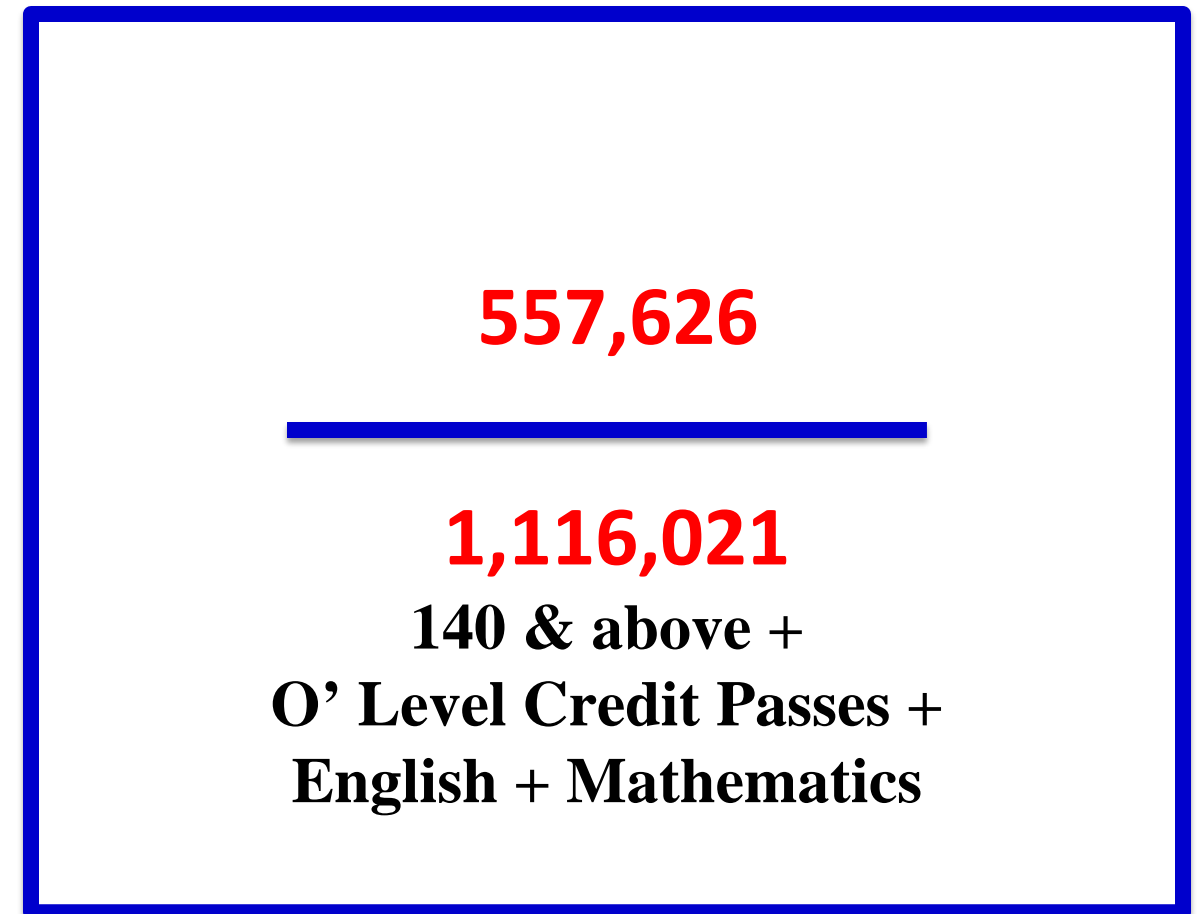
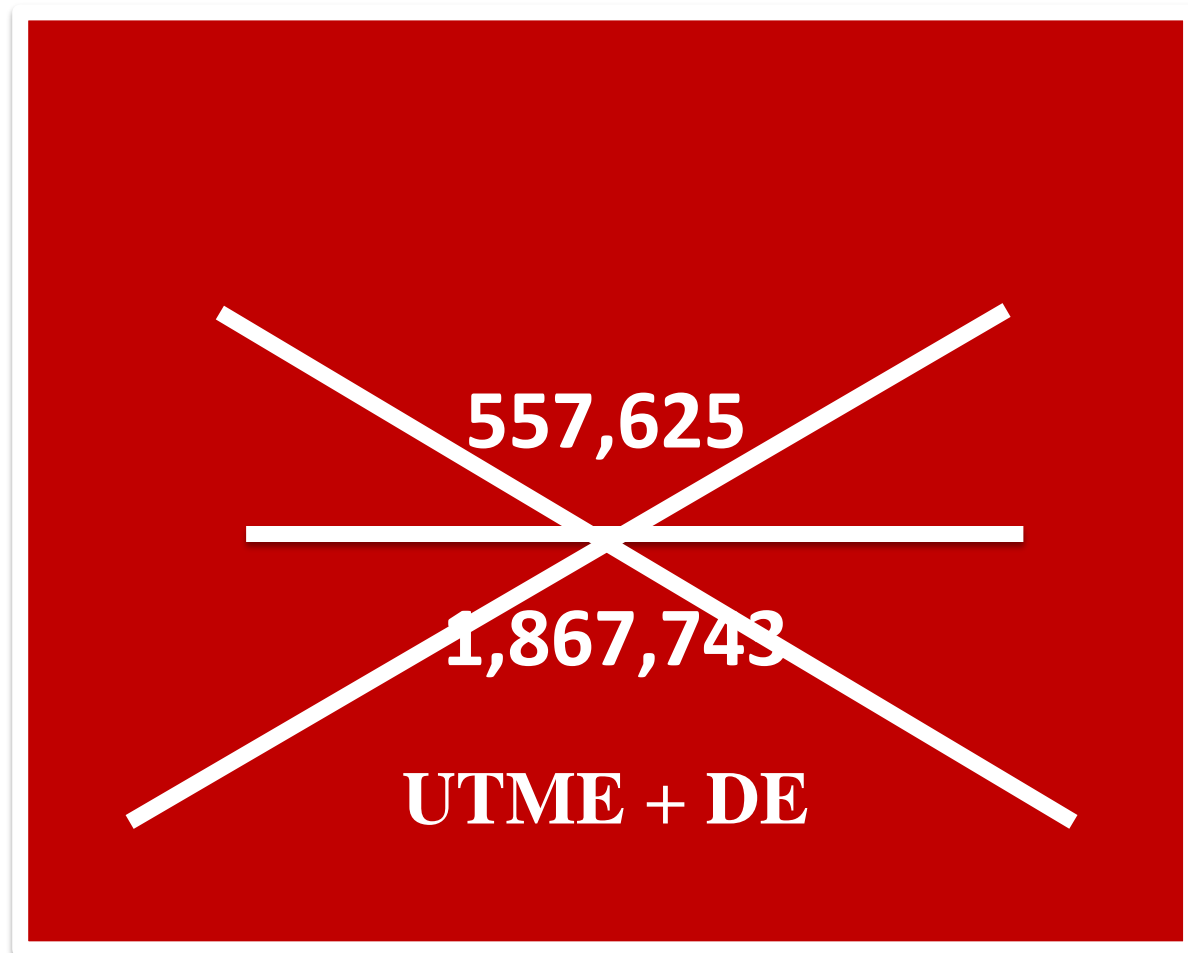

