

# ECAUSE NIGERIANS DESERVE THE BEST, WE UST PREPARE FOR THE BEST - GALADANCHI

**T**he Director, Human Resources, Mr. Salim Galadanchi, says the nation, particularly candidates aspiring to sit the 2022 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME), deserve the best from the Board, hence the series of training exercises being organised for its staff and other functionaries.

Mr. Galadanchi gave this clarification when JAMBULLETIN had sought to know the rationale for the frenzy of activities at the Training and Development Unit of the Human Resources Department throughout the course of the previous week.

The Director declared, "It is the tradition of the Prof. Oloyede-led Management, as enunciated in the Registrar's five-point agenda, to provide ample training opportunities for the staff in line with global best practices."

Continuing, he said, "What we do is constant evaluation using all statistical and other unconventional means to know if our staff are in tune with the rapidly-changing demands being placed on them by the general public while gaps noticed are promptly remedied. Don't forget we had also just concluded our 2022 Staff Promotion Examination where some unpleasant revelations manifested and Management felt that such gaps in knowledge unearthed through the test should not be papered over more so that the Board is set to commence the sale of the 2022 Application Documents. All these led to the rigorous training exercises going on across the nation." He also said, "You will recall that the Board had announced that it is partnering with Digital Bridge Institute(DBI) to train its workforce

# ECTS PROSPECTIVE IITME CE

o match words with action, the Management of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), in the outgoing week inspected some prospective centres to be used for the Board's Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination(UTME) in Berlin, Germany, beginning from the 2022 UTME. The centre inspection, which was undertaken by a three-man technical team from the Board's National Headquarters, was to further the stated goal of the Federal Ministry of Education that the nation's tertiary institutions should be exposed to candidates globally. The team, which was led by the Director, Information Technology Services, Mr

Fabian Okoro, had paid a courtesy visit to the Nigerian Embassy in Berlin where they met with the Nigerian Ambassador to Germany, His Excellency, Amb. Yusuf Maitama Tugar, the Deputy Head of Mission, Her Excellency, Amb. (Mrs.) Ingekim Regina Ocheni and other functionaries of the Mission.

Mr Okoro, after briefing Amb. Tugar on the purpose of the visit solicited the support of the Embassy in sensitising Nigerians in Germany to the highlyimproved quality of Nigerian tertiary institutions.

Ambassador Tugar, while responding, commended the Board for the many good news emanating from it, particularly the series of innovations that have transformed the large-scale assessment landscape in the country for good.

According to the Ambassador, the establishment of a UTME centre in Germany, where he said over 7 million Nigerians reside, would facilitate the return of many of their wards home for further studies. He said, "The two-tier system of progression into tertiary institutions in Germany has made it difficult for many Nigerians to attain their educational goals."

Continuing, he said, "Since Germany is the centre of Europe, having a centre in Berlin would place our education system within the reach of a global audience."

## LE OF UTME AND DE APPLICATION DOCUMENTS STARTS SOON

he Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) will soon commence the sale of application documents/ registration for the 2022 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination( UTME) and Direct Entry(DE).

The Board, is at the moment, engaging its core functionaries in a series of intensive training exercises to ensure that once the date is announced, the stage would have been set for yet another hitch-free exercise.

The release of this information is in line with the Board's firm determination to ensure that candidates who are desirous of enrolling are ready and prepared. Similarly, it is expected to serve as a wakeup call so that all who may want to register would have gone to first obtain their National Identification Number(NIN), a major prerequisite for the UTME registration.

For those who may want to obtain any of the two application documents, they are advised to get their NIN, familiarise themselves with the Board's Integrated Brochure and Syllabus System (IBASS), which would give them an idea of the course requirements and the syllabus they are expected to cover for the examination. IBASS is on the Board's website and is downloadable on Google Playstore and other similar platforms. The next step is for the candidate to create his/her profile by sending the NIN to 55019 to create a profile for registration.

The Board has put adequate measures in place not only to checkmate those who may want to cheat but also strengthened all administrative procedures for the smooth prosecution of any candidate, centre or even staff of the Board found to have been involved in any infraction starting from the registration exercise.

Head, Public Relations and Protocol, Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC), Mr David Apeh, made this known in a statement in Abuja. He said the Board of Executive Directors of Islamic Development Bank approved the Multiyear Financial Facility Programme for the promotion of Bilingual Education in Nigeria from 2012 to 2015. This programme would contribute to the improvement of the socio-economic

condition of Nigeria, ensure inclusive education and promote bilingual education.

He listed the nine (9) benefitting states in the project Adamawa, Borno, Gombe, Kaduna, Kano, Kwara, Nasarawa, Niger and Osun.

Apeh added that the major components of the project would create access to basic education, improve quality and enhance the management capacity of school administrators.

VANGUARD NEWSPAPER FRIDAY DECEMBER 17TH, 2021 - Vocational Education, Key To Industrial Development — NBTE Boss: Executive Secretary of the National Board for Technical Education( NBTE), Prof. Idris Mohammed Bugaje has said that Industries and other employers of labour are key drivers for the development, delivery and quality assurance of skills in any given society.

Prof. Bugaje announced that vocational education, as a driver to industrial development, was part of the resolution of the 7th Industry stakeholders consultation on skills development.

He said, "The objective of the consultation was to create the muchneeded awareness on 21-century skills training system, Nigerian Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) and the need for the involvement of industry in development, delivery and quality assurance of the skills eco-system."

He also said, "NBTE is all out to change the narratives from the certification of polytechnics to the vocational system of education." This, according to him, would bring about the much-needed manpower to move the country and the people forward.
