

### **OPENING TIT BITS:** Mandatory Use of NIN by all categories of candidates (NOUN/Part-time/Sandwich/Distance Learning)

- To checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters scheming to compromise candidates' records, all candidates must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria
- ✓ Whether the mode of study is regular OR non-regular
  - part-time, Sandwich, Open university and other related programmes
- ✓ All candidates will henceforth register their NIN with the Board for all transactions irrespective of the year of last transaction
- ✓ Pre-2019 candidates are required to send their NIN to 55019/66019 to get a profile code, which was introduced only in 2019.
  - This category of candidates are allowed to provide a new GSM number (if necessary) that will be tied to their profile for consequent transactions

#### MANDATORY USE OF THE NATIONAL IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (NIN) FOR REGISTRATION WITH JAMB BY CANDIDATES APPLYING FOR **NON-REGULAR PROGRAMMES**

This Advisory is issued to all the concerned institutions, and candidates desirous of applying to study under the non-regular mode of study in tertiary institutions in Nigeria.

- 1. As part of measures to checkmate the nefarious activities of fraudulent characters, who are scheming to compromise candidates' records through dubious registration channels and in compliance with its enabling act, JAMB has mandated that all applicants desirous of studying in Nigerian tertiary institutions must provide their NIN while registering for any programme of study in any tertiary institution in Nigeria irrespective of whether the mode of study is regular and non-regular.
- 2. Consequently, it has now become mandatory for all prospective candidates in the non-regular category (NOUN, Distance Learning, Part-time and Sandwich programmes) to create a profile code, before registering with JAMB, by sending their NIN, through their unique phone number to either of the Board's sort code (55019 or 66019).
- Immediately after the creation of profile, 3 each candidate will proceed to a CBT Centre for registration. After the registration, the candidate's details will appear on the CAPS of the institution of choice under non-regular admission. The institution will then propose

and recommend to the Board for approval and the candidate will accept and print admission letter.

- 4. Furthermore, all previous candidates in the non-regular programmes, who had not integrated their NIN or unique phone number on the Board's platform, would have to create a profile using their respective NINs to access any of the services of the Board.
- No candidate can use the process to change 5. any of the data already supplied to the Board.
- 6. JAMB, as a responsive organisation that is conscious of the peculiarities of the nonregular studies, will continue to make the registration process as flexible as possible by making its platform available throughout the year. It is, therefore, expected that candidates, who fall under this category, will apply through JAMB before approaching their preferred institutions to process their admission with their respective JAMB registration numbers. They would also be expected to pay their preferred institution a processing fee as determined by the respective institutions.

### **OPENING TIT BITS:** TRUTH BE TOLD

Publication by Dr. Ifeanyi Onyike, HOD Mass Communication Department, Dominican University, Ibadan

- Attention of JAMB was called to publication by Dr. Ifeanyi  $\checkmark$ Onvike in the Punch Newspaper of May 7, 2024, that JAMB continues to lower 'cut-off mark' for candidates even when the Senate of his University was against it
- This claim is FALSE  $\checkmark$
- The truth is that, Dominican University proposed 130 as  $\checkmark$ its minimum UTME score for 2023 admission
  - VC refused to pick calls from JAMB for clarification
  - The University proposed minimum UTME score was rejected for at least **140** by the Policy meeting
  - Even with 140, the University could not exhaust its quota

"JAMB cannot be exonerated. JAMB set standard for admission in Nigeria and we have watched as JAMB has continued to lower the cut-off marks for students, thereby, providing the opportunity for weak candidates to scale through the hurdle. This became a topic in our Senate meeting at Dominican University Ibadan ...... I recall telling them that until JAMB returns the cut-off mark for admission to somewhere around 230 to 250, students will never bother putting in extra efforts to succeed."

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Following the release of these results and information, Nigerians have been actively engaging in discussions to identify potential reasons for the widespread failure and offer suggestions to various stakeholders, including the government, JAMB, parents, schools, teachers, and CBT owners, among others.

