he management of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) led by the Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede has restated its commitment to enhancing the welfare of the staff of the Board. It is, therefore, in line with this philosophy that the Board met with the management of the Federal Housing Authority (FHA) to procure some of the houses being built by the agency in Bwari.

In pursuit of this goal, the leadership of the two

agencies on Wednesday, 30th August, 2023, opened talks at the FHA Headquarters, Abuja, on how the staff of the Board would benefit from the ongoing Bwari Mass Housing (BMH) project.

The Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, accompanied by some members of management and the leadership of the Board's two trade unions, namely: Non Academic staff union(NASU) and Association of Senior Civil Servants of Nigeria(ASCSN), had expressed the desire of the Board to assist interested staff to acquire affordable houses of their own.

## SUDAN CRISIS: JAMB ASSURES OVER 700 RETURNEE STUDENTS OF ABSORPTION

## ...Warns Against Sharp Practices

he Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) has, once again, reiterated its commitment to the task of ensuring that all the over 700 returnee students from war-torn Sudan, who are seeking admissions into Nigerian universities, are absorbed.

The Registrar gave this assurance during a meeting with representatives of the Association of Concerned Parents of Nigerian Student Returnees from Sudan (ACPNSRS) on Wednesday, 30th August, 2023, at Registrar's Liaison Office, Federal Secretariat, Abuja.

According to him, as the nation's admission clearing house, the Board would do all that is necessary to ensure that these returnee students who have requisite qualifications are accommodated withing the Nigerian education system. He also called on the

he Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), has called on prospective candidates to brace up for the grand unveiling of the revolutionary "Bring Your Own Device" (BYOD) initiative.

It would be recalled that this novel initiative was unveiled on 24th June, 2023, at the 2023 Policy Meeting in Abuja, where the Registrar, Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, disclosed that going forward,

prospective Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) candidates would be allowed to bring their own devices to the examination halls for the purpose of taking the UTME.

According to the Head, Public Affairs and Protocol, Dr. Fabian Benjamin, in an interaction with JAMBulletin on Friday, 1st September, 2023, at the Board's National Headquarters, Bwari, Abuja, he called on

Association to ensure that all the affected students possess authentic certificates as the Board would not condone any sharp practices in the nation's admission value chain.

The Registrar, while reassuring the forum of the Board's full support, expressed the resolve of its management to integrate the returnees to universities of their choice. He urged the parents to take cognisance of the various advisories on procedures for applying for foreign inter-university transfers for old students, to mention but a few.

Prof. Oloyede pointed out that the advisories were follow-up to the series of high-level consultations with the Federal Ministry of Education, National Universities Commission(NUC) and other critical agencies of government, Vice Chancellors of Nigerian universities and other stakeholders on the issue of re-absorption of returnee students, who are caught up by civil strifes in foreign lands.

He noted that, as part of the Board's determination to ensure the absorption of these returnee students, the Board's Integrated Brochure and Syllabus System(IBASS), had been adjusted

to accommodate the peculiarities of these returnees. He added that any student, who has neither completed the university transfer form nor follow all the guidelines that have been made available to them will not be captured by IBASS.

Furthermore, he explained that any admission done outside CAPS would not be condoned by the Board and would pose serious problems for such students in the long run. He, therefore, enjoined the parents to follow due process at all times.

Earlier, the spokesperson of the forum, Hajia Asmau Yerima, commended the Board for honoring their request for a meeting. She then outlined the reasons for the meeting, which, according to her, included but not limited to, the issue of rejected application of their wards by some universities.

Going forward, Hajia Yerima appealed to the Board to make available a dedicated window where returnee students would be able to make changes in their choices of institutions at any CBT centre.

In addition, she also sought special waiver for 100L students, who had left the country before the 2023 UTME was conducted adding that, in most cases, theydo not have any transcripts from their previous universities to present. She also mentioned the reason of inadequate quota cited by some institutions as an excuse for not admitting their wards.

Consequently, the forum sought clarification as to who was in charge of approving admissions between JAMB and the universities. She stated that other stumbling blocks in the paths of returnee students included the various stringent entry requirements put in place by some institutions, as well as the charging of exhobitant fees, among others.

Hajia Yerima also raised the issue of the inability of returnee students to receive relevant acknowledgment and notifications at a point in time, stating, however, that the problem has been resolved by JAMB.

