

In his thought-provoking presentation, Professor Oloyede drew inspiration from the Chinese concept of "Yin and Yang," symbolizing the interplay of darkness and light. He articulated that this philosophy serves as a guiding principle for understanding the relationship between pain and pleasure, hardship and reward, and joy and sorrow—elements that are inextricably linked on the path to personal growth.

He also referenced the Japanese philosophy of "Ikigai," which translates to "a reason for being." This philosophy merges passion, purpose, and practicality, encouraging individuals to assess their strengths and weaknesses. "Ikigai provides a roadmap to find balance and joy in everyday life," he noted, urging new graduates and alumnitoembrace its core tenets.

Professor Oloyede highlighted

exemplary alumni of the University of Ibadan, including Professor Grace Alele-Williams, Professor Wole Soyinka, and Professor Jubril Aminu, celebrating their resilience and groundbreaking achievements in the face of daunting challenges. He encouraged the youth to emulate these distinguished individuals who have carved out their own paths to success.

He stated, "Facing one challenge or another is part of perseverance, transforming struggles into stepping stones."

In his lecture, he explored the interplay of growth, likening it to the emergence of light from darkness. He wove together the wisdom of the Yin-Yang and Ikigai philosophies, crafting a narrative of balance, purpose, and resilience.

Earlier, in his welcome address, Mr. J.I. Kagho, Chairman of the UIAA Asaba Chapter, explained that this year's lecture honoured Sir Okey Ofili for his remarkable contributions to the growth and development of the Asaba Chapter and his exemplary

BLUEPRINT, SUNDAY, JULY 27, 2025: FG Clarifies 'New Age' Requirement for JSS1 Admission': The Federal Ministry of Education has clarified circulating reports suggesting that the minimum age for admission into Junior Secondary School 1 (JSS1) has been raised to 12 years.

In an official statement issued by the Ministry's Director of Press, Mrs. Folasade Boriowo, described the reports as "entirely inaccurate" and lacking any basis in government policy.

"For the avoidance of doubt, the minimum age for admission into JSS1 remains 10 years," Boriowo clarified. "Accordingly, no child should complete primary education below the age of 10." She urged the public, education stakeholders, and media outlets to disregard any contrary claims and to rely only on verified information from official government channels...

LEADERSHIP, TUESDAY, JULY 29, 2025: Federal Gov't Increases Scholarship Grants by 50%: The Federal Government has increased Nigeria's national scholarship grants by 50% across all academic levels. The increase is aimed at deepening access to quality education and strengthening human capital development.

Minister of Education, Dr. Maruf Olatunji Alausa, announced this via his official Twitter handle recently. Dr. Alausa described the reform as the most ambitious overhaul of the scholarship programme in over a decade...

The statement read, "To tackle the rising costs of education and to ensure that no deserving student is left behind, scholarship amounts have been increased by 50% across board. PhD students will now receive N750, 000 annually (up from N500, 000), Master's students N600, 000 (from N400, 000), and undergraduate, HND, and NCE students N450, 000 (up from N300, 000)." These enhanced awards apply to all major programmes, including the Nigerian Scholarship Award.

The amnesty, which covers offences committed between the 2020/2021 academic year and the first semester of the 2024/2025 session, was approved during the Senate's 189th Regular Meeting held on Wednesday, May 28, 2025...

According to a statement signed by Dr. Habib Yakoob, Acting Director of Information and University Relations, "The students who benefitted from this amnesty cut across all faculties and levels. The decision was a result of careful consideration and aimed at ensuring fairness in academic justice," Dr. Yakoob stressed that the university remains committed to upholding disciplinary standards, and that cases of misconduct will continue to be treated with seriousness.

NAIRAMETRICS, WEDNESDAY, JULY 30, 2025: FG Begins Review of UBEC Fund Guidelines, Links Disbursement to State Performance: The Federal Government has commenced a review of the guidelines governing state access to Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) intervention funds, with future disbursements to be tied to performance targets.

Minister of State for Education, Dr. Suwaiba Sa'id Ahmad, announced this on Wednesday during a government-citizen engagement session organised by the Sir Ahmadu Bello Foundation at Arewa House, Kaduna.

The announcement was also contained in a statement issued by Rabiu Ibrahim, Special Assistant (Media) to the Minister of Information and National Orientation.

"The Minister of State Education, Dr. Suwaiba Sa'id Ahmad, has announced that the guidelines for accessing intervention funds from the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) are currently being reviewed to make them more flexible for state governments. This decision followed a meeting in Abuja on Wednesday with the Chairman and Chief Executive of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency, Brig. Gen. Buba Marwa (retd), where both parties discussed measures to curb substance abuse among students...

BLUEPRINT, WEDNESDAY, JULY 30, 2025: College Rector Bags 7 Years for Running Fake Degree Courses: The Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission (ICPC) has secured the conviction of the Founder/Rector of International College of Administration Science and Technology, Auta Balefi, Nasarawa state, Mr. Olaniran Satiregun, for running fake and unapproved courses in his college in Nasarawa state.

According to a statement by ICPC Director, Public Enlightenment and Education, Mr. Demola Bakare, Mr. Satiregun was first arraigned alongside the institution in 2024 on a three-count charge bordering on obtaining by false pretence, contrary to Section 1 of the Advance Fee Fraud and Other Related Offences Act.

He said the Commission's Prosecutors, led by Mr. Adesina Raheem, in the course of the trial detailed how the two defendants deceived unsuspecting applicants by offering admissions to study courses that were not accredited by the regulatory body.

The spokesperson said investigations revealed that the institution only got approval from the National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) to run four courses.

He noted that it was, however, discovered that the institution between the years 2019 and 2021 offered admissions to some applicants into the College to study courses like Nursing, Public Health, and Computer Science.

The spokesperson said the Judge also sentenced the 2nd defendant, Mr. Satiregun, to 7 years imprisonment without the option of a fine. "The Judge further directed that all fees collected from the unsuspecting students who were offered illegal courses in the college be refunded to them and that the institution should limit itself to just four courses approved by the approving authority," he added. MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular.**

- 2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
- 3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
- 4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
- 5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
- 6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
- 7. Please be guided for compliance.