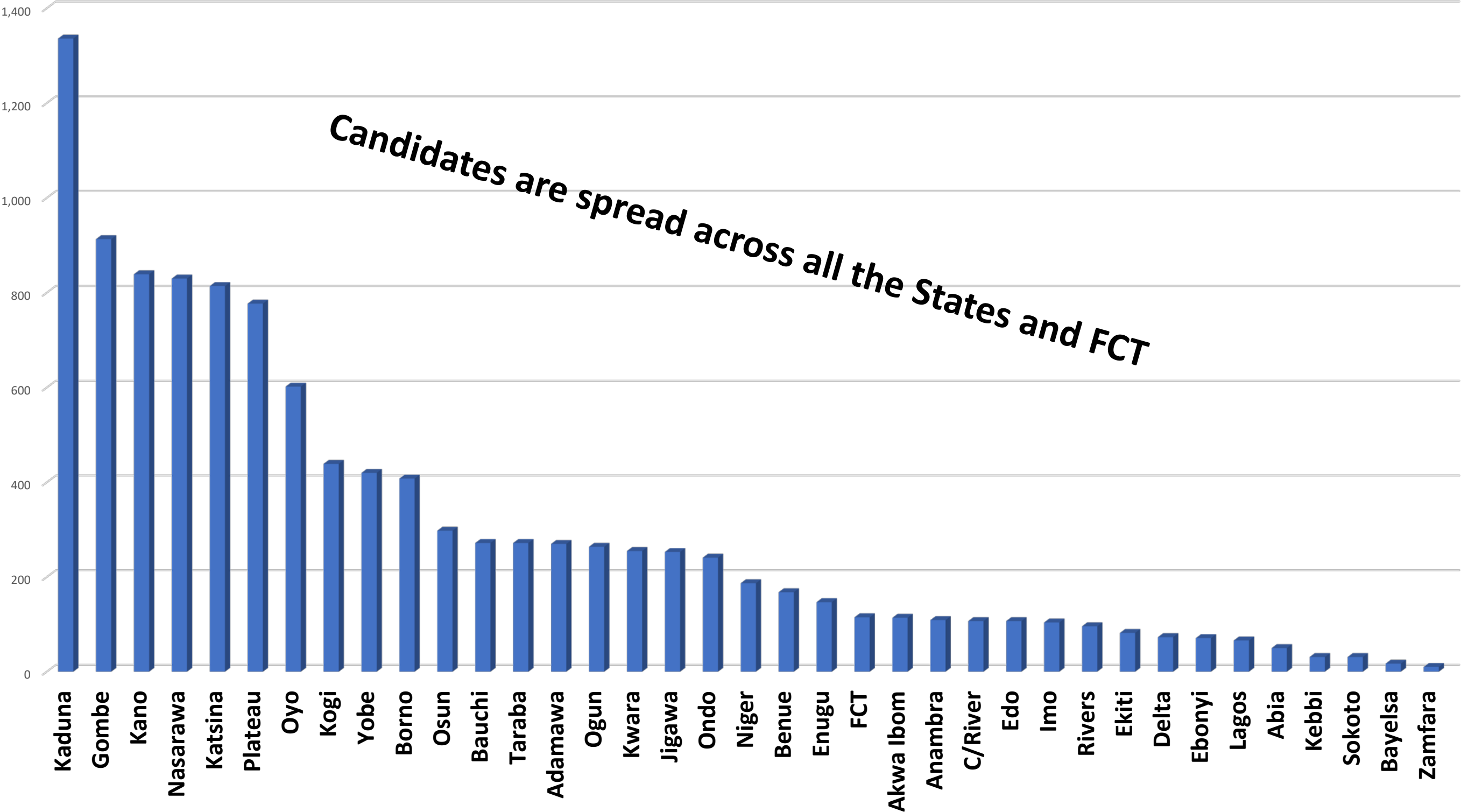

Graphical Representation – Distribution of the 11,188 by State of Origin

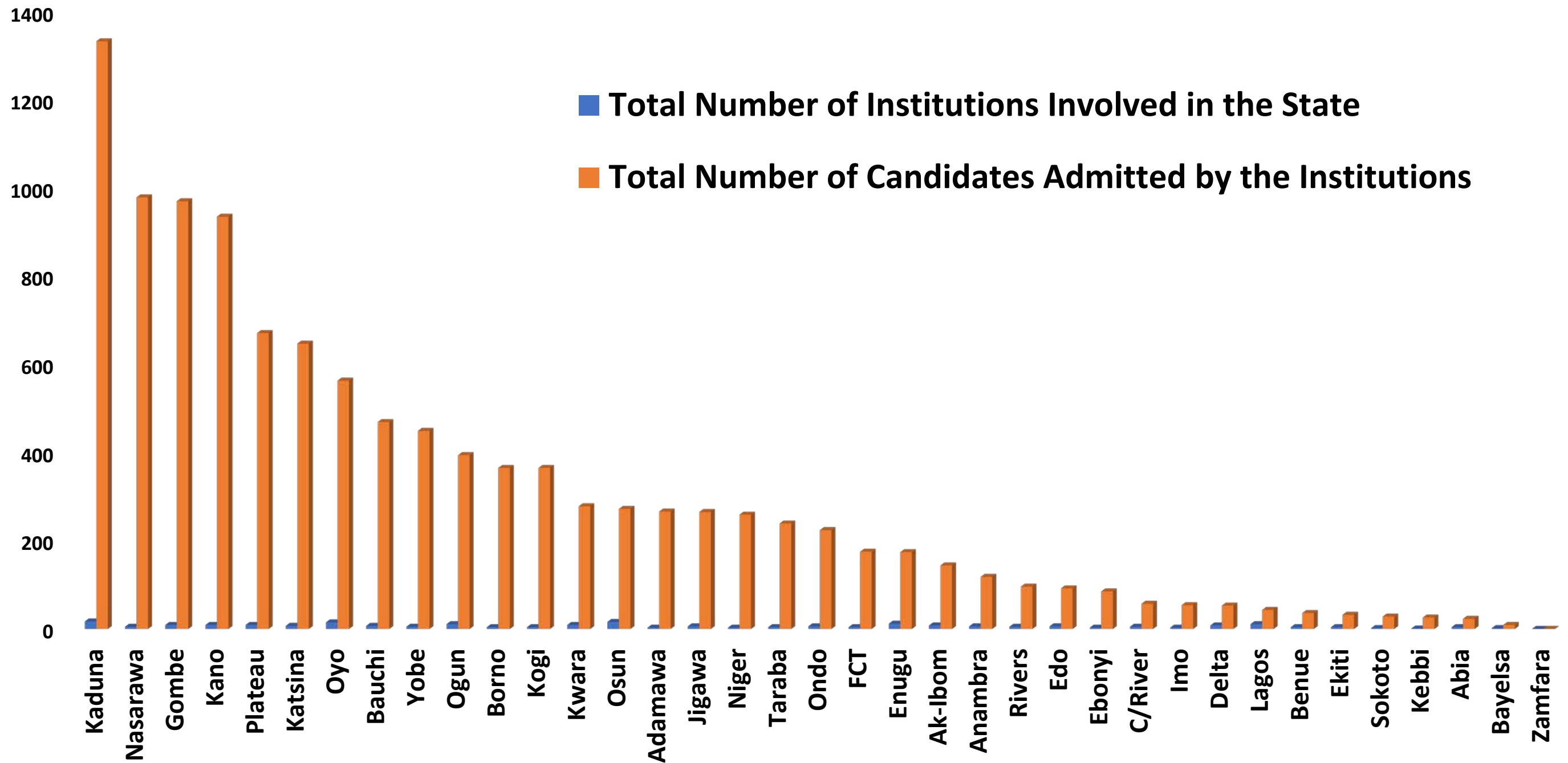

Reasons why there are vacancies (wide gap) & yet some candidates are yet to be admitted

Reasonable percentage of unadmitted are due to:

Rigidity of programme choice (MBBS, B.Sc Nursing, Law, etc)

Mismatch of demand and supply

Lack of interest (demand) for existing vacancies (NCE, Education, Agric and basic Sciences)

Trial-candidates (No O/Level/Awaiting Results)

