that TRCN is one of the most critical agencies to human capacity development.

PUNCH, MONDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 2026: 2026 UTME: False Information Can Cost You Admission, JAMB Warns Candidates: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board has warned candidates against committing registration infractions or violating the attestation signed during registration. The Board's Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, gave the warning as the 2026 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination registration, which commenced on January 26, enters its third week.

Prof. Oloyede emphasised the seriousness of registration offences while speaking with media executives penultimate week, as contained in JAMB's weekly bulletin released on its website on Monday.

According to the Registrar, "Registration infraction is a serious offence, noting that candidates may be barred from sitting the UTME for up to three years. In addition, names of defaulters may be published by the Board in the national dailies as well as circulated to other public examination bodies."

Prof. Oloyede further disclosed that defaulters could also be handed over to the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission, the Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission, or the Nigerian Police for prosecution. Any attempt to falsify data, he stressed, would attract appropriate sanctions. The Registrar urged candidates to avoid providing fictitious information, warning that such actions could jeopardise their chances of gaining tertiary education.

GAZETTENGR.COM, MONDAY, FEBRUARY 9, 2026: UTME Registration Closes February 26, No Deadline Extension: JAMB: The Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board has reminded prospective candidates that registration for the 2026 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination will close on February 26. The Board advised candidates intending to sit for the examination to complete their registration immediately, stating that the deadline would not be extended under any circumstances. This is contained in the Board's weekly bulletin released on Monday.

The Board expressed concern about the low number of candidates registered at several accredited registration centres at this stage of the exercise. It said that the recurring trend of delaying registration until the last minute and then agitating for an extension would not be tolerated in 2026.

"JAMB is fully aware of the deliberate tactics of examination cheats and individuals masquerading as tutorial centre owners, who misleadingly advise candidates to delay registration until the last minute. "This strategy is often aimed at forcing an extension of the registration period, thereby enabling the mass movement of candidates to centres in groups, which facilitates examination malpractice," it said.

JAMB advised candidates to register early, avoid the last-minute rush and disregard any suggestion that the deadline would be extended. Adding that it would not be responsible for candidates who failed to act within

The Federal Government has inaugurated a ministerial implementation committee to oversee the modernisation of laboratories and enhancement of skills development in Nigerian polytechnics. The Minister of Education, Dr. Tunji Alausa, while inaugurating the committee in Abuja, said the initiative aimed to phase out obsolete equipment in the polytechnics.

Dr. Alausa said the initiative would also introduce industrial-grade engineering facilities and strengthen hands-on technical training across beneficiary institutions. He explained that the intervention, supported by the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund), would cover 37 federal and state polytechnics under the second phase of the Skills-G intervention.

According to him, the programme will provide equipment for mechatronics, robotics, renewable energy systems, advanced telecommunications, electronics and automobile engineering. "The key objective of this intervention is the modernisation of our laboratories, phasing out obsolete equipment in Nigeria polytechnics and replacing them with industrial grade engineering equipment.

"This being the second phase, the first phase was done in the year 2011 to 2012. And now we're in the second phase, we have 37 polytechnics that will benefit. Unlike the previous TETFUND intervention that focused on building, the Skill-G intervention will focus on the polytechnic laboratory ecosystem," he said.

The minister added that the reform would also ensure dual certification for polytechnic graduates, combining National Diploma (ND) or Higher National Diploma (HND) with recognised National Skills Qualification certificates.

In his remarks, the Executive Secretary of TETFund, Sonny Echono, reaffirmed the agency's commitment to funding the interventions and clarified that earlier delays were linked to ongoing contracts and new local-content requirements. He assured stakeholders of continued collaboration to improve technical and engineering education in the country.

In an interesting announcement, Mr. Raji (SAN), through the Raji Oke-Esa Foundation, instituted prizes for the best students of the Raji Oke-Esa Memorial Comprehensive High School. Also, the legal luminary in his acknowledgement of the Registrar's quantitative contributions to education and academic scholarship, named the First Prize for the overall best student of the school

as "The Prof. Oloyede Prize". In Mr. Raji's words, "the prize will cover the university education of the student." In his speech, the Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, described the CBT centre as a feat that should be seen as a, "daring testament to the generosity and vision of one of Nigeria's best legal minds and a benevolent son of the soil."

