JAMB UNCOVERS 585 FAKE A/L CERTIFICATES IN ONE YEAR



The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has uncovered at least 585 A/Level forged certificates in 2025 alone.

This startling revelation was made by the Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, during a virtual meeting with staff of the Board held on 2nd April, 2025, in preparation for the 2025 Mock-UTME and UTME.

He condemned this worrisome prevalence of fake A/L certificates stating that it was to curb the menace that the Nigeria Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System (NIPED) was established, a platform for managing and collecting data related to post-secondary education in

Nigeria.

He noted that more worrisome and heart-rending was the upload of 13 out of these forged IJMB certificates by the Professional Registration Centres (PRCs) which are being investigated.

He stated that out of the 13 cases being investigated by the police, four culprits have been apprehended and

are currently assisting the police and relevant authorities towards apprehending the ringleaders of these examination cartels. He, however, added that investigation revealed that there were internal collaborators in the institutions aiding and abetting this gross misconduct.

The Registrar also disclosed that there were reports from some CBT

centres on extortion of candidates for services expected to be free adding that this mind-boggling revelations were not too good for the system.

He, therefore, enjoined staff to be committed to their duties and shunned those acts that could undermine the integrity of the Board.

2025 MOCK-UTME: GUARD YOUR EXAM FACILITIES JEALOUSLY, OLOYEDE TELLS TOs

The Registrar, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, has advised Technical Officers (TOs) to guard their examination facilities jealously saying these pieces of equipment are government's property, which must be protected at all times.

The Registrar gave this warning at the virtual training and final briefing for TOs hosted from the Board's National Headquarters, Abuja, on 3rd April, 2025.

According to the Registrar, the examination delivery facilities are cherished properties of the Board, which must be handled with care, as careless handlers would be liable for

any damage done to them.

"We don't take infractions on the facility lightly. It cost the Board about five million naira to procure just one of these facilities and since they are government's property you will be asked to account for any loss of the systems," he said.

The Registrar also warned TOs to avoid acts that could jeopardise the sanctity and integrity of the examination such as bribery, corruption, collusion and other unwholesome practices that could undermine the examination.

He said, "Disassociate yourself from people, who are not your associates. Please, don't take bribes. We have paid within allowable limit what

government's regulations say we should pay."

Furthermore, the Registrar cautioned TOs against using their discretion to allow latecomers to enter the examination hall noting that such discretions or waivers could be injurious to the other law-abiding candidates, who arrived early for the examination.

The Registrar concluded his speech by thanking the various presenters for their inspiring and educative presentations meant to give proper orientation to participants at the training session.

JAMB TRAINS 920 TECHNICAL OFFICERS FOR MOCK, UTME

As head of the 2025 Mock-UTME and the main Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) slated for 10th April, and 25th April, 2025, respectively, the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has trained no fewer than 920 Technical Officers (TOs) who are to conduct these examinations.

The virtual training for the TOs hosted from the JAMB National Headquarters, Bwari, Abuja, on 3rd April, 2025, was split into two categories comprising KAD and LAG zones.

KAD, as an examination zone, involved all examination centres in all Northern States but including all the States in the South South zone of the country (Port-Harcourt and Benin zones), while excluding Kano,

Katsina and Jigawa (Kano zone) and FCT, Niger and Kogi (Abuja zone), which together form part of the KAD zone. Those in LAG include examination centres in all the States in the southern part of Nigeria excluding States within the Port Harcourt and Benin zones, but including States in the Kano and Abuja zones.

The training was anchored by seasoned ICT experts and other critical technocrats in the administration of electronic examination delivery system.

To set the ball rolling was the Chairman, Chief Technical Advisor (CTA), Prof. Bashir Galadanci, who urged the TOs to see their engagement as a call to national duty noting that their roles are

extremely important as far as the success of the UTME is concerned.

He pointed out that all the Chief External Examiners (CEEs), Chief Technical Advisors (CTAs) are on ground to assist in this critical national assignment. He noted that for old TOs, the training was nothing but a reminder of an already-familiar terrain. He, however, urged the new TOs to pay attention to specific details on the examination delivery system and live demos, while stressing that they should be diligent to check and make sure they had complete and functional items in their server bags. These include the mifi, scanners, SIMs, laptop chargers, hard drives, among other collectibles.