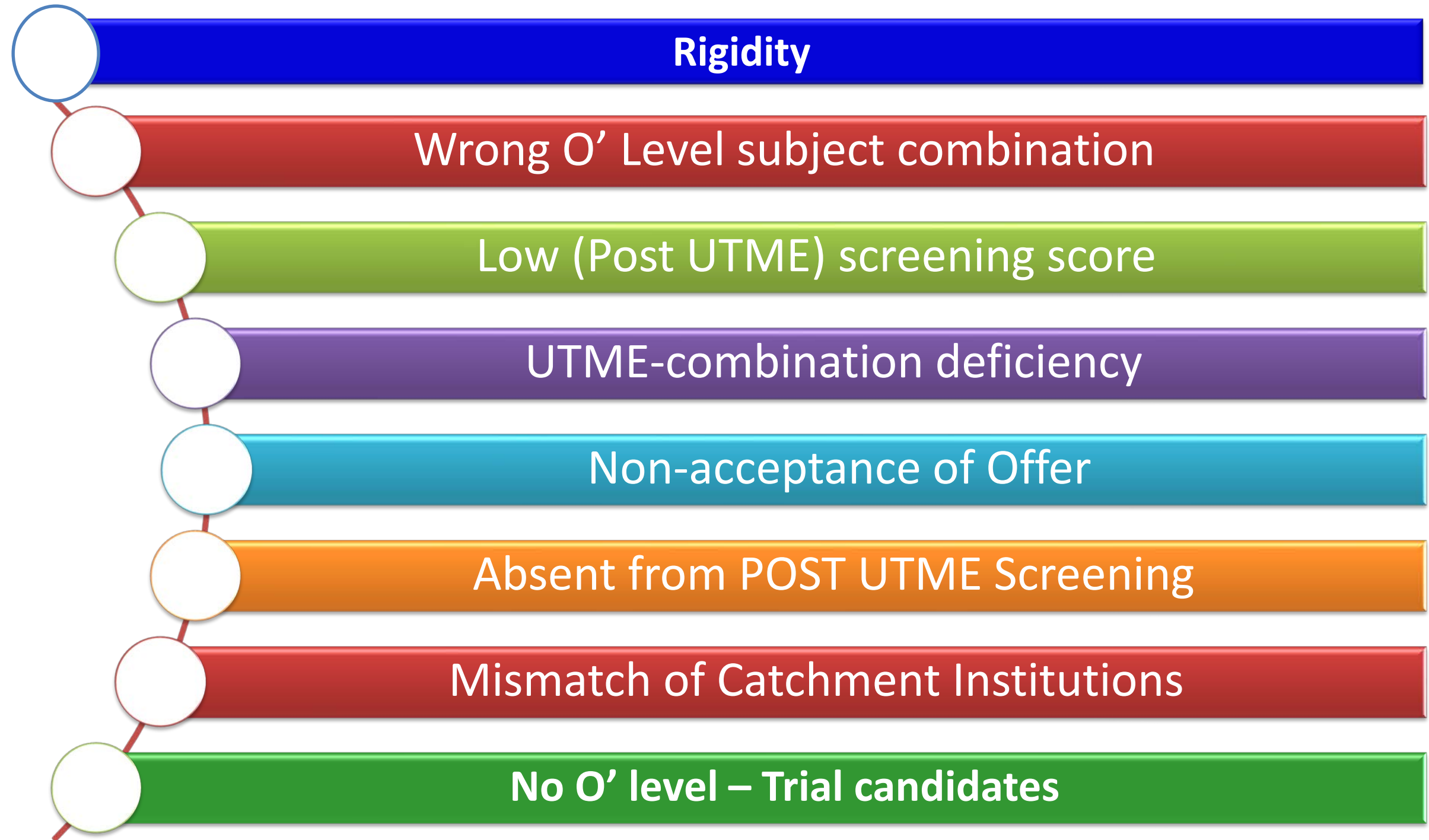

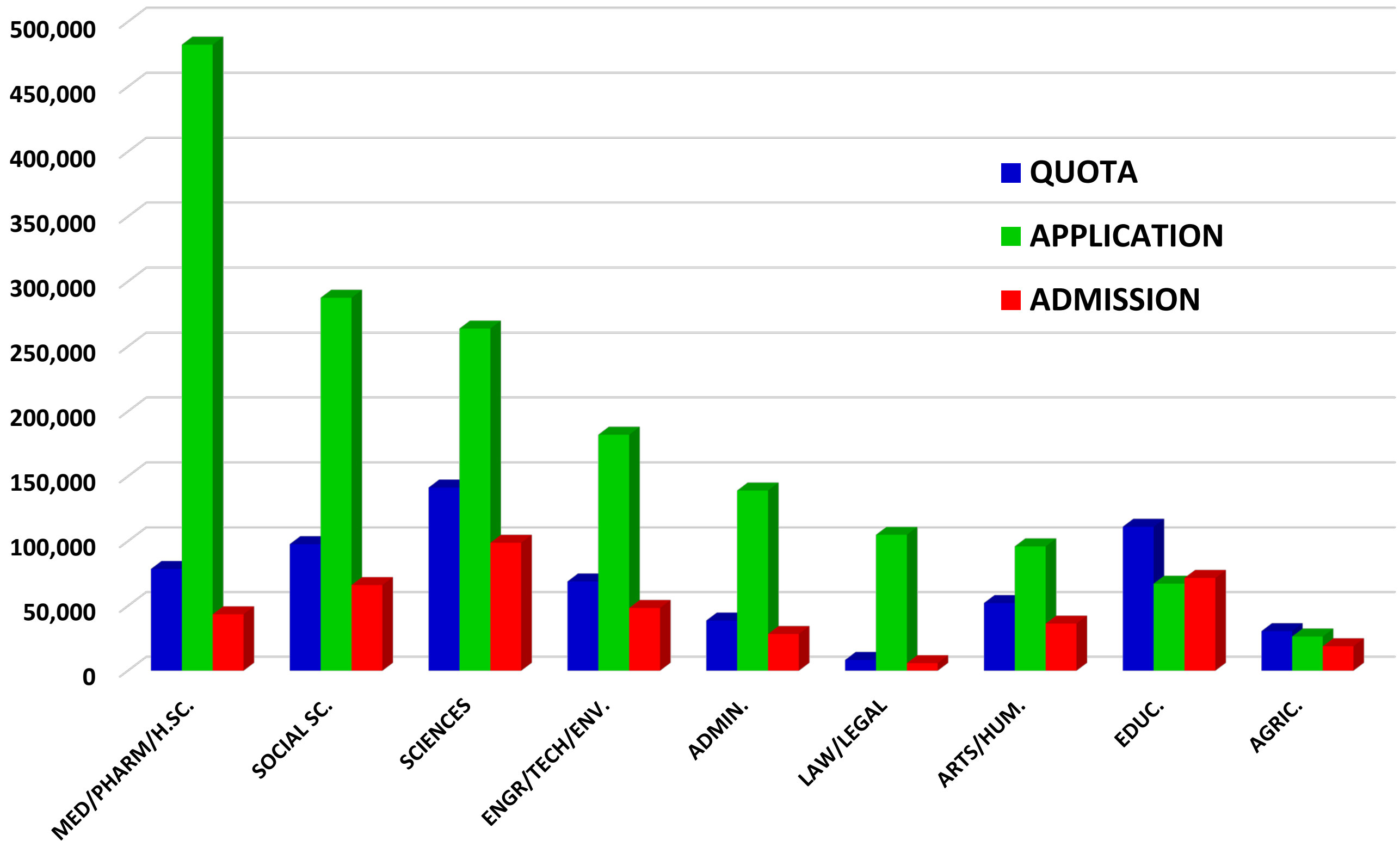

INCENTIVE FOR BEST PRACTICES: JAMB CSR

- ✓ NATAP-M Award was initiated in 2018
 - Encourages compliance with the admission guidelines and healthy competition
 - Has criteria for enhancing the conduct of admission

- ✓ Each of the categories up till the last exercise attract **N100 Million (75M for 1st, 15M for 2nd and 10M for 3rd)**

- ✓ The Board in it's determined efforts to ensure that the award creates the needed impact is increasing the value of the prize money from the total N500M to **N750 Million**
 - Consolidation of the five categories of awards into one single award
 - To curtail possible monopoly, it is proposed that any winner-institution of the award can only be given nominal award within 5 years of FULL OVERALL winning of the award
 - The OVERALL winning-prize is **N500 million**

- ✓ To ensure all-inclusiveness of all tertiary institutions **N250 Million** of the N750M is for subsidiary winners as follows:

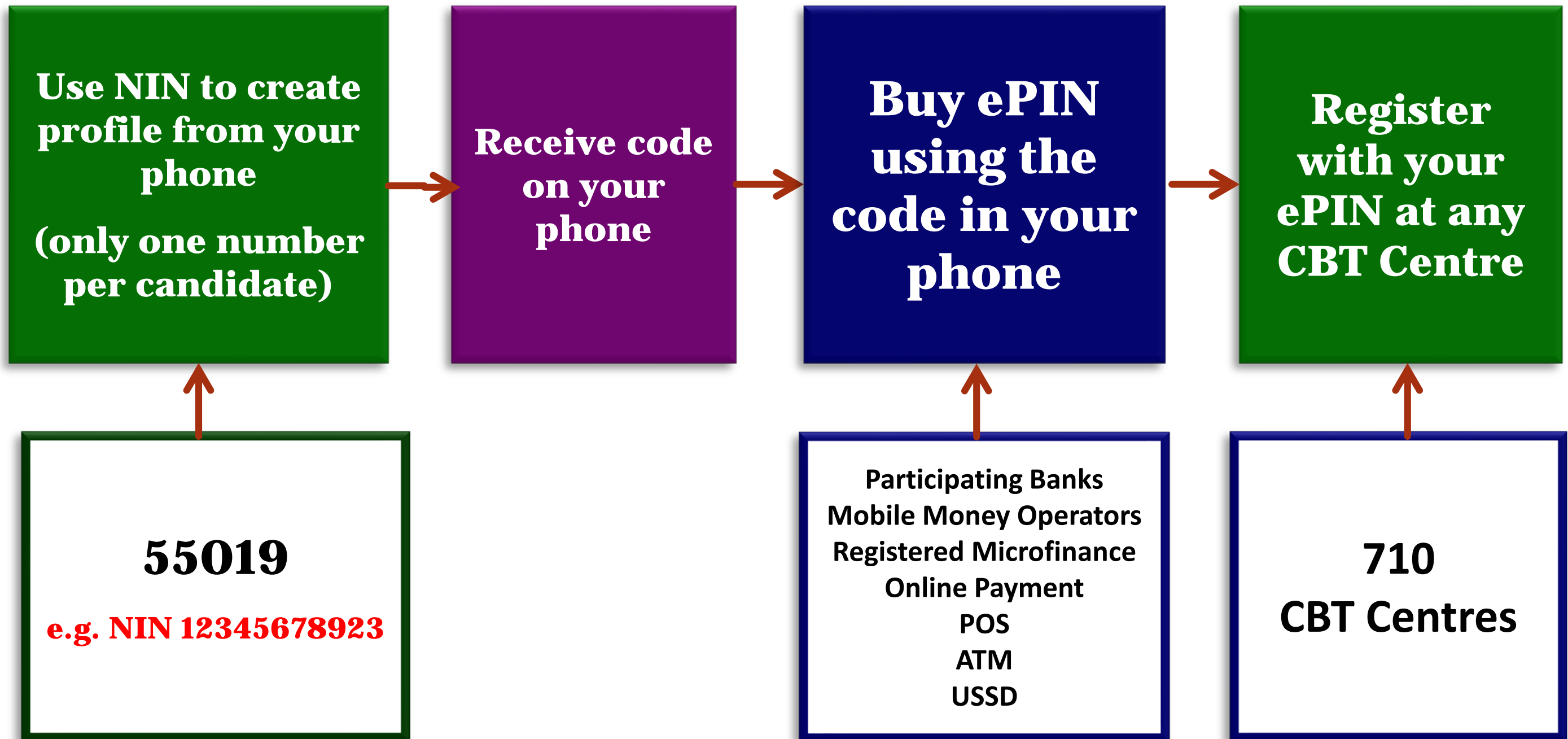

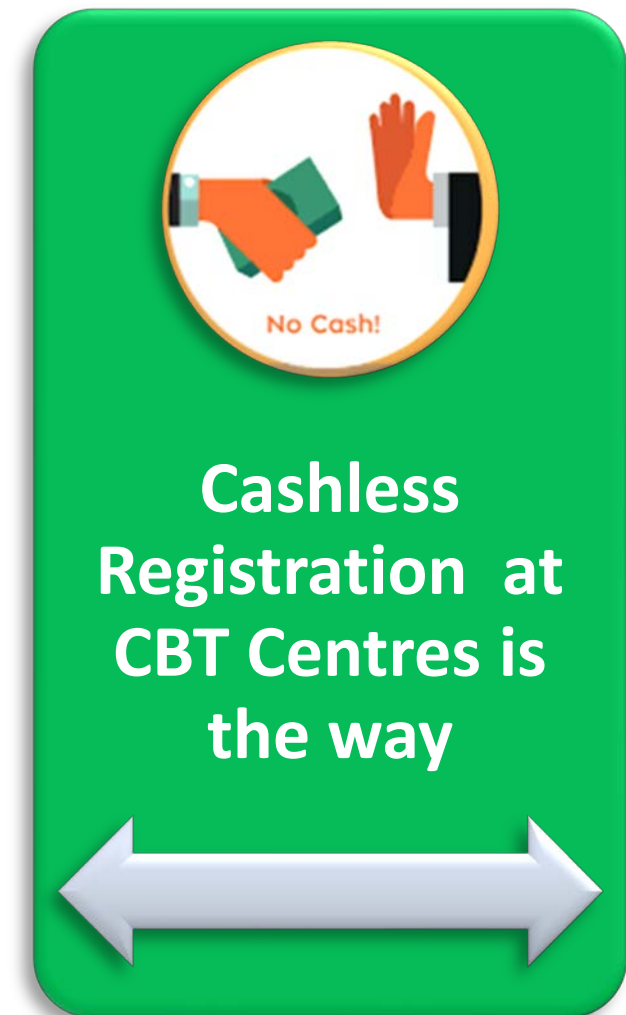


2023 UTME INNOVATION – Payment Restructuring

- ✓ The break down of all approved fees was as follows:
 - UTME/DE Application fee (reduced since 2018)
after 30% reduction ₦ 3,500
 - Other charges (Now consolidated):
 - ❑ Reading Text - Book ₦ 500
 - ❑ CBT Centre Registration Service Charge ₦700
 - ❑ CBT Centre Service Charge for Mock/UTME - ₦2,000/~~₦1,000~~
 - ❑ N1.4billion was recently released to
700+ CBT Centres for examination alone
(excluding registration earlier paid)
- ✓ **Candidates did not pay any charge at the Registration or Examination centres**
- ✓ Consequently, charges were as follows:
 - UTME Candidate not sitting for MOCK examination - ~~₦ 5,700~~
 - UTME Candidate sitting MOCK examination - ~~₦ 6,700~~
 - DE Candidate - ~~₦ 4,700~~

2023 UTME/DE INNOVATIONS - Cashless Registration at CBT Centres

- ✓ As already effected for UTME and DE exercise, registration process remains cashless
 - to prevent extortion and warehousing of candidates at CBT Centres
- ✓ JAMB **collects (and REMITs to Centres)** all the approved charges on behalf of the CBT Centres along with its UTME registration fees
- ✓ **Just as it was done last year, candidates go to any CBT Centre for registration without paying again**
- ✓ Remittance was weekly



2023 UTME/DE INNOVATIONS – Replacing CD with QR Code to access IBASS

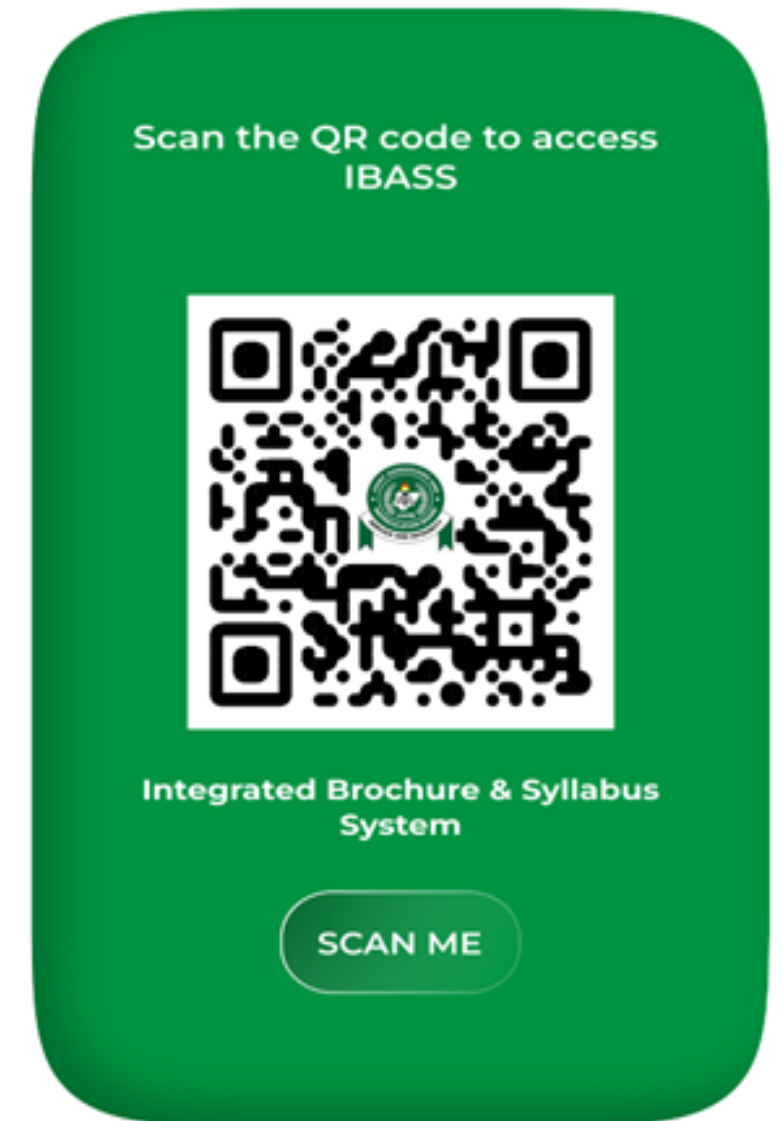
IBASS has eligibility checker

- To assist candidates to match their requirements with programmes in an institution
- Provides alternative programme(s) where there is no match