Speaking with *The PUNCH*, HOD of the Department of Mass Communication at Dominican University Ibadan, Dr. Ifeanyi Onyike, maintained that the UTME result was a reflection of what Nigeria had become, stating that the Federal Government's poor attitude towards the education sector was contributory to the decline in the standard of education in Nigeria.

He said, "The Federal Government's attitude to the education sector has been abysmally poor and contributory to the decline in the standard of education in Nigeria. The policy somersaults by different administrations trying to outdo each other don't allow for stability. Today, we are on the 6-3-3-4 system, tomorrow it's 9-3-4 or whatever they remember to name it. Curriculum and recommended texts are changed depending on who is profiteering from the venture."

Onyike complained bitterly about JAMB's act of lowering the cut-off marks for students, which in a way made it easy for academically weak students to scale through. He emphasised that poor treatment of teachers, poor supervision of schools, poor attitude of parents towards education, and poor facilities in schools all contributed to the mass failure, saying it was impossible to address one and leave the other.

"JAMB cannot also be exonerated. JAMB sets the standard for admission in Nigeria and we have watched as JAMB has continued to lower the cut-off marks for students, thereby, providing the opportunity for weak candidates to scale through the hurdle. This became a topic in our Senate meeting at Dominican University Ibadan recently when one of us lamented the number of candidates that we had to deny admissions because of either poor SSCE or JAMB results. I recall telling them that until JAMB returns the cut-off mark for admission to somewhere around 230 to 250, students will never bother putting in extra effort to succeed.

"My point here is that the decline in JAMB performance is caused majorly by regulatory weakness on the part of JAMB and the ministries of education."



## **OPENING TIT BITS: DO IT RIGHT (I)** Underage Admission into Tertiary Institutions in Nigeria

..... a case of a University in Canada

- ✓ A candidate completed PRE-NURSING Studies at X University in Canada after her School Diploma in 2022 and WASSCE in 2021
- The University turned down her admission to B.Sc Nursing because she was <u>4 months less than 18 years</u>.
  - 18 years being the minimum age
- ✓ JAMB was approached for temporary transfer to a transitional space of one year in a Nigerian University.
  - The University agreed to admit her but requested JAMB approval
  - The Girl is to be re-transferred to 200L in Canada after one year in Nigeria

We need to assist this nation by doing what is right!!!





#### **OPENING TIT BITS:** DO IT RIGHT (2)

#### **Underage Admission into Tertiary Institutions in Nigeria**

..... a case of a University in Germany

- A candidate applied for Masters at <u>a University in Germany</u>  $\checkmark$ 
  - She then applied for PG Scholarship under Erasmus Mundus programme
- The body found it strange that the candidate's DOB is 2007  $\checkmark$ 
  - By her passport, she started studying at a Nigerian University in 2019 (she was 12 years).
- The Selection Committee contacted Nigeria to confirm the age  $\checkmark$ 
  - If in deed the candidate studied at a University and graduated at a very young age (15years) in Nigeria
  - Whether it is possible to do so in in such a young age in Nigeria
- JAMB checked the records and it has now been found that it NEVER ADMITTED the candidate into the University.
  - Her illegal University admission was later sent to JAMB under condonement as waived for all institution by the immediate past HME
  - Till today, the VC is yet recommend the candidate for approval of illegal 2019 admission because of the attendant implication

### **OPENING TIT BITS: DO IT RIGHT (3)** Underage Admission into Tertiary Institutions in Nigeria ..... Global Survey of Age 15

- ✓ A global survey recently conducted across nations by an International organisation described cohorts as:
  - 9 year of basic education = end of JSS3 in Nigeria as envisaged by the National Policy on Education, which prescribed 6 years of primary and 3 years of JSS as the basic education
  - Age 15 as end of basic education = JSS 3 in Nigeria
- How then can Nigeria defend preponderance of age 15 at the University level?

