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
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

fewer than 100 UTME registrations of candidates who solicited score inflation through the syndicate.

The Registrar, Is-haq Oloyede, disclosed this at a press briefing held on Saturday, 28th February, 2026.

He explained that, beyond AI manipulation, the syndicates were involved in criminal conspiracy, impersonation, identity theft, online fraud, forgery, and the staging of a fake press conference.

Investigations revealed that the criminal network operated under the guise of an online platform known as "Exam Pro Master," where they falsely claimed to offer "direct system packages," "mobile answer delivery," and "VIP assistance" to UTME candidates.

"To lend credibility to their deception, they generated fake AI images and videos of top functionaries of the Board, forged JAMB staff identity cards, and

organised a simulated press conference, all deliberately designed to mislead desperate candidates and their parents.

"These individuals did not merely spread falsehoods; they constructed an alternate reality. This is not mere mischief or desperation but a premeditated crime," he said.

The Registrar described the development as deeply troubling, noting that payments had already been made to the fraudsters ahead of the 2026 UTME, for which registration has just concluded.

"Barely two weeks into the 2026 UTME registration, investigations established that no fewer than 120 candidates paid the syndicate in a bid to illegally influence their examination outcomes, an entirely non-existent possibility.

"Any candidate found to have paid, solicited, or collaborated with examination fraudsters will face

sanctions. The Board will not succumb to public appeals for clemency, emotional blackmail, or lobbying. Claims of ignorance, regret, or remorse after arrest will not erase culpability. The era in which fraudsters are prosecuted while their patrons walk free is over," he stated.

The Registrar also issued a stern warning to parents, guardians, and the general public to desist from all forms of examination malpractice.

"Parents must understand that paying for fraud does not secure a child's future; it destroys it. You are teaching them that cheating is strategy, deception is acceptable, and merit is optional. Such dangerous lessons do not end with the UTME; they follow them into tertiary institutions, professions, and public life, with devastating consequences for the nation," he warned.

2026 UTME: AUTOMATION OF TEST ITEMS PROCESS COMPLETED – JAMB

The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has successfully completed the automation of its test item development process for the 2026 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) and other Board examinations. The innovation, known as the Remote Authoring and Moderation System (RAMS), marks the end of the manual method previously used in developing examination items.

The automation training, which concluded on Wednesday, 25th February 2026, at the University of Ibadan, Ibadan, Oyo State, brought together item writers to finalise the digitisation process ahead of the forthcoming UTME. A test run conducted immediately after the training confirmed the system's efficiency and readiness. The initiative represents a significant breakthrough for a Computer-Based Test (CBT) examination that requires the development and management of millions of test items annually.

Speaking at the event, the Registrar of JAMB, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, described the decade-long journey to full digital automation as rigorous but rewarding. He noted that RAMS symbolises the Board's transition from a manual, paper-based system to a fully digital platform, eliminating challenges such as physical movement of documents, logistical constraints, identification of resource persons, and other bureaucratic bottlenecks associated with convening physical meetings.

According to the Registrar, the new system will make the process easier, more cost-effective, and more efficient. He added that automation enhances the integrity, security, and reliability of examination items, while also relieving authors of the stress of travel. "This is a win-win situation for both the Board and item writers," he stated.

Prof. Oloyede also provided an update on the 2026 UTME registration exercise, revealing that over two million candidates had

registered as at the time of the briefing. He assured the nation of the Board's commitment to conducting a credible examination. In response to appeals from certain Nigerians for centres delisted for various infractions to be involved, he reiterated the Board's zero tolerance for malpractice and non-compliance with its operational standards.

The Registrar further called on political leaders and well-meaning Nigerians to support the Board's efforts by investing in the establishment of world-class CBT centres to enhance digital literacy nationwide. He commended the Governor of Borno State, Prof. Babagana Zulum, and Barr. Ahmed Raji (SAN), among others, for their exemplary support and recognition of the value of investing in education. In her remarks, the Chairperson of the Forum of Vice-Chancellors of Federal Universities and Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Akure, Prof. Adenike Oladiji, described RAMS as a robust

BLUEPRINT, TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 2026: NECO, NOUN team up To Facilitate Verification Of Candidates' Results: The Registrar of the National Examinations Council (NECO), Prof. Ibrahim Dantani Wushishi, has announced plans to deepen collaboration with the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN) to enhance the verification of candidates' results and promote computer-based examinations nationwide.