JAMB **stopped** the use of **CD** for accessing eBrochure and eSyllabuses

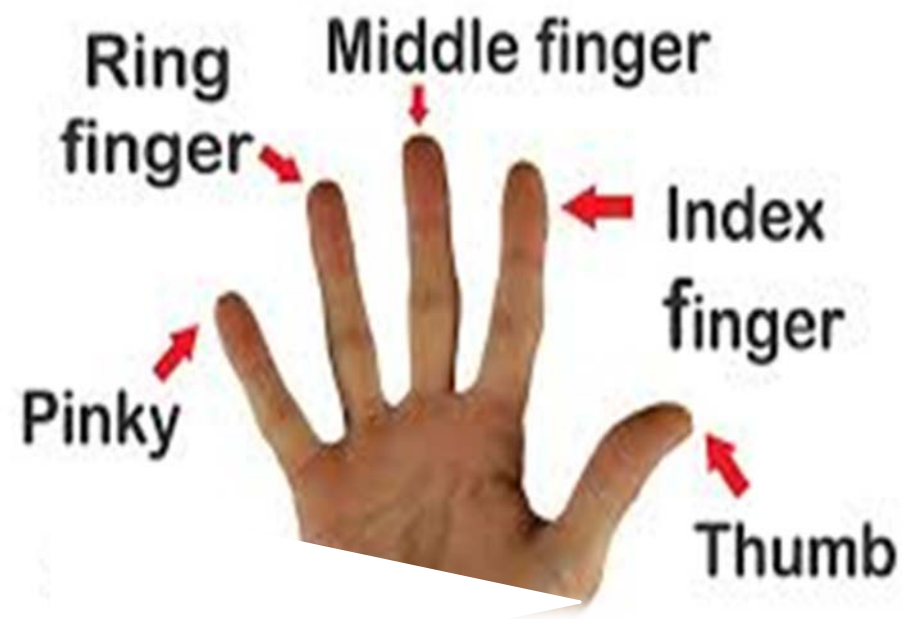
QR code is now provided as replacement to access IBASS and it is printed at the back of the reading text

The Board advertised this to candidates in both print and electronic media



2023 UTME/DE Registration (cont'd)

Using Two Fingers-prints for Printing of Registration Slip



- ✓ As a requirement for printing registration slip, a candidate must use at least two fingers
- ✓ Any of the two fingers would be used to print his/her registration slip
- ✓ All candidate registrations (UTME/DE) would be concluded with fingerprint authentication for the printing of registration slip
- ✓ Any of the two fingers would also be used for verification at all times
- ✓ The two consecutive successful verification fingers (to enable printing) would be indicated on the registration and examination slips

CANDIDATES WHO REGISTER & SIT FOR UTME IN FOREIGN CENTRES

- ✓ **Non-Nigerians**
- ✓ **A Nigerian who is a product of a foreign Secondary School system**
- ✓ **A Nigerian who is a confirmed resident in a foreign country (6 month-stay at the minimum)**

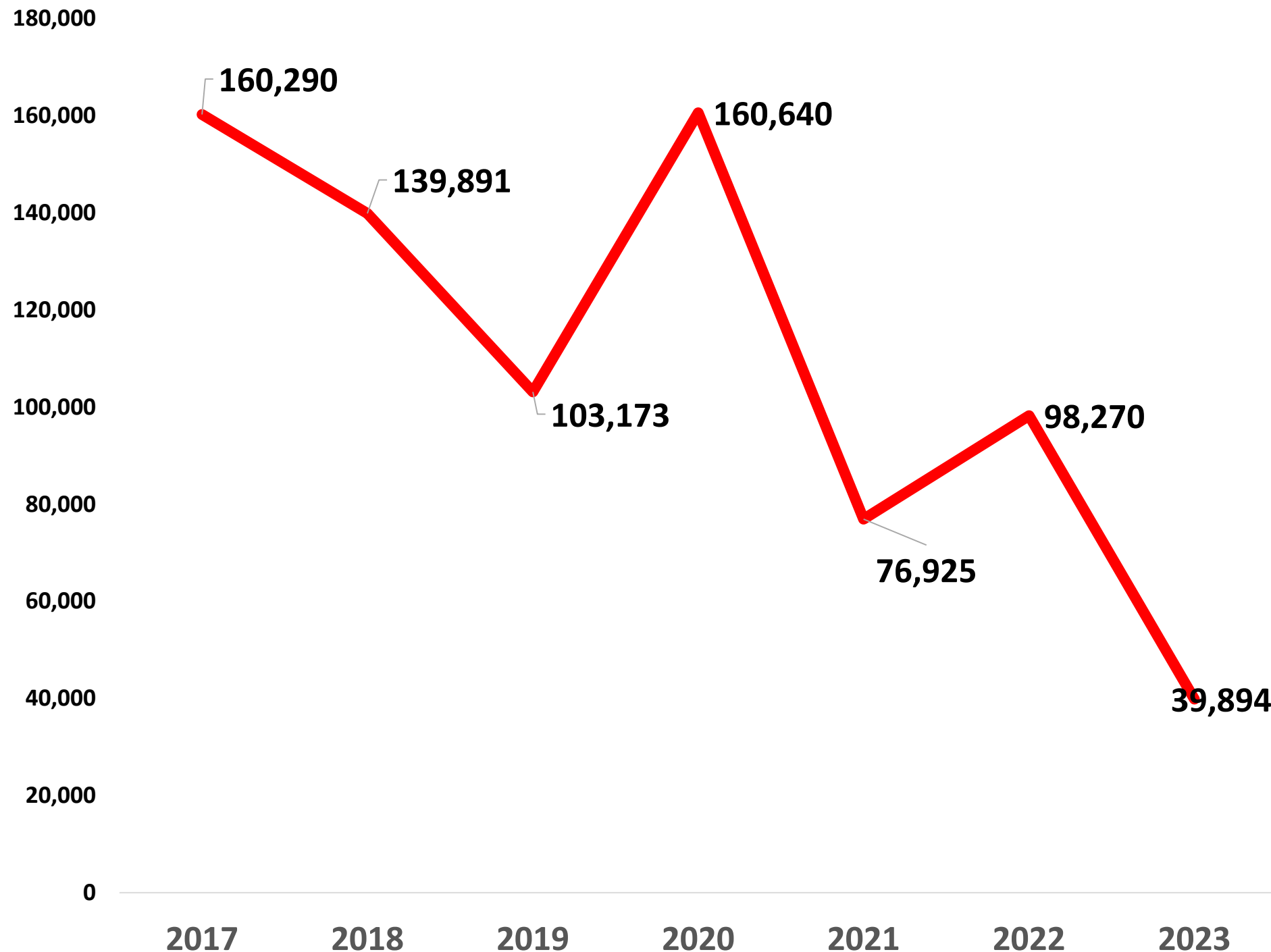

- ✓ Reduced by over 130,000 (39,894 vs 160,000+)
- ✓ JAMB deliberately working to sanitise the system despite loosing over N450million (130,000xN3,500)