  - candidate said to be born in 1900
  - JAMB confirmed the date of birth as it was
  - There was an attempt to belatedly correct the date
  - JAMB disclosed it as an apparent error only to be praised for being factual



### **OPENING TIT BITS:**

#### **Unhelpful Interference by Secondary School Operators**

- A candidate was posted to sit his UTME on Saturday, 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2024
- There was a technical problem at the Centre
- Candidates were rescheduled for another examination
- Information for rescheduling was sent to the candidates through SMS
- This candidate missed the rescheduled examination
  - It was the School that arranged the registration for this candidate and others
  - The candidate had no access to any message from JAMB
- The Mother approached the School and it was discovered that the candidate had been rescheduled but the School did not check the message sent to the candidate
- The parents appealed ... but it was late to rescue the candidate.

Please sir i am by name xxxxxxx the mother of ..... who missed his JAMB exams due to the fact that his center SORONARA CENTER in Owerri had issues with their generator on that faithful morning and my son was told to come back on Monday for feedback only for us to get to the center and it happens that the exam was taken on Saturday, which when I inquired they said that messages were sent to the students. I had to call his school immediately because it was his school that registered the students themselves while we paid to the school. When I told the school what happened they had to check that Monday and saw that my son was rescheduled which they never saw the message on time. Please Sir could you kindly use your good office to reschedule my son as this will be a very big blow to me for him to stay idle for the next one year. I will be very grateful if my request is granted Sir

### **OPENING TIT BITS:**

New Trends by Candidates who were Absent during Examination

- ✓ Old was medical report
- ✓ Now, claim of <u>KIDNAP</u> is the new trend of lies by candidates who were absent during examination
- When JAMB rescheduled examination for  $\checkmark$ genuine candidates, others wrote to JAMB that they were kidnapped days before the date of their examination and released after the conduct of the examination

A father wrote to JAMB that his son was kidnapped in Wuse, Abuja but for the quick thinking and courage enabled him to escape and find his way to the examination **Centre, albeit late** 



### **OPENING TIT BITS: Conviction of UTME malpractice Offenders**

- Remember the case of an undergraduate in Ondo who was involved in act of  $\checkmark$ examination malpractice during the 2023 UTME
  - He was apprehended at the point of biometric verification
- He was arraigned at Federal High Court Sitting in Ondo State and convicted on  $\checkmark$ two-count charge for impersonation and examination malpractice in a judgement delivered on 5<sup>th</sup> March, 2024
- He was sentenced to one year of imprisonment on the first count and an  $\checkmark$ additional one year on the second count
  - The convictions run concurrently
- The conviction is to serve as deterrent for would-be infractors to stay off examination misconduct
- 2024 UTME:– 49 are in the net and being prosecuted for impersonation and others  $\checkmark$

An Abuja Grade A court also sentenced a CBT **Centre Owner to** jail for an act of infraction



### Distribution of the 8,113 low score Candidates by State of Origin





### **2023 STATISTICS OF QUOTA/APPLICATION/ADMISSION BY FACULTY (DEGREE)**




## **2023 UTME STATISTICS OF QUOTA/APPLICATION/ADMISSION BY SCIENCES AND ARTS (NCE)**

## **2023 DIRECT ENTRY ADMISSION** – Verification of A-Level Certificates by Nigerian Post-secondary Education Data System (NIPEDS)

- JAMB discovered that **21 candidates** who paraded fake IJMB results were  $\checkmark$ recommended during the 2023 admission
  - They were not approved
  - 12 of the recommendations were by ABU, Zaria what an audacious attitude
  - Recommendations were possible because certificate screening was done after registration;
- 5 institutions were involved in the recommendations;  $\checkmark$
- JAMB insist that all certificates must have the signature of the Head of  $\checkmark$ the institution (VC/Provost/Rector)
- The same way an **audacious individual** went to JAMB Lagos Office and  $\checkmark$ pasted illegal advertisement on its notice board
  - He claimed to have capacity to print all JAMB documents
  - We paid but he could not do what he claimed he is being hunted for arrest



## **Candidates with other Forms of Disabilities that Could not be Accommodated in the Regular Testing Centres Registration**

- Concerns were raised about the plight of candidates with other forms of disabilities  $\checkmark$ other than the blind and deaf in the registration and conduct of UTME
  - JAMB have had cause to harvest these other candidates during the conduct of examinations for the sighted whenever they are discovered to be unable to write alongside regular candidates.
  - Most times, the situation is salvaged by Special Committee of JAMB called the JAMB Equal Opportunity Group (JEOG) at any of the JEOG Centres located near the scene of the incident










## GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2024 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN




## **GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2024 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN & GENDER**



## **2024 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN (TOP TEN)**




## **2024 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN (LOWEST TEN)**






### 2024 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY FACULTY (DEGREE) – Origin of Imbalance in Admission









### **CURBING MALPRACTICE:**

### Institutions are not to capture new (or allow substitution) of photographs and finger prints

**Capturing of fresh** facial and finger biometric images of candidates encourages impersonation and substitution of paid examination takers with real candidates who must have engaged the paid examination takers for the SSCE and UTME

Concerted efforts by JAMB, other educational assessment bodies and the NYSC have implicated tertiary institutions (few of them) in the scandal

JAMB would make available (and for free) images and biometric of candidates





### **2024/2025 ADMISSION IN FOCUS: UPLOAD OF MATRICULATION LIST BY INSTITUTIONS**

**Process of analysing Matriculation List has** been automated

**Beginning from 2024** admission, every institution must upload its matriculation list and obtain result of the analysis before matriculating the candidates

It takes less than 5 minutes to analyse a matriculation list



### **2024/2025 ADMISSION IN FOCUS: CAPS/IBASS/QUOTA & NTMUS** Reminder!!!



✓ The approval of FME that the NABTEB 'A/Level GCE will **no longer be recognized** as a qualification for DE from 2022 still stands

✓ However, all those who had already obtained it prior to this date will be able to use it

# **FEATURES ON CAPS**





### **ADDITIONAL FEATURES ON CAPS Download of O' Level Results by Institutions**

**Candidates upload O'** Level results to their CAPS

No institution should mandate candidates to upload O' level results on institution portal

Institutions must download available candidates' O' level results per programme before they can initiate admission process for each programme

Candidates' O' level results is available automatically to institutions

#### No Download of **Results, No Admission**



# **FEATURES ON CAPS:** Movement of Candidates

Before a candidate can be moved or transferred to another programme, there would be a transfer alert (notification from CAPS) to the candidate to either accept or reject the movement

> If s/he presses YES, s/he moved to the new programme & **MUST** be admitted

> > At the point of Acceptance, s/he would be notified to do change of programme to be able to print his/her admission letter

If s/he presses NO or SILENT (no response), the candidate remains & cannot be moved anywhere

> ACT of JAMB Section 5(1)(c)(iii) "the preferences expressed or otherwise indicated by candidates for certain tertiary institutions and courses"



**FEATURES ON CAPS** (cont'd)

**Availability of date of upload of O' level credentials by candidates** 

**Availability of date cut-off** 

All institutions MUST provide date of commencement of admission

No institution would be able to finalise admission exercise until after cut-off date



# **FEATURES ON CAPS** (cont'd)



No institution would be able to move candidates into merit level unless ALL positive candidates above him/her are admitted either by Merit, Catchment or ELDS

After upload of O' level by a candidate, any admission to be done MUST consider him/her



If any institution requests for opening of change for programme or institution, it MUST consider all the candidates who have uploaded



#### NATIONAL TOLERABLE MINIMUM UTME SCORE (NTMUS)


What is available is No UTME score National Tolerable is a Cut-off mark Minimum UTME Score for the purpose (NTMUS) of admission No institution can consider any candidate with score below it for admission It is abnormal

The Realistic Institutional Admittable Minimum UTME Scores (RIAMUS) is the minimum that Senate/Academic Board of each institution approved for consideration of admission

> It can be equal or higher than NTMUS



## **2024 JAMB DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR CLEARANCE OF UTME CANDIDATES**



**Recent events** have justified the need for protection of the clearance process

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#### **NOTIFICATION OF ADMISSION THROUGH SMS**

Candidates notification of admissions through SMS now upgraded with new features and commitment



Admission **Officer enters** the number of **SMS** services credits the institution wants to buy

Amount payable is calculated by the system, log the transaction and transfers access to payment gateway