Speaking during a courtesy visit to the university on Tuesday, Prof. Wushishi said the partnership was aimed at safeguarding the integrity of NECO certificates and ensuring that only candidates with authentic results gain admission into NOUN.

He congratulated the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Uduma Oji Uduma, on his appointment, describing him as a seasoned administrator with proven academic integrity.

Prof. Wushishi noted that the visit was driven by three key objectives: to formally felicitate with the new VC, to explore collaboration on result authentication through NECO's e-Verify platform, and to examine areas of cooperation in computer-based testing (CBT).

While providing further details, the NECO Registrar recalled that the Council previously handled result verification manually, often taking months to process requests from institutions across more than 50 countries. He explained that the introduction of the NECO e-Verify system two years ago has

transformed the process, with nearly five million results verified electronically.

"With the API integration, institutions can seamlessly confirm the authenticity of candidates' NECO results without delay," Wushishi said, urging NOUN to key into the platform. He also highlighted the university's extensive CBT infrastructure nationwide, noting that NECO is aligning with the policy direction of the Federal Ministry of Education to migrate fully from paper-based to computer-based examinations. LEADERSHIP, TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 2026: Foundation Sponsors JAMB Registration For 300 Indigent Ondo Students: High Chiefs Bode and Betty Osedimilehin Foundation (HCCBO Foundation) has sponsored the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) registration for 300 indigent students across underserved communities in Ondo State.

The foundation, established in April 2024 by High Chief Olabode Samson Osedimilehin and High Chief Oluwatoyin Osedimilehin said the initiative is part of its efforts to expand access to education and support young Nigerians facing financial challenges. The beneficiaries were selected through a transparent, community-based process designed to ensure that the assistance reached students most in need.

It stated that covering the cost of

registration for the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board examination would provide beneficiaries with an opportunity to pursue tertiary education. The foundation reaffirmed its commitment to youth development and human capital growth, noting that investment in education is essential to Nigeria's long-term development.

PUNCH, WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 26, 2026: JAMB Projects N23.8bn IGR, Expands UTME Centres To 1,000: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board has declared before the Senate that it is targeting N23.8bn as internally generated revenue for the 2026 fiscal year – a N4bn increase over its 2025 projection.

The revenue projection formed part of the agency's 2026 budget estimates presented to the Senate Committee on Tertiary Institutions and TETFund. The presentation was made by Mr. Muftau Bello, a Director in the office of the Registrar, Professor Ishaq Oloyede.

Providing a breakdown of the proposal, the JAMB representative disclosed that N6bn from the projected revenue would be remitted to the Federation Account as operating surplus.

The agency also gave an account of its 2025 budget performance, informing the committee chaired by Senator Muntari Dandutse that it generated N18.5bn as IGR during the fiscal year and remitted N4bn to the Federation Account as operating

On preparations for the 2026 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME), the director disclosed that 1,000 examination centres had been created across the country, significantly higher than the fewer than 800 centres utilised in 2025. PUNCH, THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 26, 2026: Alausa Seeks Higher Education Budget, Warns Of Teacher Shortage: The Minister of Education, Dr. Tunji Alausa, has urged the National Assembly to significantly strengthen funding for the Federal Ministry of Education's 2026 budget proposal to address critical challenges, including acute teacher shortages, weak infrastructure and security concerns in public schools. Dr. Alausa made the appeal while defending the Ministry's 2026 estimates before the Senate and House of Representatives Joint Committee on Education at the National Assembly Complex, Abuja.

The minister assured lawmakers that the Ministry would ensure full and transparent implementation if the proposal is approved, stressing that increased investment would translate into measurable improvements across the sector. "We aim to convince the National Assembly that a minimum of 20 per cent allocation to education, as recommended by UNESCO, should serve as the benchmark for future budgets.

