciation of Oloyede's successful career and public conduct as an inimitable icon of integrity, Gov Abiodun, according to Senator Shuaib had requested that Oloyede should please commence the writing of his memoir for the upcoming generations to inspire them to greatness. So much really, to learn from Oloyede.

The previous day, he had given a special lecture, another in the series of University Lecture. Oloyede's scholarly adventure and administrative acumen have always been such that revealed rare versatility often reflective of borderlessness of knowledge. The professor of Islamic Studies spoke on Artificial Intelligence and the Future of Humanities. He was as magisterial as he was demonstrative and even didactic. He betrayed a most serious concern for the moral degeneracy of his fellow scholars of Islamic studies waxing lyrical to register his message: "Eni kewu akelo, l'oni kewu, eni kewu akelo, l'oni kewu..."

He alerted the entire audience to the danger of over reliance on AI which may often vomit garbage fed it

either ignorantly or mischievously. According to Oloyede, the quality of the response you get from AI will always be dependent on the quality of your pre-existing knowledge on the subject of your enquiry.

According to Oloyede, AI is trans-disciplinary, indeed as applicable as to the sciences as it is to the humanities. In his usual didactic manner, the JAMB Registrar listed up sets of recommendations for users of AI as well as for those who may be mandated to formulate policy on AI given that the novel and burgeoning technology has come to stay. Oloyede concluded his presentation on the dot of 12:12 pm! How much more poetic can timing be?

In what seemed a full affirmation of "charity begins at home" foremost Ogun State politician with local and international rating who is Nigeria's immediate past High Commissioner to the United Kingdom, Alhaji Sarafa Tunji Ishola sat in for the entire duration of the lecture. He later announced that in addition to his own personal presence, he was standing in for the Alake of Egbaland, the traditional ruler of Oloyede's roots in Abeokuta.

The Oloyede Festival was nothing short of a 10/10 bouquet of congratulations for the one presidentially declared "an uncommon scholar..."

ADMISSION OF CANDIDATES WITH MINIMUM ADMISSIBLE AGE OF 16 YEARS

Recall that the issue of the minimum age for admission in the nation's tertiary institutions was deliberated and decided at the 2024 Policy Meeting to be 16 years old for the 2024/25 academic session. Subsequently, the cut-off date was put on the 31st of December 2024.

2. The Board has taken cognizance that, due to different reasons, some institutions expect the 2024/2025 admission to run through July 2025. Without compromising the standard or infringing on the individual institution's admission policy, the Board has now decided to allow any willing institution to admit candidates who will be 16 years old by the 31st of August 2025, so long as the standards set by the institution qualify such candidate but couldn't be admitted only because of age.

3. This is without prejudice to the decision of any institution that might have on its own, decided on the minimum age of not less than 16 years which remains sacrosanct.

4. By this development, you are requested to harvest from your CAPS and send the list of candidates who would be 16 years of age between 1st of January and 31st of August 2025 who are eligible for admission (if any), not later than a week from the date on this letter to enable final decision.

NOTE:

- i. This effort is to ensure equity because those whose 2024 admission would last till August 2025 would not be unduly favoured.
 - ii. Any institution that insists on its 16 years being within the year 2024 is completely free to do so.

The Coordinator further advised that it was only proper, that all candidates apply through JAMB. She also reiterated that the institution's Matriculation List must be promptly uploaded while the Notification/Invitation to Matriculation Ceremony, must be received by the State Office, at least two weeks to the date of the ceremony.

Furthermore, Olima-William stressed that all official emailing and communications should be channeled through the CAPS Platform.

Other institutions visited were: Maurid Institute of Management; Akwa Ibom State College of Education, Afaha Nsit; and Sure Foundation Polytechnic, Ukanafun.

In their various responses, the Institutions lauded the Registrar, JAMB, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, for his

innovations, which has ensured that candidates' admissions are conducted seamlessly through CAPS. They, however, complained that their major challenge was poor enrolment of candidates. On this, the Coordinator advised them to take advantage of the MarketPlace on the CAPS platform to source candidates locally, and from other bigger institutions within the State.

🌐 The duration of all Non-Full Time Studies must be maintained as approved by the Regulatory Agencies. This is generally not less than one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the equivalence of Full Time.

🌐 Institutions that desire to place advertisement can do so with the requirement that candidates who sat for the current **UTME** (or **DE** candidates) should change to their institutions as First (1st) Choice rather than requesting the candidates to purchase another application form or apply. 🌐 It should be reiterated that no Institution should advertise or sell “application forms” for admissions into the programmes listed above.
