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

PWDs: PRESIDENCY PROPOSES FIVE RECOMMENDATIONS TO JOEG

he Senior Special Assistant (SSA) to the President on Special Needs and Equal Opportunities, Hon. Mohammed Abba Isa, has made five recommendations to the JAMB-Equal Opportunity Group(JEOG).

The SSA, who was represented by the Director of Media and Communications, Mr. Lanre Oloyede, disclosed this at the first African Regional Conference on Equal Opportunity of Access to Higher Education in Abuja.

He stated that the recommendations were to ensure that equal access to education is not just a vision but a reality for every Nigerian, including persons with disabilities.

Hon. Isa said strengthening the process of data collection and analysis to ascertain the level participation of PWDs

in education was essential for effective policy-making. He, therefore, enjoined JEOG to collaborate with the NCPWD and academic institutions to develop a robust system for tracking educational outcomes for PWDs with a view to ensuring that interventions are data-driven and targeted.

Other recommendations by the SSA included the expansion of partnerships with the private sector in providing scholarships, internships, and employment opportunities for PWDs.

He also charged JEOG to synergise with the Federal Ministry of Education to Promote inclusive curriculum and teacher training, noting that it is crucial that educators are trained to teach inclusively.

Furthermore, the SSA advocate enhanced accessibility in examinations and learning materials with a view to leveraging on new technologies that can further ease the examination process for students with disabilities such as online proctoring tools and adaptive learning platforms.

The need to develop regional alliances and networking for inclusive education was also canvassed. In this wise, JEOG was mandated to take the lead in creating a regional network focused on sharing of best practices, funding opportunities, and research that promotes inclusive education for PWDs.

He assured the participants of President Tinubu's administration unwavering commitment to PWDs stressing that education remains the bedrock upon which inclusive societies are built.

He further pointed out that the theme for the conference "Advancing the Potential of Persons with Disabilities in Educational and Economic Development" echoes a cause deeply rooted in justice, fairness, and humanity.

NATION, MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2024: JAMB slashes UTME Fees for PWDs: - The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has reduced the registration fee for the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) from N5,000 to N3,500 for the visually impaired and other candidates with disabilities. The Board said this was done to ensure equitable access to tertiary education for the PWDs.

Registrar of JAMB, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, disclosed this during a press conference on Monday ahead of JAMB's Equal Opportunity Group (JEOG) First Africa Regional Conference on Equal Opportunity of Access to Higher Education (ARCEAHED) on Tuesday, and Wednesday in Abuja.

Prof. Oloyede said the Board will also provide free accommodation and transportation for the visually impaired and other candidates with disabilities who require special examination settings during the examination process.

PUNCH, MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2024: National Library Issued Over 26,000 ISBNS In Nine Months — Chief Librarian: — The National Librarian and Chief Executive Officer of the National Library, Prof. Chinwe Anunobi, stated that the library has issued over 26,000 International Standard Book Numbers to publishers across the country so far in 2024.

She also disclosed that Nigerians, particularly researchers, no longer need to visit the headquarters to obtain ISBNs, International Standard Serial Numbers, newspaper publication indices, or other services, as these can now be accessed via the

National Library of Nigeria's website and social media platforms.

Prof. Anunobi noted that the library has branches in 33 states of the federation, including the Federal Capital Territory, while Kebbi, Zamfara, Delta, and Anambra States are still in the process of providing land for the establishment of library offices.

She stated, "The National Library of Nigeria can be counted among the agencies contributing positively to the nation. We are fostering unity as a family, building the capacity of our staff..."

THE WHISTLER, MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2024: Adopt Sign Language As Second Language, JAMB Registrar Urges FG: – The Registrar of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Ish-aq Oloyede has urged the Federal Government to adopt the Nigerian Sign Language (NSL) as the second national official language.

Prof. Oloyede who was speaking at the first Africa Regional Conference on Equal Opportunity Of Access to Higher Education (ARCEAHED) held in Abuja on Tuesday, stated that adopting the language would be a major demonstration of empathy for the large number of Nigerians with hearing impairments.

He also called on the government to establish and attach to the National Commission for Persons with Disabilities, a centre for supportive services for persons with disabilities with at least one branch in each geopolitical zone of the federation.

"The centre, with the assistance of bodies such as JAMB Equal Opportunity Group, would be able to attract appropriate technology and policies to make life and study easy for people with special needs. Centres, such as the FGN Supportive Services for the Deaf, located at the University of llorin and similar centres established by the Federal Ministry of Education should be reactivated and funded to achieve the lofty goals for which they were established," he said.