Highlighting the staffing challenge,

Alausa disclosed that Federal Unity Colleges are currently facing a deficit of more than 3,500 teachers, a gap that is severely affecting the teaching of core subjects such as science, mathematics and technical education. "The shortage of qualified teachers is crippling our efforts to deliver quality education and produce graduates who can compete on the global stage," he said.

He called for urgent funding to recruit, train and retain competent teachers, noting that closing the manpower gap is critical to improving learning outcomes and strengthening Nigeria's human capital base. Also in *Leadership*, Thursday, February 26, 2027

BLUEPRINT, FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 2026: UTME: Disregard Misleading Reports, We Didn't Increase Registration Fees- JAMB: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has said it has not increased fees paid for registration of the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME).

The board said the fees have remained the same since 2019, noting that in 2018, the Federal Executive Council approved a reduction in the UTME application fee from ₦5,000 to ₦3,500, which took effect from the 2019 registration exercise.

In a statement, JAMB's spokesman, Dr. Fabian Benjamin, urged parents and candidates to disregard misleading reports on social media about increment of registration fees. The statement read: "The attention of the Board has been drawn to a publication insinuating that the Board has increased its registration fees.

"The Board wishes to state categorically that this claim is false, misleading and entirely unfounded. For the avoidance of doubt, the approved registration fees remain as follows: Direct Entry (DE): ₦5,700, UTME Only (without Mock): ₦7,200,

UTME with Mock: ₦8,700.

"The Board therefore urges members of the public, particularly prospective candidates and their parents/guardians, to disregard the said publication and rely only on official information released through the Board's verified platforms and advertisements. "Candidates are strongly advised to carefully read the Board's official advertisement. This will enable them avoid being misled or exploited by dishonest individuals or centres.

Furthermore, the Board appeals to any candidate who has paid more than the officially approved fees to promptly report such centres with credible evidence.

"Such reports will enable the Board investigate and take immediate disciplinary action against any erring centre found to be overcharging or engaging in any sharp practices. *Leadership*, Friday, February 27, 2026

LEADERSHIP, FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 2026: NUC Issues Fresh Guidelines To Curb Abuse Of Honorary Doctorate Degrees: The National Universities Commission (NUC) has issued fresh, comprehensive guidelines aimed at curbing the growing misuse and abuse of honorary doctorate degrees in Nigeria's university system.

In a circular dated Tuesday, February 24, 2026, and addressed to all Vice-Chancellors of Nigerian universities, the Commission said the new framework was designed to safeguard the integrity of the nation's higher education sector, standardise procedures for the conferment of honorary degrees, and halt practices that undermine academic credibility.

The directive, signed on behalf of the Executive Secretary of NUC by the Acting Director of the Executive Secretary's Office, Mr. Adewale Bakare, noted that the guidelines

were first developed in September 2025 and circulated to universities for input in December 2025.

Following the receipt and incorporation of feedbacks from several institutions, the management of the Commission approved their final circulation for strict compliance.

According to the NUC, the guidelines became necessary in response to

increasing concerns over the indiscriminate award and inappropriate use of honorary doctorate degrees, which, in some cases, have been linked to commercialisation, conflicts of interest and reputational damage to the university system. The Commission stated that only approved universities, whether public or private, are eligible to

award honorary doctorate degrees in Nigeria.

Also, universities are to demonstrate academic maturity, as only institutions that have successfully graduated their first set of PhD students are permitted to confer such honours.

LEADERSHIP, MONDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2026: Yakubu Gowon Varsity Expels 28 Students Over Misconduct: The Senate of Yakubu Gowon University (formerly University of Abuja) has approved the expulsion of 28 students over various offences.

The decision was taken at the 191st Regular Meeting of the Senate held recently at the University's Main Campus, following consideration of the report and recommendations of the Student Disciplinary Committee (SDC). According to a statement by Dr Habib Yakoob, Acting Director, Information and University Relations, the offences for which the affected students were found culpable included threat to life and assault, examination malpractice, conspiracy, burglary, theft and cult-related activities.

Others were possession and use of hard drugs, falsification of 'O' Level results uploaded on the University portal for admission, as well as failure to appear before the disciplinary committee after repeated invitations.

The Senate also approved the withdrawal of certificates of 15 former students who failed to honour invitations by the Committee despite several notices.

