

Prof Oloyede also promised to support the Commission's quest to leverage the Board's expertise to administer its recruitment and promotion examinations using the Computer-Based Test mode.

He said FCSC is one of the highlyrespected organisations by the Board pointing out that the Board selects the kind of organisation it partners with as, according to him, JAMB does not collaborate based on money but on the credibility of the organisation involved adding that the proposed examination is an avenue through which the Board could test run its facilities in readiness for the prosecution of one of its core mandates, which has to do with the ranking and placement of suitably-qualified candidates into tertiary institutions of their choice.

Additionally, Prof Oloyede advised the FCSC Chairman to gradually digitize its recruitment process first before extending same to its other core operational processes.

Earlier, the Chairman told the Registrar that his mission was to leverage JAMB infrastructural facilities to drive its recruitment and promotion processes with a view to strengthening its ongoing reforms.

He commended Prof Oloyede for his laudable achievements and

innovations in JAMB, describing him as a national icon and extra administrator, a role model with a blend of spirituality and character.

He also said he was impressed with the international best practices adopted by JAMB in its operations which enhanced its integrity and accountability.

AUTHORITY, SUNDAY, MARCH 16, 2025: Loan Scheme: NELFUND to Deploy Software for Students with <u>Disabilities - The Nigerian Education</u> Loan Fund (NELFUND) says plans are underway to introduce specialized software aimed at ensuring that students with disabilities in higher institutions can fully take advantage of its loan scheme.

Managing Director/Chief Executive of NELFUND, Mr. Akintunde Sawyerr, disclosed this during a stakeholders' engagement on student loan in Benin City, Edo State.

Mr. Sawyerr emphasized that the Act establishing the loan scheme guarantees equal opportunity for all, adding that NELFUND will collaborate with the National Commission for Persons with Disabilities (NCPWD) to ensure more inclusivity.

THE CABLE, SUNDAY, MARCH 16, 2025: Private Varsity Asks NUC to Increase Quotas for Student Admission: - The Peaceland University in Enugu has urged the National Universities Commission (NUC) to increase the quota given to universities for student admission.

Prof. Felix Ugwuozor, the Pro-Chancellor, spoke at the private university's second matriculation ceremony in Enugu recently. About 700 new students participated in the matriculation.

Prof. Ugwuozor said more students would have been admitted but the institution was hindered by the quota given to it by the NUC.

"We admitted over 600 students within the four faculties of the university. The number would have been more, but because of the NUC

numbers," he said.

LEADERSHIP, SUNDAY, MARCH 16, 2025: Minister Asks Vice-Chancellors to Tackle 75% Admission Shortfall: -Minister of Education, Dr. Maruf Tunji Alausa, has urged Nigerian universities to address the over 75 percent shortfall in university admissions in the country. He made the call recently in Abuja during a meeting with vice chancellors of Nigerian universities.

As part of these reforms, the minister has mandated all institutions to implement hybrid learning models by 2025, urging universities to prioritise specialised education programmes to bridge the growing skills gap in the workforce.

He said every year, around two million people apply to the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) for admission to universities, polytechnics, or colleges of

education, but only about 330,000 are admitted, resulting in an admission rate of 22–25%.

He said this leaves a significant number of applicants, around 75 percent without access to higher education.

<u>Affected as JAMB Uncovers Data</u>

<u>Discrepancies</u>: – The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) said 132 out of the 887 approved Computer-Based Test (CBT) centres have reported discrepancies in the data of one or two of their candidates.

JAMB, in its weekly bulletin JAMBULLETIN, stated that the discrepancies affected 200 candidates.

It however added that though the number of discrepancies is relatively small (200 out of 2,030,627 candidates registered), it remains unacceptable to the Board...

"The 200 candidates identified as negligent have been invited to visit any JAMB centre to rectify the mismatched data. Additionally, the registration officers at the centres involved in these discrepancies have been permanently barred from participating in any JAMB registration or examination-related activities. 2025: FG Rolls Out TVET Programme for Skills Development: – Federal government has rolled out a nationwide Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) programme to equip Nigerians with industry-relevant skills.

In line with this initiative, the Federal Ministry of Education, through the National Board for Technical Education (NBTE), has called on Skills Training Centres (STCs), Vocational Enterprise Institutions (VEIs) and Mastercraft Persons (MCPs) to register for accreditation.