Prof. Oloyede, in his speech, detailed the incredible vision behind the

MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is **regular and non-regular**.

2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the **non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes)** to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
3. Immediately after the creation of profile, each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.
4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
5. No candidate can use the process to change any of the data already supplied to the Board.
6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the non-regular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.
7. Please be guided for compliance.

HAWKING MERCHANDISE ON DUTY: A BREACH OF WORKPLACE ETHICS

"Professional conduct sustains institutional integrity."

The workplace is designed to promote productivity, order, and administrative efficiency. However, there have been instances where the Board's environment has been converted into a marketplace by some staff and unauthorised individuals who gain illegal access to the premises. Such practices undermine the dignity of the Service and erode established standards of professionalism.

This edition of **HRM IN FOCUS** draws attention to the ethical, regulatory, and disciplinary implications of hawking merchandise or engaging in trading activities during official working hours.

Why This Practice Occurs

One of the major drivers of this inappropriate behaviour is economic hardship. In the quest for additional income or the desire to showcase entrepreneurial interests, some officers engage in hawking or trading within office premises during working hours.

While these motivations may be understandable, they do not justify actions that conflict with established rules and ethical standards of the Public Service.

Effects of Hawking Merchandise on Duty

Although it may appear harmless, hawking on duty has far-reaching consequences:

- Disruption of official duties, leading to reduced focus and efficiency
- Decline in productivity and work quality
- Missed deadlines and delayed service delivery
- Unfair workload distribution, where some officers engage in trading while others bear the burden of official tasks
- Negative impact on the image of the Service

Such practices blur the line between acceptable conduct and misconduct.

Relevant Provisions of the Public Service Rules

To address this ethical lapse, attention is drawn to the following provisions of the **Public Service Rules (PSR)**:

- **Rule 100312 (PSR):**

Officers are prohibited from hawking merchandise or engaging in any form of trading within office premises during working hours.

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...Human Resource Management in Focus

- **Rule 100301(k) (PSR):**

This improper behaviour, being inimical to the image of the Service, is classified as **misconduct**, among other related offences.

Consequences of Breaching the Rule

Hawking merchandise on duty, though seemingly minor, carries serious consequences:

- Upon investigation and proof, an officer's appointment may be **terminated** in line with **Rule 100301 (PSR)**.

Officers are therefore advised not to trivialize actions that constitute misconduct under the Rules.

Implications for Unauthorized Individuals (Non-Staff)

Unauthorised persons found hawking merchandise within the premises of the Board may face:

- Seizure or loss of hawked items
- Harassment and removal from the premises
- Arrest and prosecution by relevant authorities

The Board does not condone illegal access or trading within its facilities.

Final Word

Professionalism remains the cornerstone of an effective Public Service. Officers are strongly advised to familiarise themselves with the relevant provisions of the Public Service Rules and adhere strictly to them. Maintaining focus on official responsibilities and upholding ethical standards must remain a guiding principle in the workplace.

Tip for the Week

"To know what is right and not do it is the worst cowardice."

Ethical conduct is not optional; it is a duty. When officers respect workplace rules and prioritize their assignments, they contribute to a disciplined, productive, and respected Service. Let us collectively uphold the values that define professionalism and institutional integrity.

ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR PROCESSING OF (DEGREE) ADMISSION FOR AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS

In 2022, the Board proposed that universities should take full responsibility for admissions into all degree programmes offered through institutions affiliated with them. However, this directive was not fully implemented, as universities were initially given the liberty to decide on the matter, pending a final resolution. To date, only the University of Ibadan has assumed this role of overseeing and coordinating the admissions of its affiliate institutions.

2. Following the meeting held on Monday, 18th August 2025, with various institutions regarding violations of matriculation guidelines, concerns were raised about the existing admission processing structure. Notably, institutions complained that they could not be held accountable for the misdemeanors of their affiliates under the existing processing format. As a result of this, the matter was revisited.

3. Consequently, it was resolved that the previously proposed process, where Mother-Institutions take responsibility for admissions into their affiliated institutions, should now be adopted and implemented by all universities with affiliates.