"Similarly, nine students were exonerated after investigations, while thirty-three others received warnings for various infractions, including conspiracy, hostel racketeering, and fighting," the statement said.

Speaking on the development, the Vice-Chancellor and Chairman of Senate, Professor Hakeem Fawehinmi, reaffirmed the University's commitment to maintaining a safe and conducive learning environment. He stated that the institution would continue to uphold discipline and enforce its rules and regulations without compromise.

The Vice-Chancellor commended the Student Disciplinary Committee for its thorough and diligent handling of the cases and urged students to conduct themselves responsibly and avoid actions that could jeopardise their academic pursuits.

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.

ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR PROCESSING OF (DEGREE) ADMISSION FOR AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS

In 2022, the Board proposed that universities should take full responsibility for admissions into all degree programmes offered through institutions affiliated with them. However, this directive was not fully implemented, as universities were initially given the liberty to decide on the matter, pending a final resolution. To date, only the University of Ibadan has assumed this role of overseeing and coordinating the admissions of its affiliate institutions.

2. Following the meeting held on Monday, 18th August 2025, with various institutions regarding violations of matriculation guidelines, concerns were raised about the existing admission processing structure. Notably, institutions complained that they could not be held accountable for the misdemeanors of their affiliates under the existing processing format. As a result of this, the matter was revisited.

3. Consequently, it was resolved that the previously proposed process, where Mother-Institutions take responsibility for admissions into their affiliated institutions, should now be adopted and implemented by all universities with affiliates.

4. In light of the above, the Board has developed an updated procedure for the processing of admissions by both Mother-Institutions and their affiliates, as follows:

- a. Head of the affiliated-institution logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and downloads candidates for a particular programme;
- b. The Head of the Affiliated-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and sets admissions criteria for every programme, such as minimum scores for UTME, post UTME, aggregate, catchment and ELDS;
- c. The Head of the affiliated institution proposes the qualified candidates for each programme on CAPS and it goes to the Head of the mother-institution;
- d. The Head of the Mother-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into the JAMB (CAPS) portal and recommends the candidate to the Registrar of JAMB (or representative) for approval or declines the proposal with a reason for the rejection;
- e. The Registrar of JAMB (or representative) approves the recommendation(s) from the Head of the Mother-Institution or declines the recommendation with a reason for the rejection;

- f. If the recommendation is approved, the candidate is notified through his/her email and SMS to either accept or reject the offer of admission. The two institutions can log in and view the status of the recommended candidates;
- g. If the candidate accepts the offer of admission, he/she can thereafter print his/her admission letter and access other services online from his/her profile.

NOTE: The Head of an Affiliated-Institution has access to “VIEW ONLY” all recommendations by the Head of a Mother-Institution.

5. All Universities serving as Mother-institutions, Polytechnics/Monotechnics, Colleges of Education and other institutes offering degrees in affiliation with universities are to be guided by this, please.

JAMB REGISTRAR URGES SUSTAINABLE USE OF SOLAR SYSTEM

A call has gone to staff of the Board across the country to shun any act that could lead to the damage of the solar power systems, which are alternative sources of power, installed in its offices across the country.

The Registrar of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, issued this warning at an interactive session with staff of Maiduguri zonal office on Monday, 23rd February, 2026.

The Registrar vowed that serious sanctions such as surcharge or outright sack awaits anybody, who flagrantly destroyed these installations or any other critical assets of the Board.

He stated that any act inimical to the development and progress of the workplace would be resisted noting

that such an act of misdemeanour would be considered as sabotage, which the Board would not treat with levity.

Prof. Oloyede stressed the seriousness of these abuses saying it costs the Board huge sums of money to get those pieces of equipment installed so as to enhance efficiency of labour and productivity.

He recalled that in 2017 the Board embarked on a similar venture but the gesture was abused and the solar systems destroyed.

He noted that some offices went as far as disconnecting the Board's main source of power from the national grid and relying totally on the alternate power supply, while some overloaded these solar power systems with banned elements.

He said, "the solar system would not

get damaged on its own. So, anybody that does anything which leads to the destruction of the system shall face severe consequences including surcharging the person."