Highlights of the meeting was the presentation of an award of excellence to the Registrar, Prof. Ishaq O. Oloyede, for his landmark achievements in JAMB, the education sector and his unwavering support for the reintegration of returnee students into the Nigerian educational system.

site facilities at the Bwari Mass Housing Estate, the General Manager, Property Management, ESV., Ibrahim Dang, said the Estate is on 254 hectares of land, with the first phase of the project on 32 hectares, and is billed to have 312 units of 2-Bedroom and 3-Bedroom flats along with 3-Bedroom Terraces out of a total of 724 units.

He disclosed that the payment

could either be full payment at once or staggered in three instalments of 40% at first, then another 40% after eight weeks and the balance of 20% after six weeks.

He said the flats are to be sold for N17,500,000 (2-Bedroom); N20,500,000 (3-Bedroom) while 3-Bedroom Terraces attract N29,000,000.

The estate is built to provide the

occupants with a serene environment, which guarantees good neighbourliness; collective security, while proximity and accessibility to the city centre through the rail station makes it a good investment for the future.

# EKITI STATE GOVERNMENT PLEDGES SUPPORT FOR JAMB

n its resolve to minimize incidences of perennial registration errors, occasioned by ignorance and overzealousness of candidates, the Ekiti State Office of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), has proposed advocacy visits to selected schools across the State to sensitise prospective Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) candidates ahead of the 2024 registration in order to enlighten them on the avoidable mistakes that could negatively impact their applications.

This development was disclosed by the Ekiti State Coordinator of the Board, Mr. Hassan Lawal, on Monday 28th August, 2023, when he led a delegation of JAMB officials on a courtesy visit to the Office of the Secretary to the Ekiti State Government, Dr. Habibat Omolara Adubiaro, in Ado-Ekiti.

Soliciting a robust synergy between the Board and the State Government on the development, Mr. Lawal said that such advocacy would quide the candidates against making similar mistakes as their predecessors, stressing that some of such mistakes are not amenable to correction adding that a stitch in time, saves nine.

Highlighting some of these problems, the State Coordinator explained that they stemmed out of inconsistencies noted in their subjects combination, arrangement of names, incorrect date of birth, correction of state of origin/local government, among others

To curb the problem, Mr. Lawal proposed an enlightenment programme for prospective UTME candidates in the three senatorial districts of the State, focusing on students in Senior Secondary Schools. Similarly, the State Coordinator admonished the State Government to embrace an annual recognition of top 10 candidates from Ekiti State in the UTME to encourage hard work and healthy competition among secondary school students.

In his remarks, the Head, Matriculations Unit, Mr. Ganiyu Ishola, encouraged the State Government to build Computer-Based Testing (CBT) centres in not less than three major towns across the three senatorial districts of the State to decongest the state capital during UTME registration and main examination.

Responding, the SSG welcomed the initiative and affirmed that the State Government would leverage on the platform to further consolidate on the existing plans to improve academic excellence within the State.

She assured the delegation of the State's readiness to support the Board in its operational processes for enhanced service delivery.

Accompanying the State Coordinator to the Office of the SSG were: the Ekiti State Office Accountant, Mrs. Adedoyin Oragbade, the Head, Matriculations Unit, Mr. Ganiyu Ishola, and the Head, SERVICOM and Public Relations Officer, Mr. Abdulrasaq Olarenwaju Bhadmus.

## FCE, ABEOKUTA, TO COMMENCE DUAL MODE CERTIFICATION - PROVOST

call has gone to all affiliate institutions to adhere to all the guidelines of the Board regarding admissions. This was contained in the address of the Ogun State Coordinator, Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Mr. Hakeem AbdulHameed, who, on Wednesday, 30th August, 2023, paid a courtesy call on the Provost of the Federal College of Education, Osiele, Abeokuta.

According to the State Coordinator, affiliate institutions have to put measures in place to ensure that none of their functionaries engage in any form of sharp practices or infractions that could tarnish the image of the institution.

During the visit, Mr. AbdulHameed reiterated that admitting students outside CAPS is an infraction and should be discountenanced. He, therefore, urged the institution to ensure that all her Sandwich and Part Time students register at any nearby Board's Office for their Direct Entry applications.

Mr. AbdulHakeem further clarified that, those students, who were admitted prior to 2017 without recourse to the Board's rules and regulations, must also register to be given retroactive admission letters as he also urged them to note that the Board had since ceased the condonement of such admissions.

In his response, the Provost of the college, Dr. Rafiu Soyele, revealed that the institution would soon commence a dual-mode certification process (combination of National Certificate in Education and Bachelor of Education). According to him, admission is a fundamental assignment and assure the Board of the institution's readiness to abide by the guidelines

of the Board in that respect.

The Provost, who also doubles as the Chief External Examiner of the Board in the State, also used the opportunity of the visit to solicit more support and guidance from the State Coordinator.