4. In light of the above, the Board has developed an updated procedure for the processing of admissions by both Mother-Institutions and their affiliates, as follows:

- a. Head of the affiliated-institution logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and downloads candidates for a particular programme;
- b. The Head of the Affiliated-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into JAMB (CAPS) portal and sets admissions criteria for every programme, such as minimum scores for UTME, post UTME, aggregate, catchment and ELDS;
- c. The Head of the affiliated institution proposes the qualified candidates for each programme on CAPS and it goes to the Head of the mother-institution;
- d. The Head of the Mother-Institution (wherever it is based) logs into the JAMB (CAPS) portal and recommends the candidate to the Registrar of JAMB (or representative) for approval or declines the proposal with a reason for the rejection;
- e. The Registrar of JAMB (or representative) approves the recommendation(s) from the Head of the Mother-Institution or declines the recommendation with a reason for the rejection;

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- f. If the recommendation is approved, the candidate is notified through his/her email and SMS to either accept or reject the offer of admission. The two institutions can log in and view the status of the recommended candidates;
- g. If the candidate accepts the offer of admission, he/she can thereafter print his/her admission letter and access other services online from his/her profile.

NOTE: *The Head of an Affiliated-Institution has access to “VIEW ONLY” all recommendations by the Head of a Mother-Institution.*

5. All Universities serving as Mother-institutions, Polytechnics/Monotechnics, Colleges of Education and other institutes offering degrees in affiliation with universities are to be guided by this, please.

FOR ALL FEDERAL GOVERNMENT REVENUE TRANSACTIONS**


The Board is in receipt of a circular dated **24th November, 2025** from the Office of the Accountant-General of the Federation on the enforcement of the "**No Physical Cash Receipt Policy for all Federal Government Revenue Transactions**", as stipulated in extant circulars referenced **OAGF/CAD/026/VOL.11/465-TRY/A8&B8/2008**, **OAGF/CAD/026/V.1/253-TRY/A1&B1/2015** and **OAGF/CAD/026/VOL.11/354-TRY/A9&B9/2015**, dated **22nd October, 2008**, **19th March, 2015** and **29th October, 2015** respectively.

This circular is hereby reiterated in line with existing Financial Regulations, which are aimed at promoting transparency, accountability, operational efficiency, and the reduction of revenue leakages across Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs). Consequently, and in accordance with the Board's existing policy framework, any transaction conducted outside approved non-cash channels shall be regarded as a violation of government financial rules and may attract appropriate disciplinary action.

Accordingly, and by way of further emphasis, no staff member is authorised to receive, handle, or process physical cash in respect of any of the Board's transactions. All payments and revenue collections shall be conducted strictly through approved electronic channels, including but not limited to designated government payment platforms and other officially authorised non-cash payment systems.

All staff and relevant stakeholders are therefore enjoined to take due note of this directive, ensure strict compliance in all finance-related activities with the Board, and promptly report any challenges or attempted violations through appropriate channels.

1.0 2026 UTME/DE APPLICATION

- 1.1 Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for admission into Tertiary Institutions in Nigeria for the 2026/27 Academic Session.
- 1.2 Only Candidates who will not be less than 16 years old by 30th September, 2026 are generally eligible to apply/ be considered.
- 1.3 All candidates will be required to sit for the UTME/DE examination in September, 2026 will have to undergo an intensive evaluation to determine their eligibility for a waiver. Such must have scored not less than 80% in each of UTME/ ALEVEL, PUTME, SSCE and in the exceptional candidate assessment.
- 1.4 The UTME results of the underage candidates will be released only at the conclusion of the complete evaluation process.
- 1.5 Once a candidate completes 2026 registration with biodata supplied by NIM, subsequent changes to biodata would not be effected by JAMB for the 2026/27. NO CHANGE WILL BE MADE.
- 1.6 RE-QUERY FOR 2026 CHANGES IN PREVIOUS RECORDS IN NIM WILL ONLY BE UPDATED ON EXISTING JAMB RECORDS ONLY IF THE AFFECTED CANDIDATES GO THROUGH A PROCESS OF RE-QUERY TO RETRIEVE THE UPDATED DATA THROUGH TEMP. 007 DURING 2026 REGISTRATION. HOWEVER, REPLACED DATA SHALL BE TRACKED AND EVER REFLECTED AS FOOTNOTES ON THE CANDIDATES' PROFILES AND ALL SLIPS.