THE WHISTLER, MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2024: Inclusive Education: JAMB Sets Stage For African Conference On PWDs: - The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) is set to host its inaugural JAMB Equal Opportunity Group African conference to improve access to higher education for Persons with Disabilities (PWD).

The conference, themed "Advancing the Potentials of Persons with Disabilities (PWD) in Educational and Economic Development", took place on 17-18 Sept. 2024 at the National Universities Commission (NUC).

Briefing journalists at a World Press conference on Monday, JAMB Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, stated that the conference aimed to enhance the learning environment for PWDs in tertiary institutions and would attract participants from Ethiopia, Malawi, Egypt, and other African countries.

"Today, as we prepare for this vital conference, we reaffirm our commitment to advancing equal opportunity access to higher education for all, with particular emphasis on Persons with Disabilities (PWD).

"JAMB, through JEOG, has been at the forefront of ensuring that persons with disabilities are provided with a

level playing field in accessing higher education.

"It is not enough to simply open doors of opportunity; we must ensure that these doors are accessible to everyone, regardless of their physical, sensory, or cognitive abilities," he said.

PUNCH, TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 17, 2024: FG To Split Unity Colleges Into Basic, Secondary Schools: - The Federal Government has announced that the 115 Federal Unity Colleges in the country will soon be unbundled into basic and secondary schools.

The Minister of State for Education, Dr. Yusuf Sununu, made this known during the opening of the Annual General Meeting of Principals of Unity Colleges in Abuja on Tuesday.

The event is themed: "Entrepreneurship Education: A Panacea for Self-Reliance and National Development."

Dr. Sununu stated that the plan to unbundle the Unity Colleges aligns with the National Policy on Education. The Minister explained that the unbundling of Federal Unity Colleges would, among other things, attract more funding to improve infrastructure, address teachers' welfare, and create employment opportunities. He added that the Ministry, with support from relevant government agencies, would ensure this is achieved in the shortest possible time.

THE WHISTLER, TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 17, 2024: Extortion: JAMB to Limit Physical Interaction with Candidates:

- The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), has stated that it has concluded arrangements to fully automate its services to reduce physical contact with Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) candidates to prevent extortion and enhance service delivery.

The arrangement, the Board stated would limit candidates to online interaction only.

The Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, disclosed this during his interaction with the leadership of the National Association of Polytechnics Students (NAPS) in Abuja recently.

According to him, the new arrangement is due to the series of reports bordering on extortion and other unwholesome practices between candidates and some service personnel. The Registrar who lamented that many of the candidates who take the UTME are underage, stated that limiting physical contact will minimise the issue of extortion and other forms of exploitation.

He urged students who had accused some JAMB officials and other operatives such as CBT centres of extortion in the name of 'regularization' or other services to provide credible evidence, adding that any staff found culpable would face the full wrath of the law.

THE WHISTLER, TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 17, 2024: Offer Admission Without Post- UTME To PWDs, FG Orders Tertiary Institutions: - The Federal Government has ordered tertiary institutions in Nigeria to admit candidates with disabilities who meet the minimum required scores in the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) into their chosen programs, waiving the usual Post-UTME requirement.

The Minister of State for Education, Dr. Yusuf Sununu made this declaration at the First Africa Regional Conference on Equal Opportunity of Access to Higher Education (ARCEAHED) organised by the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) on Tuesday in Abuja.

The National Examination Council (NECO) has announced that it will be inviting and interrogating the management of 40 secondary schools across 17 states for alleged mass cheating in this year's Senior School Certificate Examination (SSCE).

NECO Registrar Prof. Dantani Wushishi disclosed this at a press conference in Minna, Niger State capital, where he announced the release of the 2024 SSCE results.

Prof. Wushishi announced that 8,437 candidates were found to be involved in various forms of malpractice, compared to 12,030 in 2023, showing a reduction of 30.1 per cent.

He said all the schools involved in cheating would be invited to the council for discussion, after which appropriate sanctions would be applied.

"Similarly, 21 supervisors were recommended for blacklisting due to poor supervision, aiding and abetting, abscondment, extortion, drunkenness, and negligence in 12 states," he said. Also in Tribune, Thursday, September 19, 2024.

He, however, advised the public to be cautious of such misleading publications, which are likely the work of fraudulent individuals targeting unsuspecting members of the public.

And the University of Lagos was one of the first to offer courses related to forensic science within its criminology and criminal justice programmes. A career path in forensic science can be realised through being a forensic scientist/technician, crime scene investigator, forensic pathologist, forensic anthropologist, forensic chemist or digital forensic analyst. They can work in the judicial and criminal sector of an organisation or country.