DAILY NIGERIAN, SUNDAY, MARCH 30, 2025: TETFund to Set Up 72 Specialised ICT Centres: – As part of its commitments to digital education, the Tertiary Education Trust Fund, TETFund, says it will establish 72 ICT centres in universities, polytechnics, and colleges of education across the country.

The Executive Secretary of TETFund, Arc. Sonny Echono, revealed that six specialised centres began operations in February, explaining that the additional 72 centres would be inaugurated in 2025.

He said these hubs would provide students with hands-on training in artificial intelligence (AI), cybersecurity, robotics, and software development. VANGUARD, MONDAY, MARCH 31, 2025: Certificate Racketeering: LASU Recalls Ex-Dean, Prof. Mutalib:- The management of Lagos State University, LASU, has called back the former Dean of Students Affairs (DSA), Professor Tajudeen Olumoko, and Professor Hammed Mutalib after an investigation absolved them of extortion and certificate racketeering.

Recall that in November 2023, the university management suspended Prof. Olumoko and Prof Mutalib following a media report revealing that a syndicate was selling certificates for between N2 million and N3 million, depending on the course of study. Prof. Olumoko was directly linked to the controversy...

The management removed Olumoko from his position as DSA and replaced him with Dr. Abiodun Fatai-Abatan, a senior lecturer in the Department of Political Science, while investigations were conducted by the school senate and the Lagos State House of Assembly.

VANGUARD, WEDNESDAY, APRIL 2, 2025: Education Minister Rolls Out Technology-driven Reforms to Curb Academic Fraud:- The Minister of Education, Dr. Tunji Alausa, has announced the rollout of the Nigeria Education Repository and Databank (NERD) programme, a \$68.8 million technology-driven initiative aimed at eliminating substandard academic reports, fake certificates, and unearned honours in Nigeria's education sector.

Dr. Alausa, in a statement following the Federal Executive Council's (FEC) approval of the programme, said NERD is designed to enhance academic integrity, security, and national planning through digitization and verification mechanisms.

The NERD programme, fully financed by the private sector, is a national technology tool jointly owned by all post-secondary and tertiary institutions in Nigeria alongside regulatory bodies, including: National Universities Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE), National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE), and National Library of Nigeria...

PUNCH, FRIDAY, APRIL 4, 2025: JAMB Uncovers 142 Kano Varsity Applicants with Fake Results:- The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board has uncovered that out of 148 A-level results presented to Bayero University Kano for Direct Entry admission, only six were valid, leaving 142 results deemed fraudulent.

In a recent weekly bulletin, JAMB revealed that one of the primary objectives of its screening process is to ensure that only legitimate documents are used for admission. The Board further emphasised the responsibility of educational institutions to verify these documents thoroughly.

To combat this issue, JAMB established the Nigeria Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System two years ago...

...JAMB Trains 920 Technical Officers For Mock, UTME

Consultant, Mr. Damilola Bamiro, focused on the arrival and the examination start-up time both of which, he said, are sacrosanct.

He stressed the need for TOs to account for all the candidates posted to their centres, copy the CCTV footage, get access to the entire LAN, while urging them to be calm and composed when faced with challenges. He added that the Call Centre has been strengthened to monitor, record and treat complaints as they arose.

Bamiro also took the TOs through pre-examination activities, server management, general policies of the 90-minute examination, rescheduling, capturing of unverified candidates,

anticipated challenges and solutions, among other details.

In her advisory, the Director, Information Technology Services, Mrs. Funmi B-Usman, stressed the importance of teamwork with other examination officials, the need to be vigilant, avoidance of fake alarms on account of their ripple effects on the conduct of the examination, completion of online reports and leveraging effective communication to get solutions to any problem that might arise.

Similarly, the Director, Quality Assurance, Mrs. Doom Iyortoy, and an IT expert, Mr. Musbau Oluwagbenga, made presentations on the necessity of completing online

reports forms in a timely and accurately manner as they could help in the event of litigation. In the same vein, the need to arrange the forms as specified for ease of sorting was also stressed.

Critical security tips were offered by Mr. Charles Eze, a security expert. These bordered on basic safety measures as well as ways of handling examination delivery items.