1.5 FEES AND CHARGES

- 1.5.1 Board will maintain its costless registration system for the 2026 UTME/DE registration in order to prevent the exploitation of candidates. AS A RESULT, THE CENTRALIZED COLLECTION OF ALL THIRD-PARTY FEES WILL CONTINUE WITH REMITTANCES MADE TO BENEFICIARIES ON WEEKLY BASIS.
- 1.5.2 THERE WILL BE 3 CATEGORIES OF E-PINS: DIRECT ENTRY (N5,700); UTME ONLY WITHOUT MOCK (N7,200); UTME WITH MOCK (N8,700). THE DETAILS ARE AS FOLLOWS: UTME/DE JAMB APPLICATION FEE - N3,500; READING TEST - N1,000; CBT CENTRE REGISTRATION SERVICE CHARGE - N700; CBT CENTRE SERVICE CHARGE - N1,500; BANK CHARGES - N500; CBT MOCK-UTME CENTRE CHARGE - N1,500.
- 1.5.3 CANDIDATES ARE TO SPECIFY THE TYPE OF E-PIN REQUIRED AT THE POINT OF PURCHASE AS NO REFUND WOULD BE MADE.

2.0 BIOMETRIC INTEGRITY, IMAGE CAPTURE AND ANTI-IMPERSONATION WARNING

- 2.1 Candidates are advised to ensure that only their own ten (10) fingers are captured individually and correctly at the CBT Centre.
- 2.2 MULTIPLE NIN USAGE AND DOUBLE REGISTRATION

The use of multiple National Identification Numbers (NINs) by a single candidate for the purpose of double registration, impersonation, or any form of identity manipulation is strictly prohibited and will be severely sanctioned.

3.0 REGISTRATION PERIODS

- 3.1 The period of registration for UTME candidates, including those from foreign countries, is from **Monday, 26th January, 2026 to Saturday, 28th February, 2026**. (Candidates are to have valid, functional and accessible personal e-mail addresses before commencing the process of registration).
- 3.2 E-PIN vending for UTME begins on **Monday, 19th January, 2026, and ends on Thursday, 26th February, 2026**, while registration closes on **Saturday, 28th February, 2026**.
- 3.3 Sale of 2026 Direct Entry (DE) application documents and E-PIN vending would commence from **Monday, 2nd March, 2026 and end by Saturday, 25th April, 2026** and would only be at the Board's State and Zonal Offices.

4.0 GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 4.1 MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR 100 LEVEL DEGREE / ND / NCE (UTME)
DEGREE: Minimum of five (5) credit passes in English and other relevant subjects obtained in not more than 2 sittings. Mathematics is mandatory for Science, Technology and Social Science Programmes.

NIN: Minimum of four (4) credit passes in relevant subjects, including English for non-science and Mathematics for science programmes.

4.2 DIRECT ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 4.2.1 A minimum of five (5) SSCE (O'level) credit passes at not more than two sittings, at least two of which must be at the Principal or Advanced level. Other acceptable qualifications in lieu of ALEVELs are:
First Degree (Nigerian Universities), University Diploma, National Diploma (henceforth the Certificate to be accepted for up to only 2024 intake), National Diploma in Technical, Polytechnic Diploma, Higher National Diploma, NCE, A-Level Certificate from JAMB, JUPEB, NABTEB (ANBC), NABTEB (ANTC), First Degree (Other Countries Universities), Cambridge A-level, International Baccalaureate (foreign certificates only), Foreign GCE A-level, Trans-national Foundation Certificates AWARDING INSTITUTIONS ARE REQUIRED TO FORWARD VERIFICATION TO JAMB BEFORE REGISTRATION CAN BE COMPLETED.
- 4.2.2 Candidates are advised to pre-verify their DE qualification before completing their DE registration.