The Director, Press and Public Relations Boriowo Folasade, said the accreditation would enable them to receive government funding to train candidates under the TVET programme.

According to her, "accredited institutions and individuals will be eligible for government funding to train candidates under the TVET Program. Interested applicants should apply via the NBTE Digital Portal:www.digitalnbte.nbte.gov.ng/TVET/TVETApplication2," she added. Also in People's Daily, Monday, March 17, 2025.

NATION, MONDAY, MARCH 17, 2025: JAMB Accuses Tertiary Institutions of Admitting Students with Fake A'Level Results: - The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has accused some tertiary institutions of admitting students using fake Advanced Level (A'level) results without proper verification.

According to a release by its Public Communication Advisor, Dr. Fabian Benjamin, the Board recently uncovered 13 additional fraudulent A'level certificates submitted for admission consideration. Some institutions had already processed admissions for candidates using these fake documents...

He said, "The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has observed that some institutions are failing to verify the results used for admitting candidates, particularly those seeking direct entry.

"One of the fundamental purposes of the screening process is to ensure that only legitimate documents are used to consider and accept candidates for admission and registration. PREMIUM TIMES, MONDAY, MARCH 17, 2025: Blind Students' Association Seeks Solution to UTME Challenges: – The Nigeria Association of the Blind (NAB) has called on the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) to address the challenges blind candidates face in mathematics, particularly in handling graphs and other visual components required for university entry.

NAB President, Mr. Stanley Onyebuchi, made the appeal during a visit to JAMB Registrar, Is-haq Oloyede, at the Board's headquarters in Bwari, Abuja, on 12 March.

According to Mr. Onyebuchi the current mathematics requirements for university admission pose significant difficulties for blind students, preventing many from realising their academic aspirations. The Registrar, Mr Oloyede expressed appreciation for NAB's advocacy and gave his assurance that the Board remains committed to addressing the concerns raised.

CBT EXAM MODE: MAGASHI COMMENDS WAEC



he Katsina State Coordinator of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Mr. Nasiru Garba Magashi, has commended the West African Examinations Council (WAEC) for adopting computer-based testing mode, saying this new approach to testing would address various challenges associated with the traditional paper-pencil testing.

Magashi gave the commendation in his goodwill message during the 73rd Anniversary of WAEC on Monday, 17th March, 2025, at the Council's office in Katsina, Katsina State.

In his admonition, Magashi urged the Council not to hesitate to reach out to JAMB for assistance on any CBT-related matters, stressing that the Board's experience in that regard is beyond compare.

Earlier, the WAEC Katsina State Branch Controller, Dr. Moshood Olaniyi, in his address, disclosed that WAEC was established in 1952 to administer requisite examinations in the English-speaking West African countries, including Nigeria, Ghana, Sierra Leone, Gambia and Liberia, to award certificates comparable to those of equivalent examining authorities internationally.

According to him, the Council conducted its first computer-based test in Nigeria in its January/February, 2024 diet. The exercise, according to him was consecutively repeated in that November/December, 2024 as well as that of January/February, 2025, emphasising that the Council would continue to leverage technology to achieve its testing objectives.

In his goodwill message, the Chairperson of the occasion, Hon. Commissioner for Basic Education Hajiya Zainab Musa Musawa, who was represented by the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry, Hajia Ummulkhairi Bawa

Faskari, congratulated WAEC on its 73rd Anniversary, while admonishing the Council to sustain its enviable standards.

Highlights of the occasion comprised a debate between the students of Government Day Secondary School (GDSS), Kofar Yandaka, and MUMED Comprehensive Secondary School, on the topic, "CBT for Public Examination in Nigeria" wherein the MUMED Comprehensive Secondary School argued that with CBT examination, the cost of examination paper production and the risk associated with transportation of sensitive materials would be totally eliminated, thereby making the practice cost effective. Other benefits of the practice, according to the debaters include: timely release of results and nipping examination malpractice in the bud.

While the opponents from GDSS Kofar Yandaka argued that CBT examination is capital intensive, saying the cost of establishing a CBT centre is outrageous and candidates from rural areas would suffer to access any CBT-related service.

The Nigerian Army Officers Wives Association (NAOWA) cultural troupe added glamour to the occasion through its rendition of beautiful music.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES


This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular.**

- 2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
- 3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
- 4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
- 5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
- 6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
- 7. Please be guided for compliance.