Forensic science, as an academic discipline, is relatively new in Nigeria,

but it has been growing steadily in response to the increasing need for forensic expertise in the criminal justice system. For many years, forensic science in Nigeria was primarily handled by law enforcement agencies without formal academic programmes dedicated to the field. Most forensic work was done by police laboratories and a few specialised units within the criminal justice system.

In recent years, several universities have established dedicated forensic science programmes or included forensic science as a specialisation within broader science or criminal justice programmes. Notable institutions include Nnamdi Azikiwe University, which offers a postgraduate programme in forensic science, and the University of Ibadan, which has developed forensic science courses within its medical and natural sciences faculties.UTME subjects required are Use of English, Chemistry, Biology and Physics or Mathematics. O' Level requirements are a credit pass in English Language, Mathematics, Chemistry, Biology and Physics. For special waivers from

Forensic science in Nigeria is an evolving discipline with significant potential to contribute to the country's criminal justice system. It is a four-year degree programme that can be studied under the Faculty of Sciences in the following Nigerian Universities: First Technical University (TECH-U) Ibadan, Federal University of Technology, Owerri (FUTO), Bayero University, Kano (BUK) and the Nigerian Police Academy, Wudil, Kano State (NPA), among others. Check www.ibass.jamb.gov.ng for a comprehensive list of accredited institutions offering the course.

In Nigeria, professional bodies regulating the practice of forensic science include: the Chartered Institute of Forensics and Certified Fraud Investigators of Nigeria (CIFCFIN) and The Society for Forensic and Analytical Scientists Nigeria (SFASN). Prof. John Obafunwa, Benedict Agbo Ph.D, Mrs. Avril Eyewu-Edero, Dr. Uwom Eze and Mrs. Jane-Muse Adebukola Orire are notable Nigerian Forensic Scientists.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular.**

- 2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
- 3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
- 4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
- 5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
- 6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
- 7. Please be guided for compliance.

RE: CONDONMENT OF ILLEGAL ADMISSIONS BY JAMB

This is a reminder regarding Circular No. JAMB/ADMS/DO/192/V.I, dated July 31, 2024, which addressed the termination of the condonement process for illegal admissions without registration numbers. In that circular, the Board requested that institutions declare such candidates by August 31, 2024. This marked the first phase of the exercise, and a subsequent deadline for registration and completion of the condonement process will be announced.

- 2. The second phase of the exercise, which pertains to the condonement of illegal admissions for candidates with registration numbers has now commenced. The Board has the necessary details and records for these candidates from earlier registrations.
- 3. By this development, institutions are hereby required to now (or never) disclose, through the CAPS mail:
 - i. All candidates who were admitted illegally before 2017, that have JAMB registration numbers and whose records are on their system, within the next one (1) month beginning from 1st of September 2024.
 - ii. All candidates who fall within the 2017-2020 window for the Condonment of Undisclosed Illegal Institutional Admissions (CUIIA) that have JAMB registration numbers and had not been included in the earlier declaration made by the institution. This is to be done within the next one (1) month beginning from 1st of September 2024.
- 4. The dateline for all these disclosures will be 30th of September 2024 after which no declaration will be entertained.
- 5. The Board would like to emphasize that any admissions granted during the specified periods (pre-2017 and 2017-2020) will no longer be recognized or condoned unless disclosed within this one-month window. Only students listed in the declared submissions will be permitted to register with the Board. A deadline for the completion of all condonement processes will be established.

- 6. These measures are implemented to address previously abused admission windows while reaffirming that CAPS remains the sole authorized platform for admissions. Institutions are strongly advised to adhere to these guidelines.
- 7. While urging you to accord this circular the attention it deserves, accept the best regards of the Board, please.

Already some of the delegates especially those from Egypt, Ethiopia, Uganda and Ghana, have indicated interest to understudy the process of the Board's electronic examination.

Speaking during a tour of the JAMB facilities at the Board's National Headquarters in Bwari and Kogo, Abuja, on Thursday, 19th September, 2024, the Chief Executive Officer, Malawi's National Council for Higher Education, Dr. Ambulmulire Phiri; Shasho Jebena, the Head of Department, Special Needs & Inclusive Education, Hiromoyo University, Ethiopia, and Department Manager, Department of Special Education, Ministry of Education, Egypt, Ms. Hanan Mohsen Aly, expressed their

admiration for the impressive array of CBT facilities and the Board's administrative prowess at managing about two million candidates taking its matriculation examination annually.