- 4.2.3 At the point of registration, all DE candidates must provide the following information:
 - a) Registration/Matriculation Number of the previous school attended where the qualification was obtained;
 - b) Subject(s) of qualification;
 - c) Awarding Institution;
 - d) Affiliated Institution actually attended (where applicable);
 - e) Year of graduation

4.2.4 OTHER VITAL DE REGISTRATION AND ADMISSION RULES

- 4.2.5 DE candidates, who are not awaiting results, must have uploaded their A-level qualifications, O-level results and DE Registration forms at the time of registration. No candidate is allowed to register or upgrade to DE with awaiting result status of O-level at the point of registration.
- 4.2.6 DE candidates will not be processed for admission until such claimed results are uploaded and verified by the awarding institutions on JAMB eFacility platform.
- 4.2.7 A DE candidate, who at the point of registration is awaiting A-level results of JAMB / JUPEB / NABTEB, must have uploaded his/ her DE Registration form at the time of registration.
- 4.2.8 Applicants with pre-2020 Cambridge certificates should visit Cambridge directly for verification. This verification exercise may take up to 28 days (as specified by the awarding body), after which the verification result will be forwarded to the Board. The verification will be reflected in the e-Facility profile of the DE candidate.
- 4.2.9 Statement of results (in lieu of certificate) is accepted for registration only within 3 years of the date of award except NCE that is one year.
- 4.2.10 Upgrade from UTME to DE is available only to candidates, whose A-level results have not been released at the point of UTME registration and who must have indicated at the point of registration that he/she is awaiting A-level results. The particulars of which he/she must have supplied and contained in the uploaded registration template.
- 4.2.11 Candidates are hereby advised to constantly check their A' level results in their A' level facility profiles, where it will show the status of verification by NIPEDS, indicating "Cleared" or "NOT CLEARED" with the reason(s) for non-clearance.

4.3 ADDITIONAL VITAL REGISTRATION RULES

- 4.3.1 Candidates are not permitted to register more than once. In the event of any error during the registration process, such candidates are to seek correction from the Board and not to obtain a fresh application, as duplication of application violates one of the applications.
- 4.3.2 Registration can be done at JAMB approved centres across the country. Any candidate who registers outside the approved centres does so at his/her own risk. List and addresses of approved CBT centres are on the official website of the board (www.jamb.gov.ng).
- 4.3.3 Non-candidates, including parents/guardians or any proxy, are NOT allowed to transact any business on any candidate's profile. Any candidate who makes his password, profile code or other security

codes available to another person (parents, friends, tutorial teachers, fraudsters etc.) is liable for any alteration done by such other persons).

4.3.4 COMPULSORY DISCLOSURE OF PREVIOUS ADMISSION STATUS

Candidates are henceforth required to disclose their admission details with the Board at the point of registration. Any false or non-declaration of previous registration/matriculation will automatically invalidate the candidate's registration/previous admission.

Having been previously admitted (matriculated) and wishing to change or start afresh in another institution programme is allowed, however, failure to disclose such prior admission is an offence.

4.4 ORDER OF CHOICE OF INSTITUTIONS

Every candidate is to note that his/her 1st choice can be any of the institutions that is, College of Education, University, Polytechnic/Monotechnic, Nigerian Defence Academy or Police Academy.

5.0 STEP BY STEP (PROCEDURE) FOR THE PURCHASE OF 2026 UTME/DE REGISTRATION DOCUMENTS

5.1 CREATION OF PROFILE

A. Every candidate would require the use of a unique phone (mobile) number (SIM) for the process of registration. The unique phone number can be used by one candidate only. (Note: This number (SIM) remains your unique identification for all your transactions with the Board for present and future transactions/applications).

B. Candidates who procure SIMs only for registration with JAMB (and not in use) are advised to take advantage of and use the **Keep My Number (KMN)** facility offered by their respective Telcos. This feature keeps the SIM alive even if unused by the candidate. This feature is available for all candidates except those who have been issued with the KMN for the candidate for an initial period of 3 years, which is also renewable annually.

C. Candidate will send his/her **National Identification Number (NIN)** by text (SMS) to either 55019 or 66019 from his/her personal GSM number. For instance, write the word "NIN" then space and add your 11-digit NIN Number and send to 55019 or 66019 in this format (NIN0023456789). There should be a space between the word "NIN" and your 11-digit NIN (Note that the number must not have been used by another person to register for UTME/DE in the past). Do not use **Particulars or special bundle package lines**. The NIN must be unique, especially with respect to the profile.