Furthermore, the Director, Centre for Undergraduate Programmes (CUDEP), Dr. Temitayo revealed that all the college's admissions are done on CAPS by the mother institution, University of Ibadan, adding that the centre does not do anything without the approval of the mother institution.

The State Coordinator further assured the authorities of the institution that his doors are always open and in demonstration of that, he asked the college to nominate a representative to understudy the Board's officials as they render various services to candidates.

#### Nigeria Post-secondary Education Data System (NIPEDS)

Following the enormity of the challenges associated with the A 'level qualifications and stakeholders determined efforts to address them, an A 'level bank was instituted under the chairmanship of the former Vice-Chancellor of Bayero University, Kano, Prof Muhammad Yahuza Bello. The Data Bank has now been renamed "Nigeria Post-secondary Education Data System (NIPEDS)".

The conversion to NIPEDS is to streamline the functions of the A 'level bank in line with international standard thereby bringing total sanity to the entire process of A 'level qualifications that has been fraudulently manipulated by some candidates to gain undue advantage in securing admission into Year Two of the University Degree programmes.

## ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR EMERGENCY TRANSFER OF RETURNEE NIGERIAN STUDENTS INTO NIGERIAN UNIVERSITY SYSTEM IN TIME OF CRISIS

Please find below the procedure for processing transfer of Returnee Nigerian Students into Nigerian University system in time of crisis:

- A prospective student travelling abroad for undergraduate studies normally registers (document his/her travel) with the Federal Ministry of Education (FME) and obtains a Document ID. It is called "Notification to Study Abroad". In case of crises such registration becomes helpful.
- 2. Anyone who did not but has now become a returnee who is desirous of transfer into a Nigerian University must do a retroactive registration with the Federal Ministry of Education as follows:
  - Go to FME website www.education.gov.ng
  - Go to attestation of academic documents or <a href="http://.ess.education.gov.ng">http://.ess.education.gov.ng</a>
  - Tick the certificates you want to evaluate (Tick your highest qualification in Nigeria to enable you pick a date)
  - Pick a date
  - Make payment via remittal RRR code
  - Print Appointment Slip
  - Go to FME Revenue Unit 2nd floor

  - d. Sworn Affidavit (confirming the genuineness of information supplied and that insincere or false information shall lead to withdrawal from studies and/or of certificates (in the event of issuance). Prosecution may also follow.
- 7. Returnee Student clicks SUBMIT button, which now sends an email to intended University of Choice for Request for Application to Apply for Inter-University Transfer.

- 8. Notification page for successful request is loaded and presented on the screen by IBASS System.
- 9. Returnee Student gets a notification email and SMS for his/her application request sent to the intended University of Choice.
- 10. Student's University of Choice gets an IBASS mail of the Student's <u>Request for Application to Apply for Inter-University Transfer</u>
- 11. Intended University evaluates Student's credentials for possible consideration.
- 12. If the Intended University of Choice is satisfied/unsatisfied with the credentials presented by the Returnee Student, a notification is sent on <a href="JAMB-IBASS-mail-for-Qualified/Unqualified-for-consideration">JAMB-IBASS-mail-for-Qualified/Unqualified-for-consideration</a>.
- 13. Qualified Returnee Student is directed via the email and SMS to approach any JAMB Office (in person) to complete the Inter-University Transfer Application.

## ADVISORY ON PROCEDURE FOR APPLICATION FOR FOREIGN INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER FOR STALITES (NOT FRESHERS)

Please find below the procedure for application for foreign inter-University transfer for Stalites:

- 1. The proposed institution sends a list of all candidates (not Freshers) for foreign Inter-University transfer to State JAMB Office with a letter of indemnity.
- 2. The proposed institution directs each candidate to State JAMB Office to create his/her profile on efacility platform (Candidate not on the list earlier sent by the proposed institution would be rejected by the State JAMB Office and cannot process any application on the system).
- 3. At State JAMB Office, the candidate fills the INTER-UNIVERSITY TRANSFER APPLICATION FORM FOR STALITES (NOT FRESHERS) FROM FOREIGN UNIVERSITIES online which would be available only at the State JAMB Office (Note that only the State JAMB Office that the institution is located can attend to the candidates).
- 4. Each candidate is expected to print and submit the auto-generated Indemnity Form after completing the application to his/her Current and Proposed Institutions for the signature of the Heads of the Institutions to indemnify JAMB on the accuracy of the information provided by the candidate. The form is to be endorsed first by the current institution.
- 5. The Proposed Institution sends the endorsed and indemnified form to the Coordinator of the State JAMB Office.
- 6. The form is uploaded from the State JAMB Office to the Headquarters and made available to the efacility platform for processing.
- 1. If the application is approved, the candidate is notified through his/her email.
- 2. The candidate can thereafter print his/her admission letter and access other services online from his/her profile.