He lamented that, currently, many of the the solar systems are poorly maintained, neglected, suffered incorrect usage or improper cleaning thereby allowing debris, dust, or bird droppings to build up creating "hot spots" that can damage the solar cells and reduce efficiency, while others plug pressing irons or other banned items, which culminated in destruction of the systems, severe safety hazards, structural damage, and significant financial losses to the Board.

NO INCREASE IN UTME REGISTRATION FEES

The attention of the Board has been drawn to a publication insinuating that the Board has increased its registration fees.

The Board wishes to state categorically that this claim is false, misleading and entirely unfounded. For the avoidance of doubt, the approved registration fees remain as follows:

- Direct Entry (DE): ₦5,700
- UTME Only (without Mock): ₦7,200
- UTME with Mock: ₦8,700

Breakdown:

- Application Fee – ₦3,500;
- Reading Text – ₦1,000;
- CBT Centre Registration Service Charge – ₦700;
- CBT Centre UTME Service Charge – ₦1,500;
- Bank Charges – ₦500; CBT Mock-

UTME Centre Charge – ₦1,500.

These fees have remained unchanged since 2019.

It is pertinent to recall that in 2018, the Federal Executive Council approved a reduction in the UTME application fee from ₦5,000 to ₦3,500, with effect from the 2019 registration exercise. Since the government-approved reduction, the Board has maintained the same fee structure without any increase, despite rising operational costs.

The Board therefore urges members of the public, particularly prospective candidates and their parents/guardians, to disregard the said publication and rely only on official information released through the Board's verified platforms and advertisements.

Candidates are strongly advised to

carefully read the Board's official advertisement. This will enable them avoid being misled or exploited by dishonest individuals or centres.

Furthermore, the Board appeals to any candidate who has paid more than the officially approved fees to promptly report such centres with credible evidence. Such reports will enable the Board investigate and take immediate disciplinary action against any erring centre found to be overcharging or engaging in any sharp practices.

The Board remains committed to transparency, accountability and the protection of candidates' interests at all times.

UYO JAMB OFFICE STRENGTHENS COLLABORATION WITH UNIUYO

The Akwa Ibom State Coordinator of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board, Mrs. Grace Olima-William, and her management team, on Wednesday, 25th February, 2026,

paid a courtesy visit to the newly-appointed Ag. Vice Chancellor, University of Uyo, Prof. Samuel Gbadebo Odewunmi, and his management staff.

In her welcome address, Mrs Olima-

William congratulated the Vice-Chancellor on his recent appointment. She stated that the visit was to ensure that the existing relationship between the Board and

the Institution remains not only cordial but reinforced for greater tasks ahead.

The Coordinator assured the Vice-Chancellor of the Board's continuous synergy with the institution towards ensuring that the University of Uyo remained a model worthy of emulation since it conducts all its admissions through the Central Admission Processing System (CAPS).

Mrs Olima-William further stated that the Board's goal for the 2026/2027 cycle was simple and that is strict adherence to all Board's guidelines on admissions, transparency, zero tolerance for illegal admissions, among others.

She disclosed that the University of Uyo currently houses one of the most critical CBT centres in the State, but decried the fact that the institution nearly lost its accreditation, because of the deplorable state of its facilities and infrastructure.

The Coordinator, therefore, called for the repositioning and strengthening of the centre infrastructure as it prepares for the upcoming UTME. According to her, the State Office

was looking forward to continuous partnership with the institution's technical team to ensure that the centre is fully equipped, ethically sound and technologically flawless.

She also recalled that in the previous year, some underage candidates who picked University of Uyo as their first choice were disappointed as they were not admitted despite their good scores, and therefore, urged caution as the institution navigate issues relating to issues bordering on the 16-year age limit and verification of DE credentials, among others.

She reiterated that her office is not only a regulatory outpost but also a resource centre for the university community especially with respect to resolving candidates' indemnity forms issue as well as conducting staff sensitization on the latest JAMB modules.

In his response, the Ag. Vice Chancellor, Prof. Odewunmi, expressed appreciation for the visit. He commended the Board, under the leadership of Prof. Ish-aq Oloyede, for his integrity and passion, as JAMB seemed to be far ahead of every other examination

bodies in the country, and that about 70% of the challenges that JAMB is dealing with have not been encountered by any other.