D. A Profile Code of 10 characters will be received by the candidate on the same telephone (SIM) number. Returning Candidates for previous years will still receive same profile code on the same number previously used. Note that the profile remains the same for the candidate for present and future applications with the Board.

E. CANDIDATES SHOULD NOTE AND ALWAYS REMEMBER THEIR E-MAIL ADDRESSES AND PHONE (SIM)-NUMBER USED. IT IS OF UTMOST IMPORTANCE FOR SUBSEQUENT COMMUNICATION WITH THE BOARD

BY OBTAINING UTME APPLICATION DOCUMENTS, A CANDIDATE HAS ACCEPTED TO RECEIVE TEXT MESSAGES FROM JAMB (55019 or 66019) EVEN WHEN THE "DO NOT DISTURB" (DND) IS ACTIVATED

F. JAMB does not entertain any request for change of SIM number after profile creation.

G. Candidate will present the profile code at the point of procurement of application document from Banks, M&Ms, MFBs, Switches, USDS Partners). An E-PIN is then sent as text message to the candidate's mobile number.

H. Candidates will present the Profile code and e-PIN at any JAMB accredited CBT Centre for registration.

I. The application cannot be completed until the candidate's biometrics (all ten fingers) are captured and photograph taken physically (No submission of passport photograph). Successful capture of biometrics and photograph will authorise a candidate to print his/her e-registration slip. (Candidate must use at least two fingers; any of the two can be used to print his/her registration slip. The fingerprint verification shall be required for only one finger of the candidate's profile).

GROUP / SCHOOL BASED REGISTRATION OF CANDIDATES IS NOT ALLOWED/MOST CANDIDATES REGRET IT THEREAFTER.

J. Only candidates, whose biometric verification is successful on examination day would be permitted to sit the UTME or Mock.

K. Candidates with peculiar biometric challenges can only register at JAMB National and State Offices. Arrangements would be made for this through JAMB State Offices.

5.2 RETRIEVAL (IN CASE OF MISTAKE / LOSS) OF PROFILE CODE AND SELF-SERVICE

a. To retrieve a lost Profile Code, send the word [RESEND] from the same mobile number to 55019 or 66019 as a text message.

b. Candidates can lost, lost or forgotten Profile Password on their registered cell phone number by sending the word "PASSWORD" space [the email address] from the same mobile number as a text message to 55019 or 66019.

5.3 TICKETING (FREE COMPLAINTS)

For ALL complaints on JAMB processes including NIN and Profile Code retrieval, candidates should create a support ticket at <https://www.jamb.gov.ng> by selecting the Quicklinks, and then **Ticket Support with his/her e-mail address** with the Board. The candidate then provides his/her name, phone number as well as the nature of the complaint, and selects a complaint area on a drop-down and then summarises the nature of the complaint. He/she should also attach supporting documents (if available).

COMPLAINTS FROM 3RD PARTIES ARE MERELY NOTED AS WE DO NOT DISCUSS COMPLAINTS FROM 3RD PARTIES. RATHER, OTHERS WRITING LETTERS ARE NOT NECESSARY, RATHER, ALL COMPLAINTS SHOULD BE CHANNELLED THROUGH THE ONLINE TICKETING SYSTEM FOR PROMPT ATTENTION AND DOCUMENTATION

5.4 JAMB e-PIN SELLING POINTS

The e-PIN outlets are:
NIPOST, Banks, M&Ms, MFBs and other participating financial institutions.

5.5 DIRECTORS / PARTICIPATING BANKS / OUTLETS

Participating financial outlets are responsible for collecting the profile code directly from the candidate's phone, collect payment and vend the e-PIN electronically via SMS (no dictating or copying the code), facilitate payment through a POS system and provide evidence of payment.

5.6 STEPS FOR PAYMENT

(a) Present Profile Code and pay one of N5,700 (DE); N7,200 (UTME WITHOUT MOCK) and N8,700 (UTME WITH MOCK).

(b) The e-PIN is then delivered to the candidate's unique telephone number.

