Impressed with the successful conduct of its 2025 promotion examination, the Federal Civil Service Commission (FCSC) has commended the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) for the level of professionalism and integrity displayed during the exercise.

The Chairman of the Commission, Prof. Tunji Olaopa, gave this commendation when he monitored the exercise on Thursday, 13th November, 2025, at the Board's Computer-Based Test Centre (CBT) Kogo, Bwari.

A visibly-impressed Chairman pointed out

To be eligible for admission, candidates must first upload their O'level qualifications. WAEC has released the 2025 SSCE results, and candidates are urged to ensure that they upload their O'level results promptly. For those who are awaiting their SSCE conducted by NECO, please note that the SSCE results will be available soon, and you are expected to upload them as soon as they are released. It is crucial to understand that no candidate will be considered for admission if their O'level results are not uploaded.

DO NOT ACCEPT ADMISSION OUTSIDE CAPS

The Board once again, reiterates its warning to all candidates not to accept any admission offered outside the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS). CAPS remains the only approved platform through which institutions are authorized to conduct admissions.

This warning has become necessary due to the increasing number of candidates currently facing serious challenges after accepting such unauthorized

admissions. Many of these candidates are unable to print their JAMB Admission Letter, and consequently, even after completing their studies, they cannot proceed to the Nigerian Law School (for Law graduates), practice as medical doctors (for Medicine graduates), or participate in the NYSC scheme, as such admissions are illegal.

To avoid these complications, candidates and their parents are strongly advised to ensure that every

MATRICULATION EXERCISE IS AN OATH-TAKING CEREMONY; ANY BREACH CONSTITUTES SERIOUS MISCONDUCT

The Board wishes to remind all students of tertiary institutions that matriculation ceremonies are formal oath-taking exercises. Any violation of the matriculation oath is regarded as a serious act of misconduct. This clarification has become necessary following recent findings in which several matriculated candidates who participated in the 2025 UTME were involved in examination misconduct.

Institutions concerned have been duly notified, and affected candidates now face possible expulsion, as such behaviour represents a clear breach of the matriculation oath and may also attract prosecution.

Tertiary institutions are therefore, urged to reiterate the significance of this oath to all newly-admitted students and encourage them to uphold the integrity

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...Do Not Accept Admission Outside CAPS

admission offer is issued through CAPS, and that they accept and print the official JAMB Admission Letter before proceeding.

Many institutions offering admissions outside CAPS are in violation of several regulations, especially regarding regulated programmes such as Law and Medicine.

The Board has long discontinued the regularization of such admissions; therefore, any admission obtained outside CAPS cannot be legitimized. At present, several affected candidates have taken certain institutions to court for subjecting them to this hardship, and the Board is supporting their pursuit of justice.

The Board therefore urges all institutions to desist immediately from offering admissions outside CAPS. Institutions experiencing any challenges with carrying capacity or pressure from stakeholders are encouraged to engage the Board directly rather than attempting to bypass CAPS

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).

3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.

4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.

5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.

6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.

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MISCONDUCT IN THE CIVIL SERVICE: UNDERSTANDING THE BOUNDARIES OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

"Discipline is the soul of public service; without it, order collapses and excellence becomes impossible." - **George Washington.**

Every functional organization thrives on discipline, professionalism, and a shared commitment to ethical standards. In the Nigerian Civil Service, these expectations are codified in the Public Service Rules (PSR), which clearly outline acts that constitute misconduct and the consequences that follow.

What Is Misconduct?

According to the Public Service Rules (100301), misconduct is a *specific act of wrongdoing or improper behaviour* that is inimical to the image of the Service and can be investigated and proved. Misconduct is a public service offence that can lead to termination of appointment, retirement, or other disciplinary actions, depending on its gravity.

Understanding what constitutes it would equip members of staff with moral standard to take decisive precautionary measures and to steer clear all sorts of unwholesome practices while upholding ethical values for a productive workforce.

Examples of Misconduct

The PSR clarifies misconduct into numerous acts of wrong doings, including:

1. Scandalous and Improper Behaviour

- Immoral behaviour
- Unruly conduct
- Drunkenness while on duty
- Foul or abusive language
- Assault or battery

2. Administrative and Professional Failures

- Habitual lateness to work
- Deliberate delay in treating official documents
- Failure to keep proper records
- Sleeping while on duty
- Negligence or lack of due care

3. Violations of Rules and Procedures

- Unauthorized removal of public records
- Dishonesty
- Improper or immodest dressing while on duty
- Hawking or selling merchandise within office premises
- Refusal to take or carry out lawful instructions
- Refusal to accept posting or proceed on transfer

4. Acts of Indiscipline

- Insubordination
- Discourteous behaviour to the public
- Malingering (pretending to be ill to avoid duty)

These actions may appear minor to some, but collectively, they erode the Service's credibility and impede its operations.