To round off the training session, participants were treated to live demos of KAD and LAG examination delivery and reporting systems as well as the Sidmach's BVR system all of which are geared towards ensuring a seamless examination outcome.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.

...STAFF BRIEFING: Let's Protect Dignity of JAMB - Oloyede

Staff Briefing held virtually on 2nd April, 2025 and hosted from the National Headquarters, Bwari.

In his remarks, Prof. Oloyede warned staff to be mindful of what they do and the consequences of their actions as these could affect the image of the board positively or negatively. He pointed out that JAMB has carved a niche for itself and, as such, this enviable status must be maintained and respected, "Good name is better than wealth," he posited.

He pointed out that the Board would defend its staff that does anything honourable but will not hesitate to disassociate or blacklist those who may want to drag its name into disrepute.

Some of the issues discussed during the briefing included posting of

technical officers to man JAMB Professional Test Centres (PTCs) and the need to accord them adequate support, the 13 candidates involved in IJMB certificate fraud, Request for or acceptance of gratification by staff, upgrade of the Board's call centre for prompt response to complaints, defrauding candidates by charging them money for free services of the Board, colluding with candidates to falsify documents, the planned posting of electrical staff to PTCs for resolution of power-related issues, membership of spurious WhatsApp group with questionable intent and membership, divulging of unauthorised information, among others.

Earlier, the Director, Human Resource Management, Mr. Gani Abd'rahim, informed the meeting of ongoing

efforts to review the Board's condition of service, granting of approval to staff for training and career development, issuance of commendation letters sent to staff, who have distinguished themselves, and the Board's partnership with the Federal Housing Authority on mass housing for staff, among other interventions aimed at enhancing efficiency of labour and productivity. Similarly, the Director, Information Technology Services, Mrs. Funmi B-Usman, explained the rationale for deploying technical officers and IT professionals to head PTCs stating that the management saw the need to ensure that round pegs are placed in round holes. She, therefore, urged their colleagues to give them maximum support towards delivering quality service to the public.

Therefore, candidates who wish to register can do so at any of the Board's designated Professional Registration Centres (PRCs) on Monday and continuing until the official closing date is revealed.

This liberalization of the registration period allows the Board to complete ongoing investigations into

candidates who have been arrested or are under scrutiny for attempting to use fraudulent A-Level results for registration.

We strongly advise candidates with questionable credentials to refrain from participating in the registration process, as the Board has implemented measures to identify

individuals with such credentials, both now and in the future.

If you have previously used fraudulent results, we urge you to withdraw voluntarily, as the Board is expanding its investigations to include students who have already been admitted.

JAMB REGISTRAR IMPRESSED BY PROF. OLARINDE'S DEFINITION OF PROCTOR

The Registrar, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, has expressed satisfaction with the definition of who a Proctor is as offered by the Chief External Examiner of Ekiti State and the Vice Chancellor, Afe Babalola University, Ado-Ekiti, Ekiti State, Prof. Elisabeta Smaranda Olarinde.

This was part of the key takeaways of the virtual meeting hosted by JAMB with Chief External Examiners (CEEs) and Proctors ahead of the 2025 Mock-UTME.

According to the Vice Chancellor, the role of a Proctor goes beyond the surface meaning as the word has

deeper connotations, which needs to be harnessed for the greater good of the Nigerian child and the education sector in general. She also noted that Proctor should not be just another way of displaying one's status rather it is a call to service.

In her definition, letter (P) stands for Professionalism, (R) stands for Responsible, (O) represents Organise while letter (C) Symbolises character, Letter (T) Timeliness, (O) Orderliness and letter (R) represents Resilience.

She pointed out that as a responsive Proctor, one must imbibe all these attributes to excel in the onerous task before every Proctor.

In the same vein, she stated that a

Proctor is to ensure a fair and honest testing environment by supervising examinations, verifying identities, enforcing rules, and preventing cheating, ensuring fairness, explaining instructions and rules, collecting and collating materials after the examination is completed.

Other roles include monitoring candidates, reporting irregularities, maintaining order, ensuring exam security, maintaining the integrity of the examination, among other tasks, that may be assigned to them.

In her closing remarks, Prof. Olarinde commended JAMB for always coming up with innovations to enhance the sanctity of its examinations.