5.7 PROCEDURE FOR REGISTRATION AT THE 10 FOREIGN CENTRES:

The Board conducts registration and UTME in the following cities: Abidjan, Accra, Banjul, Beau, Cotonou, Jeddah, Johannesburg, London, Malabo, and Ouagadougou. The Nigerian Mission (Embassies) in each of the cities (countries) can be contacted for guidance on the registration process.

5.8 Registration fee for candidates from the 10 foreign countries is Thirty United States Dollars (\$30) in each of the 10 (ten) countries or its local equivalent.

5.9 DONATION OF FREE APPLICATION DOCUMENTS

5.10 HOW TO RECOVER LOST e-PIN AFTER PAYMENT

- a. If e-PIN is not Received or Lost, send [UTMEPIN] from the unique number to 55019 or 66019 for UTME respectively.
- b. The e-PIN would then be retrieved and delivered to the candidate's unique phone number.

AFTER SUCCESSFUL PAYMENT AND OBTAINING e-PIN, CANDIDATE SHOULD PRESENT IT TO ANY OF THE JAMB-ACCREDITED CBT CENTRE TO COMPLETE HIS/HER REGISTRATION.

5.10 REGISTRATION CENTRES

- a. Registration is carried out only at the accredited Computer-Based Test (CBT) Centres.
- b. Each candidate should visit any accredited CBT centre (the list of accredited centres is on the Board's website (<https://www.jamb.gov.ng> and JAMB offices), with his/her profile code and e-PIN).

5.11 LIVE STREAMING OF REGISTRATION AT CBT CENTRES

All centres participating in the 2026 registration exercise must be monitored live from the headquarters. Any centre whose registration activities are not viewed from the headquarters will not be paid, and such registration may be invalidated.

5.12 CONCLUDING THE REGISTRATION PROCESS AT CBT CENTRES:

A candidate must PERSONALLY present his/her Profile Code and e-PIN at any JAMB accredited CBT Centre for registration. A candidate's photograph and biometrics (all the ten fingerprints) would be captured at the CBT centre.

5.12.1 Candidates are to:

- a. Note that Centre and bank charges of N700/ N500 respectively have been included in the total fee paid for the pin which JAMB remits to the centres, therefore, no other fee should be paid at the centre.
- b. Provide valid and functional personal e-mail address that the candidate can always access.
- c. Provide qualification with grades and dates (if not awaiting results).
- d. Upload relevant certificates.
- e. Provide choice of institutions, course of study (programme), UTME subjects and choice of examination town(s) for the optional Mock examination and Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) (actual examination).
- f. Review entries and confirm correctness, and
- g. Print Registration Slip USING BIOMETRIC AUTHENTICATION to confirm valid fingerprint (UTME/DE). Note that authentication with your fingerprint removes blames of error from CBT centres. Candidates are to check before confirming with their fingerprint.

5.12.2 Candidates, who are awaiting results, should supply (upload) the results of all other JAMB papers as soon as they are available. No recommendations from the Institute will be considered by JAMB if the candidate does not upload his/her result on the portal of JAMB. No institution is allowed to take a new picture/photograph, biometrics or require any other upload of result. All results are downloadable by institutions from the Board's website (and the download is tracked to avoid abuse).

5.12.3 Candidates are to note that their particulars on their NIN should tally with information on their supporting documents.

5.13.1 JAMB DISABILITY

To ensure inclusivity, the following categories of candidates are to indicate their disability for special attention:
5.13.1 BLIND / MUTED (DEAF) CANDIDATES
Candidates who are blind are to indicate by selecting BLIND from the dropdown options and also pick the closest designated JEOG centre and preferred mode of examination. A specific indicator for the deaf/mute has been created to identify them for special attention during the examination.
To promote inclusivity, the Board fully refunds registration fees to the blind, the deaf and those on wheel chairs who possess the required 5 credits at the point of registration.

5.13.2 OTHERS

Candidates with Albinism, Down Syndrome, Autism, Dyslexia and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) Amputees, Lame, Paralysed Cerebral Palsy, Dismalness, are to indicate by clicking on the appropriate box set as to be identified and assigned to the JAMB Equal Opportunity Group (EOG) for special attention.

5.14 BIOMETRIC CHALLENGES

- a. No candidate will be allowed to enter the examination hall or sit the examination if their biometrics is not verified.
- b. Candidates with biometric abnormalities can only register and take examination at the Abuja Headquarters of the Board. The Board will facilitate their travels.