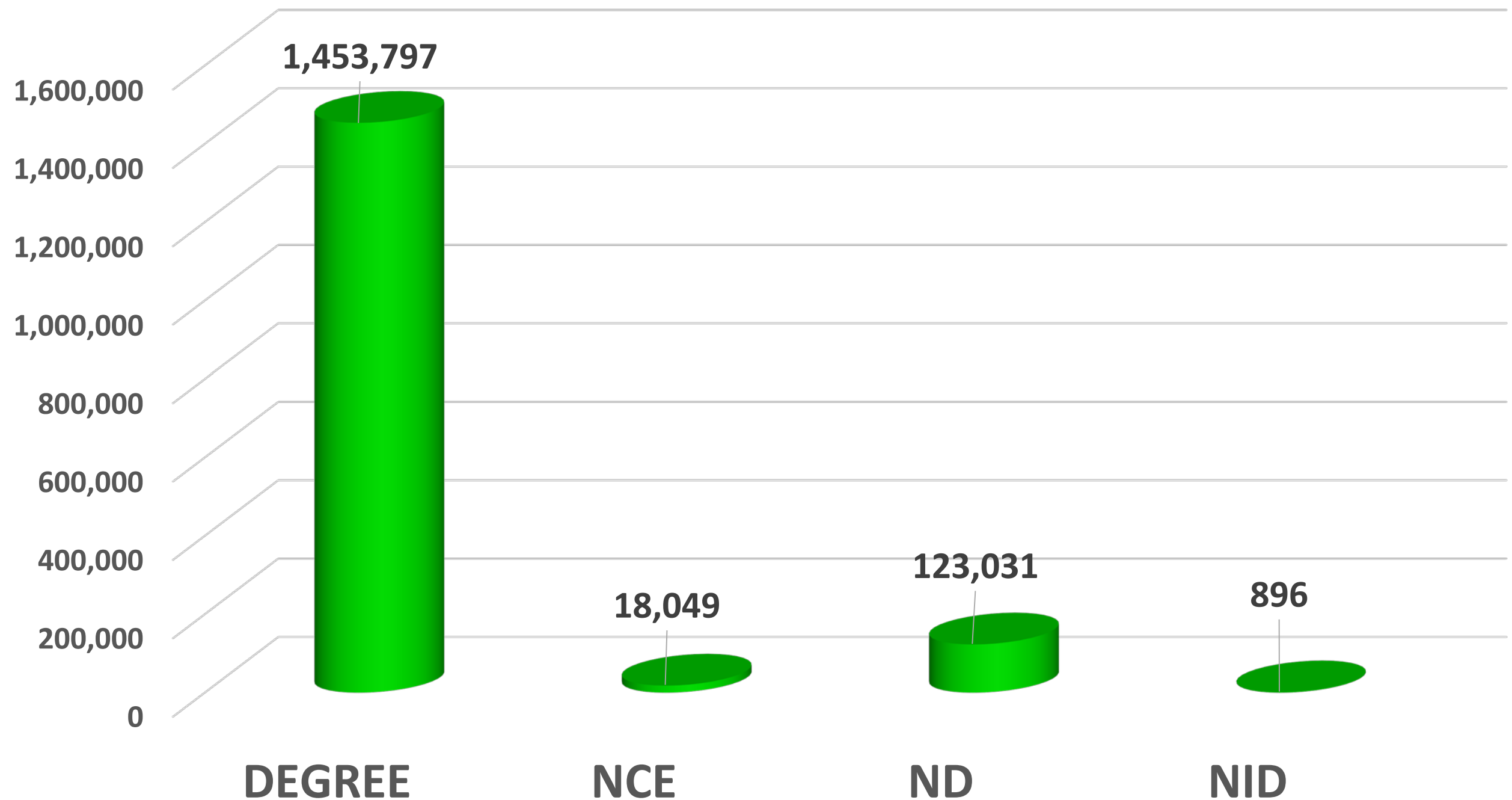

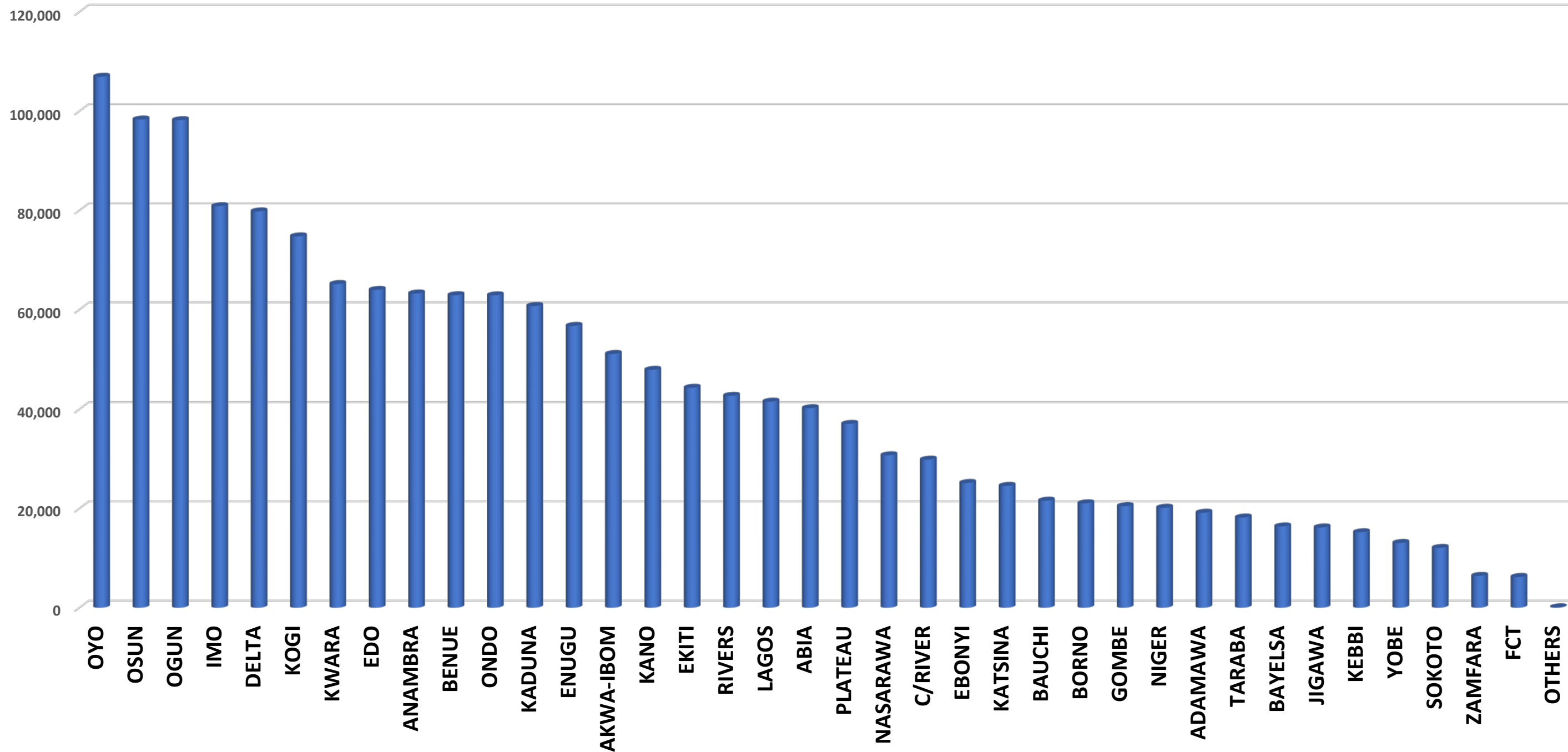

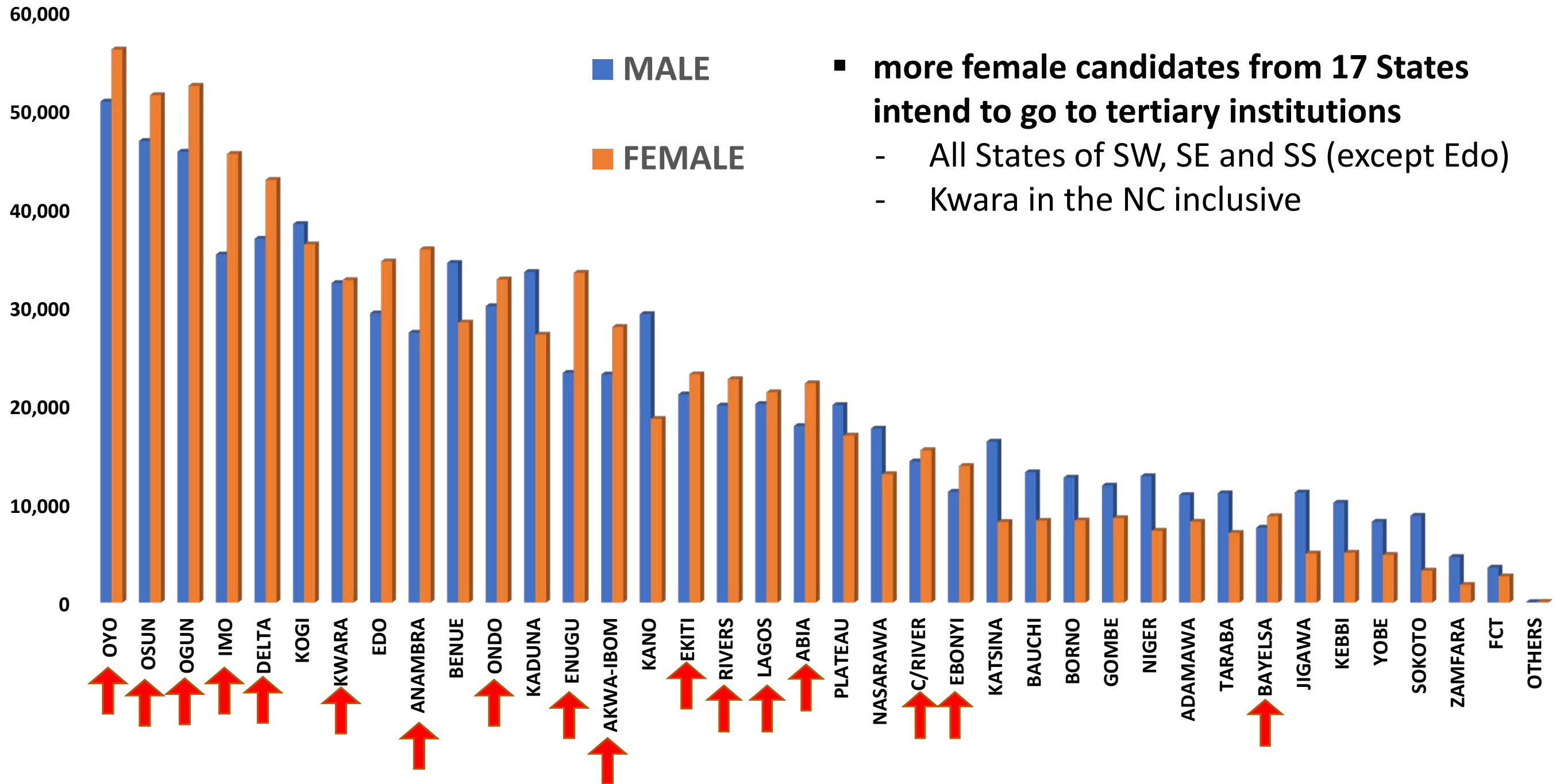

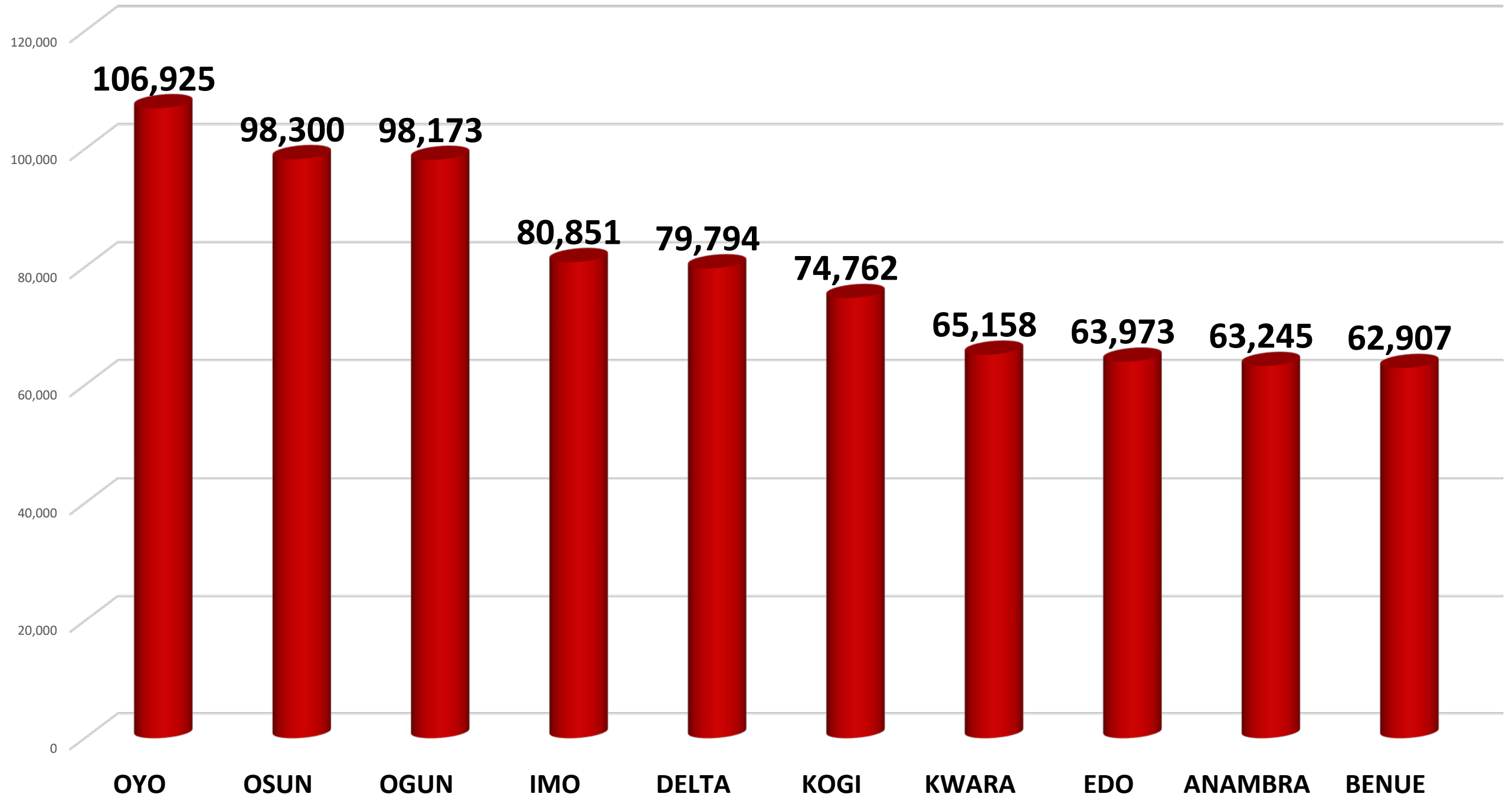
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2023 