SMS credit of the institution will only be for communication with candidates



# **PUBLISHING ADMISSION CUT-OFF DATE**

JAMB will continue to publish cut-off dates of all institutions to guide candidates and the general public







# **ADMISSION INTO NON-REGULAR MODE OF STUDY** (Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich Programmes)

- ✓ Candidates of Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich, etc. programmes are not required to sit for the UTME
- ✓ They apply and their applications processed the same way just as the DE candidates
- ✓ They belong to a separate matriculation list
- ✓ They are not available for mobilisation by NYSC
- ✓ They can only apply for Exemption





#### **PROFILE EXCLUSIVE TO CANDIDATES: NO THIRD-PARTY INTERFERENCE**

#### The Board has banned all thirdparty interactions on its portal for any of its services

 cases have been reported with conflicting authorisation for changes on candidates' data, majorly between candidates and their parents or guardians

Fraudsters taking advantage of the naivety of some candidates to collect their vital access codes to effect unauthorised changes on their profiles

Consequently, nobody, including parents or guardians or any proxy, would have access to transact any business on candidate's profile because fingerprint (or OTP) would be required



#### JAMB SUPPORT SYSTEM – TICKETING Reminder!!!

candidates no longer need to travel to JAMB offices to access certain services.

The Board uses the 'ticketing system' where a candidate or anybody desiring the Board's services can send their complaint(s).

**Responses are given within 24 hours.** 

It has a tracking number that is issued once a ticket is raised. If not attended to, the number can be use as evidence to track the officer scheduled who would be sanctioned

> The system is designed to eliminate any stress associated with accessing the Board's services



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# WAIVERS FOR ADMISSION - Reminder!!!



✓ JAMB received requests for lowering of minimum scores from Institutions to be able to attract enough candidates

- ✓ Institutions should take advantage of IBASS
- ✓ Make a realistic requests including UTME subjects combination & O' level credit passes
- Remedial students must also have minimum institutional score
- ✓ Head of institutions or Registrars should personally make such requests



# WAITING PERIOD TO ACCEPT ADMISSION

- How long does a candidate have to accept an admission being  $\checkmark$ offered to him/her?
- Every candidate is now required to accept his/her admission  $\checkmark$ within **2 weeks** from the date of approval by JAMB
- We propose that:  $\checkmark$ 
  - If not accepted at the expiration of the period, the admission should be reversed automatically
  - The institution is also notified & quota is released
  - The candidate is returned back to the pool with an **indicator** of "previously admitted but no acceptance".

#### This is for decision of the heads of Institutions

## JAMB QR SCANNER

- Download the "JAMB QR Scanner" on your phone or similar devices from Apple and Google Play Stores (scans everything)
- Used to verify the security features on documents such as name, registration number, institution/programme

# **CHALLENGES OF THE BOARD**

- ✓ Examination Malpractice
- Impersonation and Substitution of Real Candidates by Paid Examination Takers
- ✓ Fraudulent CBT Owners who Sabotage Examination
- Parents Encouraging Examination Malpractice
- ✓ Mass Cheating by Syndicates
- Prolonged Investigation and Prosecution
- ✓ Associated Costs Involving Travels, Allowances, Attendance of Court and Legal Fees
- ✓ Inadequate CBT Centres in Some Parts of the Country
- ✓ Acceptance of Under-age for admission into Tertiary Institutions



# Way forward

- $\checkmark$ BYOD – the direction for JAMB
  - Students can bring their telephone
  - It lowers capital investment but not helpful for digital literacy
- $\checkmark$ Establishment of mobile examinational malpractice tribunal to deal with the criminal aspect while institutions handles the misconduct
- Partnering security operatives & relevant agencies on cyber crimes  $\checkmark$
- $\checkmark$ Engaging the machinery & sponsoring them to tap from their knowledge
- Movement of some services to the registration portal to prevent extortion of candidates  $\checkmark$
- $\checkmark$ Open Book Examination to Discourage Cheating
- $\checkmark$ Enforcement and adherence to National Policy on Education
- $\checkmark$ Political-Will and Concerted Efforts at adopting **Single Identity for all Citizens** to Discourage Impersonation – collaboration with NIMC is already yielding result