Note: Each candidate is to pay for the services online (<a href="www.jamb.gov.ng">www.jamb.gov.ng</a>) using ATM cards, Quick Teller or other e-payment channels available for any of the Board's services.

"I, therefore, urge all prospective candidates to start practising with the devices they intend to use in the coming UTME, prior to which a pilot test will be conducted to aid the smooth implementation of the project," he submitted.

concerns of prospective allottees over the payment plan as some had said that the repayment period is too short and not conducive for public servants. He said the Board should not be deterred as the Bank can, with the Board's cooperation, design a more friendly payment plan. He revealed that if JAMB purchases 300 units of three bedroom flats, it will amount to N6.7b and if the Board can advance the bank N2.6b which would be paid back, it will fast track the delivery of the units to its staff and make the payment plan more conducive for staff such that the advanced N6.7b could be returned to the Board's coffers within a short period of six months.

The Registrar, while commending the management of FHA, led by Distinguished Sen. Gbenga Ashafa, reiterated the importance of affordable housing for the staff as it impacts positively on the efficiency of labour and productivity. According to the Registrar, the Board is statutorily empowered to serve the nation through its mandate noting that while discharging its obligations to the nation, there is also a need to cater for the welfare of its workers, who toil day and night to ensure that the Board deliver on its mandate. He, therefore, stated that it is incumbent on the Board to prioritise the welfare of its staff within what the law allows.



He said it is against this backdrop that the desire of the Board to procure affordable housing for its staff should be situated.

According to the Registrar, he pointed out that his his war against corruption and unethical practices would be meaningful only if the staff are provided with basic necessities such as houses that they can call their own.

He said that hIs visit to FHA was to hold useful discussion with a view to making it easy for the two labour unions of the Board, whose members are direct beneficiaries to assess the project. He promised that management would, with the approval of staff through their unions, tackle any challenges that might crop up adding that the first thing is to secure the support of the staff. He, therefore, said the onus is

on the two labour unions to give or withhold their consent to the arrangement. He also stated that more work needed to be done so as to ensure that staff in outstations would also benefit.

On the issue of pricing, the Registrar said it would not be out of place to request a reduction in the unit cost of the three categories of houses, saying the prices are on the high side.

Thereafter, the Registrar constituted a 5-man committee to assess the site of the project, ascertain its suitability, discuss with the general staff, if they are interested, then further discuss with FHA and report back to management.

Members of the committee are Director of Finance and Accounts, Mr. Mufutau Bello; Director Human Resources, Mr. Muhammed Shehu; Director Legal Services, Dr. Abdul Wahab Oyedukun; and the two Union leaders.

Overall, the terms of reference for the committee include looking at the cost of the houses, the mortgage institutions, and payments plan, among other considerations.

Speaking on behalf of the two unions, Comrade Andrew Onakpa commended the Registrar for his determination to ensure that the Board's staff are made comfortable to deliver their best. He said the unions would take the message back to their teeming members and

report back to management.

Earlier, the Managing Director, FHA, Sen. ## **CESSATION OF ILLEGAL/IRREGULAR ADMISSIONS**

- All applications of admissions to First Degree, National Diploma, National Innovation Diploma and the Nigeria Certificate in Education into Full-Time, Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich, etc., must be processed ONLY through the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).
- No Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes. Institutions should advertise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
- Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) and the three (3) Regulatory Agencies (National Universities Commission (NUC), National Board for Technical Education (NBTE) and National Commission for Colleges of Education (NCCE) will ensure that all Tertiary Institutions comply with this policy directive. Other Professional Regulatory Agencies will also play a role in sanitizing the process.
- The duration of all Non-Full Time Studies must be maintained as approved by the Regulatory Agencies. This is generally not less than one hundred and fifty percent (150%) of the equivalence of Full Time.

### <u>ADVERTORIALS</u>

- Institutions that desire to place advertisement can do so with the requirement that candidates who sat for the current **UTME** (or **DE** candidates) should change to their institutions as First (1st) Choice rather than requesting the candidates to purchase another application form or apply. This is to prevent the issue of double registration which is a violation of the mandate of JAMB.
- It should be reiterated that no Institution should advertise or sell "application forms" for admissions into the programmes listed above. Institutions should advise candidates to apply to them through Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB). Duplication of application forms is **NOT** allowed.