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN



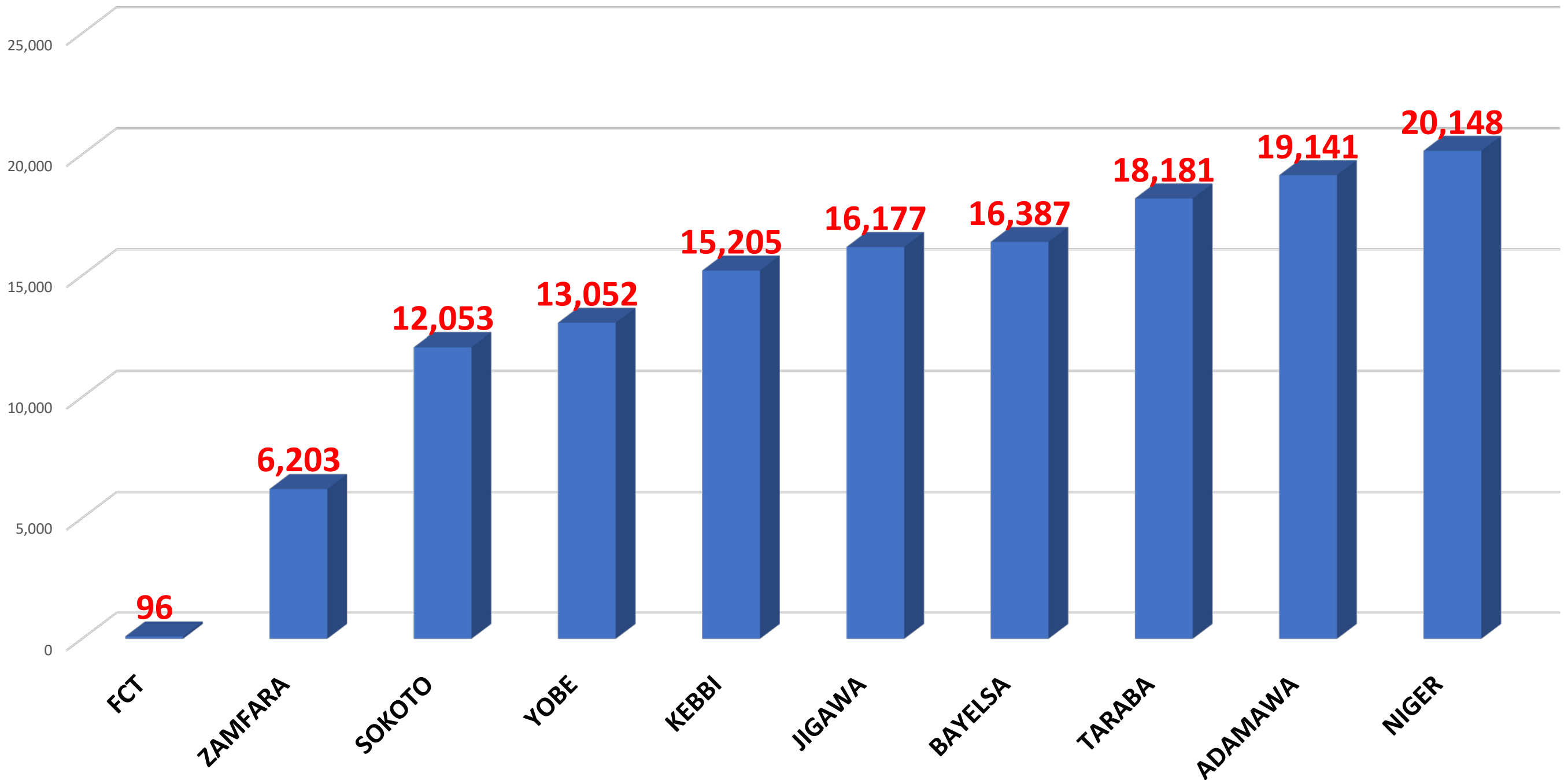
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2023 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN & GENDER