Furthermore, Dr. Phiri conveyed the readiness of her country, Malawi, to join other countries, which have indicated interest to understudy the Board's processes as well as learn new things from Nigeria. She, however, disclosed that her country's total candidates population is about 19,000 compared to the hundreds of thousands assessed by the Board in its UTME every year.

On the deployment of CCTV cameras at each CBT centre, the delegation marvelled at the complexity of monitoring each centre through a central portal.

With regard to the deployment of

test items, the delegation was informed that the Technical Officer brings an examination delivery server to his centre to conduct the examination with each candidate login to unlock his test while a countdown commences to determine the duration of the examination.

Earlier, the Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, on behalf of the Management of the Board, welcomed the foreign dignitaries to the Board. He disclosed that the Board conducts matriculation examination (UTME) for about two million candidates annually. The candidates comprised both Nigerians and some foreign candidates from eight foreign countries.

In his presentation, the IT Consultant, Mr. Damilola Bamiro, informed the dignitaries that the Board is constitutionallyempowered to conduct matriculation examination to all tertiary institutions in the country. He also painstakingly explained the various stages of the Board's examination, administration, result processing and release, added that the admission process has been fully automated through the facility of the Central Admission Processing System (CAPS), among other details.


MINISTERIAL DIRECTIVES ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE INTER-MINISTERIAL INVESTIGATIVE COMMITTEE ON DEGREE CERTIFICATE MILLING: REQUEST FOR IMPLEMENTATION

You are aware that the Federal Government through an inter-ministerial committee had investigated the issues of certificate racketeering involving some foreign institutions around Nigeria. The investigations also looked at the issue of illegal admissions by institutions in Nigeria and the issuance of fake certificates by the institutions. The Hon. Minister of Education has now directed the implementation of the recommendations contained in the report of the investigation committee.

- 2. I therefore convey the directives of the Honourable Minister to the Board for implementation of the following recommendations (a copy of the letter from the Hon. Minister is attached):
 - i. Enforce the mandatory requirement for all tertiary institutions in Nigeria to exclusively conduct their admissions processes through the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS) under the auspices of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
 - ii. Mandate all tertiary institutions in Nigeria to regularly submit their matriculation lists to the Federal Ministry of Education not later than three months after matriculation ceremonies through the dedicated channel of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
- 3. Consequently, the Board reiterates the Policy that under no condition shall any candidate be admitted outside CAPS. Furthermore, the recent circular No. JAMB/ADMS/DO/192/V.I dated 31st July 2024 by the Board, emphasizes that no illegal admission will henceforth be condoned and any institution found to have admitted any candidate outside CAPS will be made to face appropriate sanctions. This is in addition to the forfeiture of the said admission with its legal implications.

- 4. Each Institution is expected to promptly respond to JAMB analysis of its matriculation list so that the list and the responses could be forwarded, as directed, to the Honourable Minister of Education.
- 5. To further discuss this matter, the Board is arranging a virtual meeting involving all the institutions and the officials of JAMB. The details will be communicated to you.

...FG Reaffirms Commitment to PWDs, Directs Tertiary Institutions to Prioritise Their Admissions

Tuesday, 17th September, 2024, in Abuja.

In his remarks, the Minister directed tertiary institutions in Nigeria to admit candidates with disabilities, who meet the minimum-admissible scores in the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) for admission into their chosen programmes, by waiving their Post-UTME tests, among others.

Dr. Sununu also restated the commitment of President Bola Ahmed Tinubu to promote inclusivity in the education sector, pointing out that the waiver of application fees for the UTME candidates with disabilities during the registration process was meant to make things easier for them as well as to mainstream them into the larger society as outlined in the Nigerian Education Sector Roadmap launched in 2023.

Furthermore, he said the various

reforms have started yielding fruits with the target of enrolling at least a significant number of this category of students cumulatively over the next five years as a demonstration of the government's unwavering commitment to facilitating equal access to quality education.

The Minister said, "The conference marks a major milestone in our quest to make the learning environment truly inclusive, especially for persons with disabilities.

"Indeed, it is heart-warming to note that the theme of this conference, "Advancing the Potential of Persons with Disabilities (PWD) in Educational and Economic Development" is quite appropriate, as it speaks directly to the heart of our shared mission: ensuring that every individual, regardless of their physical or cognitive abilities, is given the

opportunity to thrive, contribute, and lead in their communities and beyond.