According to the Vice-Chancellor, as a member of JAMB family, he currently served as a Coordinator of JAMB Equal Opportunity Group and other sub-committees of the Board.

On the issue of Exceptionally-Brilliant Candidates, who are under-16, he said that he had been co-opted into the Monitoring and Evaluation Committee in order to track their progress in comparison with others as this would help the Committee in terms of Policy Evaluation. He appealed for further increase in admission ratio of DE candidates, from 20%.

On the deplorable state of the CBT centre, he assured the State Coordinator that all hands were on deck to ensure that all technical and administrative issues were resolved ahead of the upcoming 2026 UTME, promising that the centre would soon be adjudged the best in the State.

JIGAWA STATE COMMISSIONER FOR HIGHER EDUCATION VISITS JAMB PROFESSIONAL TEST CENTRE

The Jigawa State Commissioner for Higher Education, Prof. Isa Yusuf Chamo, on 26th February, 2026, paid an official visit to the Professional Test Centre, Jigawa State Office, to monitor the just-concluded 2026 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) registration exercise.

The Commissioner was received by the management and staff of the Board. According to the Commissioner, the visit was part of the State Government's oversight function to assess the level of compliance, efficiency, and general conduct of the registration process across accredited centres in the State.

During the inspection, Prof. Chamo interacted with candidates and

registration officials to obtain first-hand information on the registration procedures. FREE DATA FOR LEARNING: NIGERIA'S MOST URGENT DIGITAL BET

There is a moment in every generation when a country gets the chance to make a decision that reshapes the trajectory of millions of lives. Nigeria is at that moment now, and the decision is simpler than most people think.

Zero-rate educational websites. Make learning data-free. Let's do it now.

When ALTON paid me a courtesy visit recently at the NCC's Ikoyi office, I used the occasion to issue a clear charge: telecom operators must prioritise the zero-rating of credible educational platforms as a near-term, high-impact intervention. The response was encouraging. But encouragement is a starting point. What Nigeria needs is coordinated action across government, regulators, operators, and state houses across the federation.

The NCC is ready to lead. I am honoured to drive this work, but the vision we are executing belongs to President Bola Tinubu. He set the direction. Our role is to ensure every Nigerian child feels its impact.

The cost of data is the cost of a future

For a student in Katsina, Ebonyi, or Ekiti, the barrier to online learning is rarely motivation or intelligence. It is arithmetic: data costs money, and many families do not have that money. Asking a child to buy data before accessing a textbook is the digital equivalent of charging school fees at the gate of a public school. We decided long ago that was wrong. We must now make the same decision about data.

Zero-rating means this precisely: telecom operators allow users to access designated educational websites and digital libraries without those visits counting against their data balance. No subscription. No bundle. Just access.

This is not a radical idea. It is already working elsewhere.

In 2016, South Africa worked with mobile operators to zero-rate critical educational websites,

including platforms used by university students. The initiative emerged partly in response to the #FeesMustFall movement and measurably increased access to course materials among students in rural and peri-urban areas. India's experience is instructive on both sides. When Jio arrived in 2016 with aggressively low data pricing, it triggered one of the most dramatic expansions of digital learning the world has seen. Hundreds of millions of Indians who had been priced out of the internet gained access overnight; EdTech platforms like BYJU's, Unacademy, and Vedantu built entire businesses on the back of that newly connected population. When you lower the cost of access, you ignite an economy. India's telecoms regulator TRAI did, however, ban Facebook's Free Basics in 2016 precisely because it created differential access favouring particular commercial interests. Nigeria's approach differs: our proposal is publicly governed, government-led, and built on transparent criteria. That distinction matters.

Rwanda offers the most instructive African model. Its Smart Classroom Programme worked with operators to zero-rate the Rwanda Education Board's digital content in government schools, combined with teacher training and device provision. Rwanda today consistently ranks among Africa's most competitive digital economies. Connectivity and education were the foundation.

Awolowo's lesson, and a President who already understands it

A friend, responding to my public charge to ALTON, described this initiative as "Awo's free education policy in the digital age." The framing is exactly right.