6.0 DATES FOR THE 2026 UNIFIED TERTIARY MATRICULATION EXAMINATION

6.1 The 2026 UTME will commence on Thursday, 16th April, 2026 and end on Saturday, 25th April, 2026.

6.2 The venue of the examination will be at **ANY** centre in the candidate's chosen examination town.

JAMB DOES NOT POST ANY CANDIDATE TO ANY EXAMINATION TOWN (OR GROUP OF TOWNS) OTHER THAN THE ONE CHOSEN BY THE CANDIDATE AT THE POINT OF REGISTRATION. REGISTER ON TIME SINCE YOUR PREFERRED TOWN MAY NO LONGER HAVE SPACE FOR YOU. NOTE THAT THE CHOICE OF A GROUP OF TOWNS IMPLIES THAT YOU CAN BE POSTED TO ANY OF THE TOWNS IN THE CHOSEN GROUP.

7.0 REGISTRATION FEE/ PROCUREMENT OF REGISTRATION e-PINs

7.1 Candidates should note that their e-PINS purchased are tied to individual candidates and are not transferable.

7.2 Candidates are advised to keep their e-PINs confidential their security details such as registration numbers, password/ numbers of ATM cards, email addresses and e-PINs. No centre is allowed to request or accept a candidate's password.

8.0 OPTIONAL MOCK-UTME

8.1 OPTIONAL MOCK-UTME (optional) shall hold on Saturday, March 28th 2026.

9.0 GENERAL INFORMATION

9.1 The registration fee is non-refundable.

9.2 Candidates are advised to read and understand the various guidelines on admission as well as the set of instructions shown on the scan QR Code on how to complete the online registration before commencing the process of registration. He or she is also to sign an indemnity on ethical standards.

9.3 Candidates are to note that irrespective of their choice of programme, they will also be tested on a general text: "The Lekki Headmaster" by Abdul Alabi Garba. All Candidates are also expected to read the text.

9.4 Candidates/Officials would not be allowed to enter the examination centre with earphones, wristwatches, mobile phones, electronic devices, or any pen/biro. Only pencils are allowed.

9.5 Candidates are warned that the Board does not require nor authorise the services of ANY cybercafe, school or establishment other than its accredited CBT centres for this exercise.

9.6 Examination misconduct is a criminal offence and attracts, in addition to the cancellation of results, disqualification of names and prosecution of such offenders. Candidates are to ensure they read and endorse the "Attestation Clause" on the registration portal.

9.7 NO REGULARISATION OF ILLEGAL ADMISSION

10.0 PROCEDURE FOR VALID ADMSSION

10.1 Admission offered by institutions MUST be from JAMB and only printed on the official letter of admission from any tertiary institution without JAMB. Admission letter is illegal and irredeemably null and void. Any candidate, who accepts admission outside CAPS does so at his/her own risk as the Board would neither recognise such admissions nor condone it.

Quoting from the Holy Quran, Prof. Oloyede said Allah stated that fasting is enjoined upon believers in Surah Al-Baqarah (2), Verse 183, where the Almighty Allah says: "O you who have believed, decreed upon you is fasting as it was decreed upon those before you that you may become righteous." Furthermore, he cited Verse 184, where the Almighty Allah says "...And upon those who are able [to fast, but with hardship] - a ransom [as substitute] of feeding a poor person [each day]. But whoever volunteers to do good, it is better for him; and to fast is best for you, if you only knew."

He, therefore, noted that the

Almighty Allah has expressly enjoined fasting on Muslims for them to increase in piety. Explaining further, the erudite scholar said if the purpose of fasting by a muslim is material, then the reward of such a person is only here on Earth, but if the purpose is aimed at seeking the face of Allah, then his rewards will manifest abundantly for him in the Hereafter.

On charity, Prof. Oloyede cited Surah Al-Hadid (57:18), where Allah mentions that charitable men and women who give a "good loan" (charity) will have their reward multiplied.."

He urged Muslims to also shun other unwholesome acts that are capable of negating fasting to include

backbiting, gossiping and lying, among others.

In his goodwill message at the event, Emir of Bwari, Alh.