"Governments across Africa must play important roles in shaping policies that support inclusiveness at all levels. The enactment and implementation of laws to protect the rights of persons with disabilities ensuring they have equal access to education, health, and employment facilities is very essential."

The Minister commended the Registrar of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, for positively projecting the achievements of the present administration with his emphasis on pro-activeness, transparency, accountability and unalloyed commitment to the advancement of this country through the instrumentality of education.

tool of communication and interaction with People with Disabilities (PWDs). Whether deaf, hard of hearing, struggling with Language, or inability to communicate perfectly well, sign language has the capacity to also enhance open communication among all groups of people.

This resolution, which was adopted by ARCHEAD, is part of measures to mitigate any perceived hindrance towards boosting access to quality education and equal opportunity for PWDS.

The conference also called for waivers to be granted for the importation of assistive technologies and learning resources for PWDs.

Other recommendations made at the end of the 2-day brainstorming conference, included a call for the re-orientation of the education sector and adoption of inclusive education as a civil responsibility for all, while relevant policies should be reviewed and geared towards the enforcement of extant laws that will lead to the advancement of PWDs towards the rapid educational and economic transformation of the country.

The conference implored governmental and non-governmental agencies to stop all forms of discriminations against PWDs and their exclusion from participating in socio-cultural and educational activities.

The stakeholders also canvassed for a databank to be established to incentivise the formulation of robust policies that could make life better for PWDs.

The conference mandated examination bodies to do everything they could to facilitate inclusive education in their test administration while calling for special consideration to be given by government at all levels in the formulation and implementation of policies on scholarships, grants to PWDs especially with respect to the conversion of their loans to grants in the nation's institutions of higher learning. By extension, institutions of

higher learning are enjoined to provide requisite facilities and infrastructure for the teaching and learning of PWDs.

The conference also urged governments across Africa to establish special institutions of Higher Learning (Universities, Polytechnics and Colleges of Education) for capacity building for PWDs such as the Federal College of Education (Special) Oyo, Nigeria. Aside this, governments across Africa are enjoined to invest not only in the procurement of assistive technologies for PWDs but are also urged to foster a culture of unity, collaboration, and equitable distribution of resources among all sectors of the population.

To realise the goals stated above, the conference resolved that a committee would be set up to develop a Model Action Plan for Africa that would advance the potential of persons with disabilities in the educational and economic spheres.

Additionally, he also commended Professor Emeritus Peter Okebukola, Chairman, JAMB Equal Opportunity Group (JEOG), along with the entire members of the group for their excellent coordination and successful hosting of this conference.

"Your commendable strides in ensuring that no Nigerian is left behind in accessing higher education on account of disability has not only demonstrated compassion but also showcased a deep commitment to inclusivity and equal opportunity, values that must resonate throughout our educational system across Africa."

The Minister also charged the conference to look beyond accessibility of people with disabilities to tertiary education but should facilitate the enabling environment for study especially in terms of provision of ramps, elevators, assistive technologies, and other accommodations that would make learning possible and comfortable for them. Besides that, he canvassed that teaching aids such as braille, interpreters in sign language, and digital materials prepared for various skills, should be provided.

"People with disabilities must also have access to economic

opportunities in terms of requisite skills and qualifications. For this reason, we have to create the necessary linkages among tertiary institutions, industries, and governments so as to develop ways and means of taking persons with disabilities from education to employment.

"The inclusion of persons with disabilities in decision-making positions both in government and at all levels of society is non-negotiable as they are supposed to represent their experiences and unique challenges, which cannot be presented satisfactorily by others

CESSATION OF ILLEGAL/IRREGULAR ADMISSIONS

- All applications of admissions to First Degree, National Diploma, National Innovation Diploma and the Nigeria Certificate in Education into Full-Time, Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich, etc., must be processed ONLY through the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
- No Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes. Institutions should advise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
- Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and the three (3) Regulatory Agencies (National Universities Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) and National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE) will ensure that all Tertiary Institutions comply with this policy directive. Other Professional Regulatory Agencies will also play a role in sanitizing the process.
- The duration of all Non-Full Time Studies must be maintained as approved by the Regulatory Agencies. This is generally not less than one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the equivalence of Full Time.

<u>ADVERTORIALS</u>

- Institutions that desire to place advertisement can do so with the requirement that candidates who sat for the current **UTME** (or **DE** candidates) should change to their institutions as First (1st) Choice rather than requesting the candidates to purchase another application form or apply. This is to prevent the issue of double registration which is a violation of the mandate of JAMB.
- It should be reiterated that no Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes listed above. Institutions should advise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