Chief Obafemi Awolowo's decision to introduce free primary education in the Western Region in 1955 was opposed, debated, and dismissed as unaffordable. He pressed on. The

results were generational. The West produced a workforce that drove Nigeria's early post-independence economy and contributed disproportionately to its professional class for decades. The dividends of that single decision are still being collected today.

Zero-rating educational websites is the digital equivalent of that bet. Operators will absorb a portion of foregone revenue in the short term; comparable analyses from South Africa and Rwanda suggest this cost, when structured properly with government support, is manageable relative to the long-term subscriber base it creates. Those same young Nigerians, educated and empowered, return to those networks as paying subscribers.

This conversation did not start here, either. I remember a session we held during President Bola Tinubu's journey to Aso Villa, where he spoke with obvious pride about the free WAEC and NECO policy he had implemented in Lagos, then shared his vision for student loans: access to tertiary education should not depend on family finances. What was then a proposal is now operational. Close to 2 million students are already benefiting from NELFUND. We also spoke that day about data costs as a barrier to learning. That conversation is now policy in motion. President Tinubu's commitment to inclusive education is evidenced in the free WAEC policy, in NELFUND, and in this initiative. Free data for learning is one of the most direct ways to give the Renewed Hope Agenda practical, daily meaning.

What we are asking, and what we will do

To Nigeria's governors: in the coming weeks, I will be visiting Your Excellencies alongside Dr. Aminu Maida and other NCC board members to seek your partnership in something that can genuinely transform your states.

...Free Data for Learning: Nigeria's Most Urgent Digital Bet - By Idris Olorunnimbe

We will ask for your support in lowering entry barriers for operators deploying infrastructure in unserved communities. Right-of-Way costs are among the most significant obstacles to network expansion in Nigeria today. Where these fees are reduced or waived for deployments in low-connectivity areas, the effect is immediate. Connectivity does not only serve education; it opens commerce, attracts investment, and improves quality of life across every sector of a state's economy. With it, a boy or girl in a remote village stands beside their contemporaries in any city in the world, accessing the same lectures and opportunities. We will also count on your support to protect existing and new infrastructure. Vandalism of telecoms assets is a real and costly problem, and strong state-level enforcement is a statement about what kind of future your state is committed to building.

To Engineer Gbenga Adebayo and the ALTON membership: the alignment we have reached is a foundation to build on. We see the pressures you are managing: elevated energy costs, forex pressure on equipment imports. The ask we are making must be accompanied by reciprocal commitment from government, and

we are prepared to deliver that. The NCC will work with operators to monitor traffic impacts and ensure capacity planning in underserved areas runs parallel to zero-rating rollout. We will work with the Federal Ministry of Education, state education boards, and civil society to identify credible platforms, publish the list, and zero-rate it under a transparent governance framework with clear eligibility criteria, a published review cycle, and an open entry pathway for Nigerian EdTech companies that meet the standard. We are also aware that zero-rated domains create VPN routing incentives; the NCC will work with ALTON on a shared enforcement approach so operators do not carry that burden alone.

To civil society and the private sector: this initiative needs champions beyond government and telecoms. Nigerian EdTech companies, development finance institutions, and corporate social responsibility programmes all have a role. Adopt a platform. Fund devices for a school. Sponsor a teacher training programme. Beyond infrastructure, every state has the opportunity to build something lasting: devices in schools, Wi-Fi in public libraries, and curated local

content reflecting state languages, histories, and curricula. Zero-rated access to an empty platform helps no one. Access and content must grow together.

UNICEF and the UNESCO Institute for Statistics estimate that Nigeria has approximately 20 million out-of-school children. Millions more are in school but learning below their potential because resources that could help them sit behind a paywall called data. That is a crisis with a known, affordable solution. The question is no longer whether we can do this. The question is whether we will choose to.

As Chairman of the Nigerian Communications Commission, I will continue to push for this with every platform available. We will engage operators formally on timelines and implementation frameworks, work with education counterparts to identify the right content, track progress, and report it publicly. Accountability is not optional here.

The Awolowo generation built the future on free schools. The Tinubu generation will build it on free data. We have made our choice.