Effects of Misconduct

Misconduct is not just a rule-violation; it brings disrepute to the image of the organisation, undermines professionalism, breaches public trust, hampers efficiency in service delivery and dampens the morale of the diligent staff.

For instance, it reflects negatively on:

1. The Officer

Repeated misconduct can lead to:

- Loss of credibility
- Poor performance appraisal
- Stagnation
- Reduction in rank
- Termination or compulsory retirement

2. The Department

It causes:

- Delays in service delivery
- Breakdown of order
- Increased conflict and complaints

3. The Board

It affects:

- Public trust
- Organizational reputation

In essence, misconduct affects the entire service ecosystem.

Qualities of a Good Public Servant

It is the responsibility of every staff member of the Board to uphold good qualities expected of a public servant- professionalism, dedication to duty, accountability, punctuality, integrity, being courteous, prompt processing of documents and other official matters, follow lawful directives from supervisors, maintain decorum and proper conduct at all times, dress properly, keep accurate and complete records, among others.

...Human Resource Management in Focus

Prevention of misconducts begins with self-awareness and shared commitment to the values of the Service.

Institutional Role in Curbing Misconduct

Management and HRM will continue to:

- Provide continuous sensitization on values and ethics
- Ensure fair and consistent enforcement of discipline
- Promote a supportive work environment
- Encourage transparent communication
- Address grievances promptly to prevent frustration-induced misconduct

When expectations are clear and support is provided, workplace discipline becomes easier to sustain.

Final Word

In conclusion, the Civil Service is a pillar of national stability. Every act of misconduct, no matter how small, chips away at the foundation. As such, understanding the boundaries of acceptable behaviour is essential for personal growth, organizational harmony, and effective service delivery.

Each officer must constantly ask: "Is my conduct building trust, or eroding it?" When you choose discipline over complacency; professionalism over shortcuts, the entire organisation would rise above limitations. Let us all uphold the dignity of the Service through behavioural alignment to the values we proudly represent.

ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR PROCESSING OF (DEGREE) ADMISSION FOR AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS

In 2022, the Board proposed that universities should take full responsibility for admissions into all degree programmes offered through institutions affiliated with them. However, this directive was not fully implemented, as universities were initially given the liberty to decide on the matter, pending a final resolution. To date, only the University of Ibadan has assumed this role of overseeing and coordinating the admissions of its affiliate institutions.

2. Following the meeting held on Monday, 18th August 2025, with various institutions regarding violations of matriculation guidelines, concerns were raised about the existing admission processing structure. Notably, institutions complained that they could not be held accountable for the misdemeanors of their affiliates under the existing processing format. As a result of this, the matter was revisited.

3. Consequently, it was resolved that the previously proposed process, where Mother-Institutions take responsibility for admissions into their affiliated institutions, should now be adopted and implemented by all universities with affiliates.

4. In light of the above, the Board has developed an updated procedure for the processing of admissions by both Mother-Institutions and their affiliates, as follows:

- a. Head of the affiliated-institution logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and downloads candidates for a particular programme;
- b. The Head of the Affiliated-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and sets admissions criteria for every programme, such as minimum scores for UTME, post UTME, aggregate, catchment and ELDS;
- c. The Head of the affiliated institution proposes the qualified candidates for each programme on CAPS and it goes to the Head of the mother-institution;
- d. The Head of the Mother-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into the JAMB (CAPS) portal and recommends the candidate to the Registrar of JAMB (or representative) for approval or declines the proposal with a reason for the rejection;
- e. The Registrar of JAMB (or representative) approves the recommendation(s) from the Head of the Mother-Institution or declines the recommendation with a reason for the rejection;

- f. If the recommendation is approved, the candidate is notified through his/her email and SMS to either accept or reject the offer of admission. The two institutions can log in and view the status of the recommended candidates;
- g. If the candidate accepts the offer of admission, he/she can thereafter print his/her admission letter and access other services online from his/her profile.

NOTE: *The Head of an Affiliated-Institution has access to “VIEW ONLY” all recommendations by the Head of a Mother Institution.*