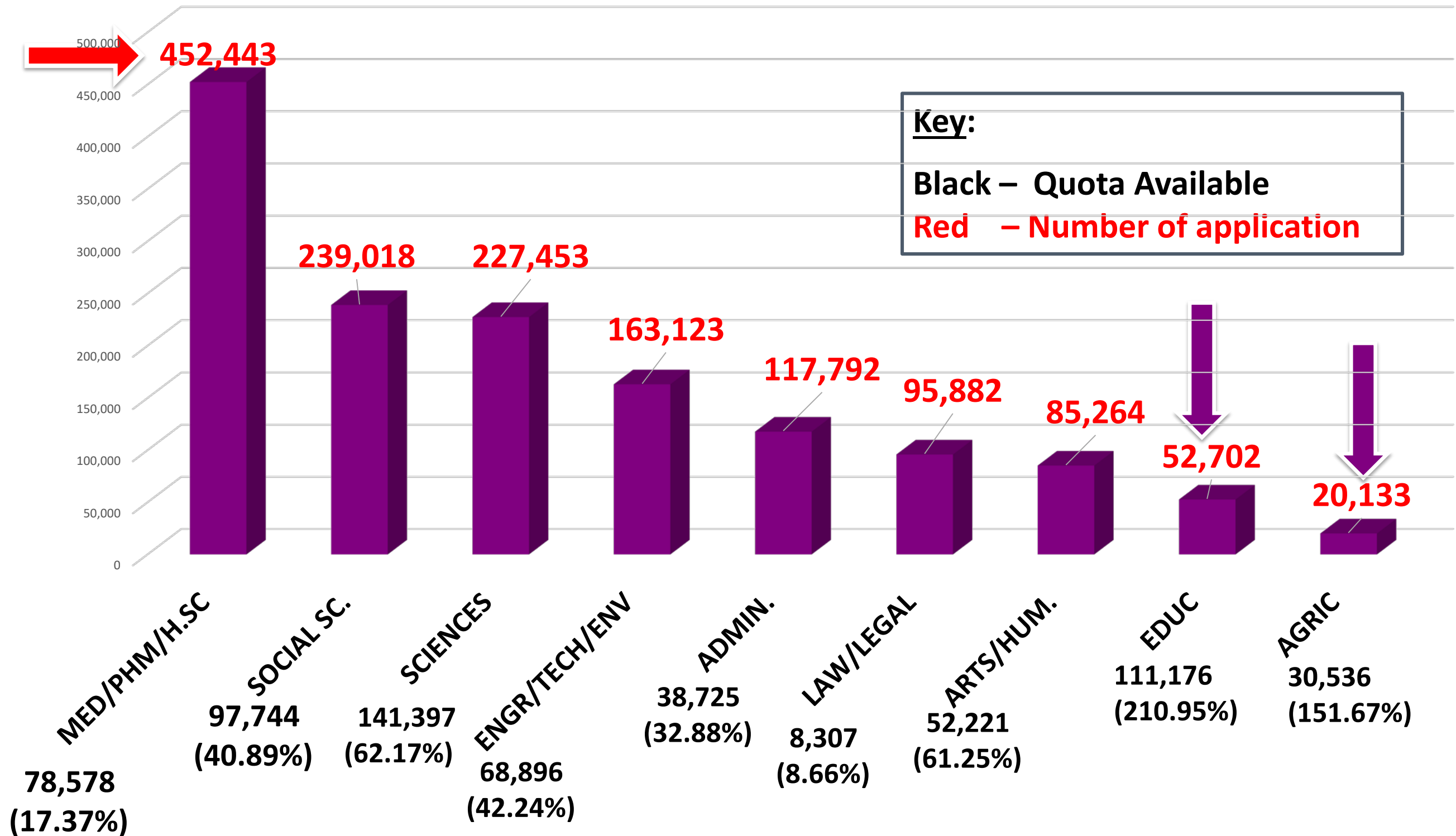
2023 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN (TOP TEN)



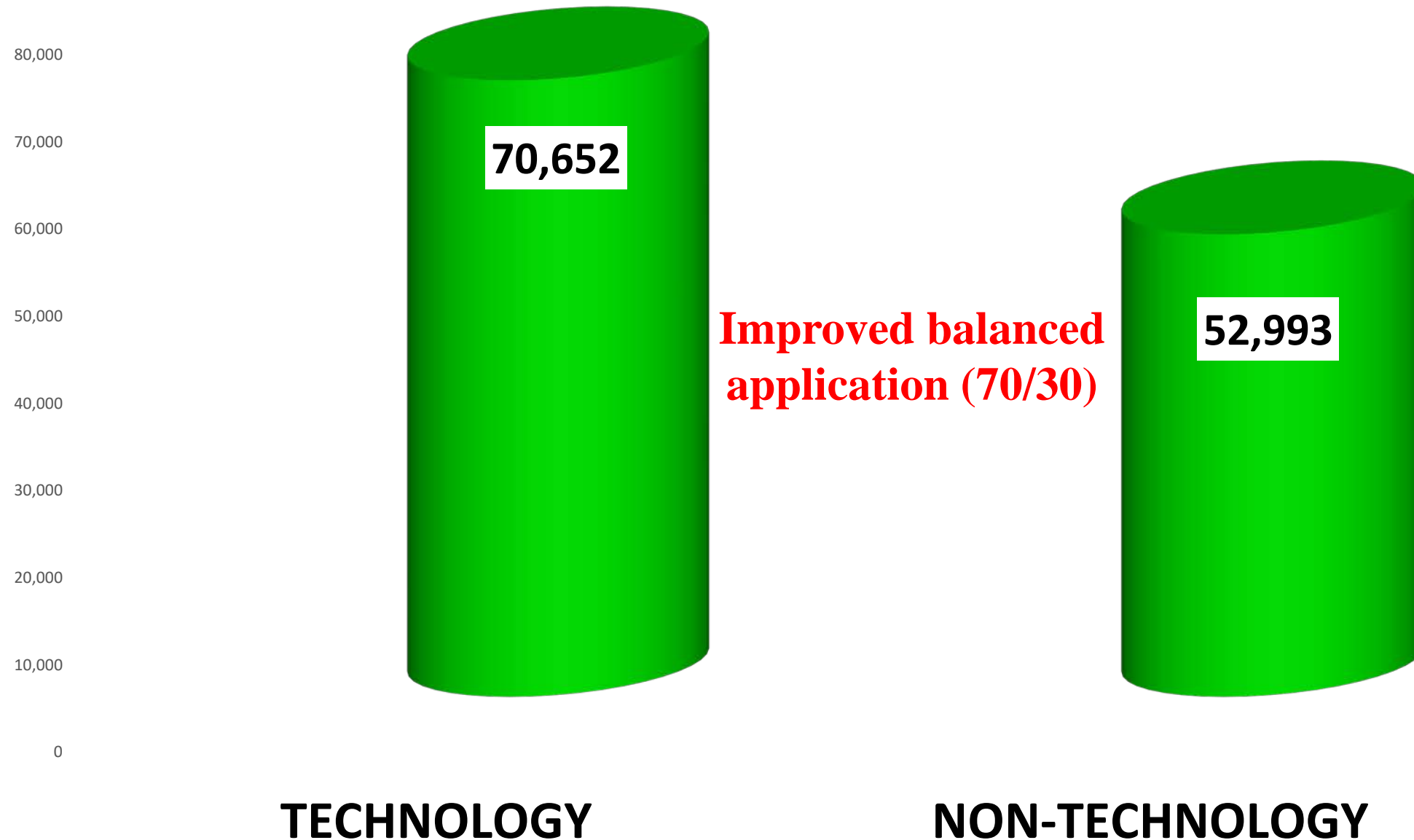
2023 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF ORIGIN (LOWEST TEN)



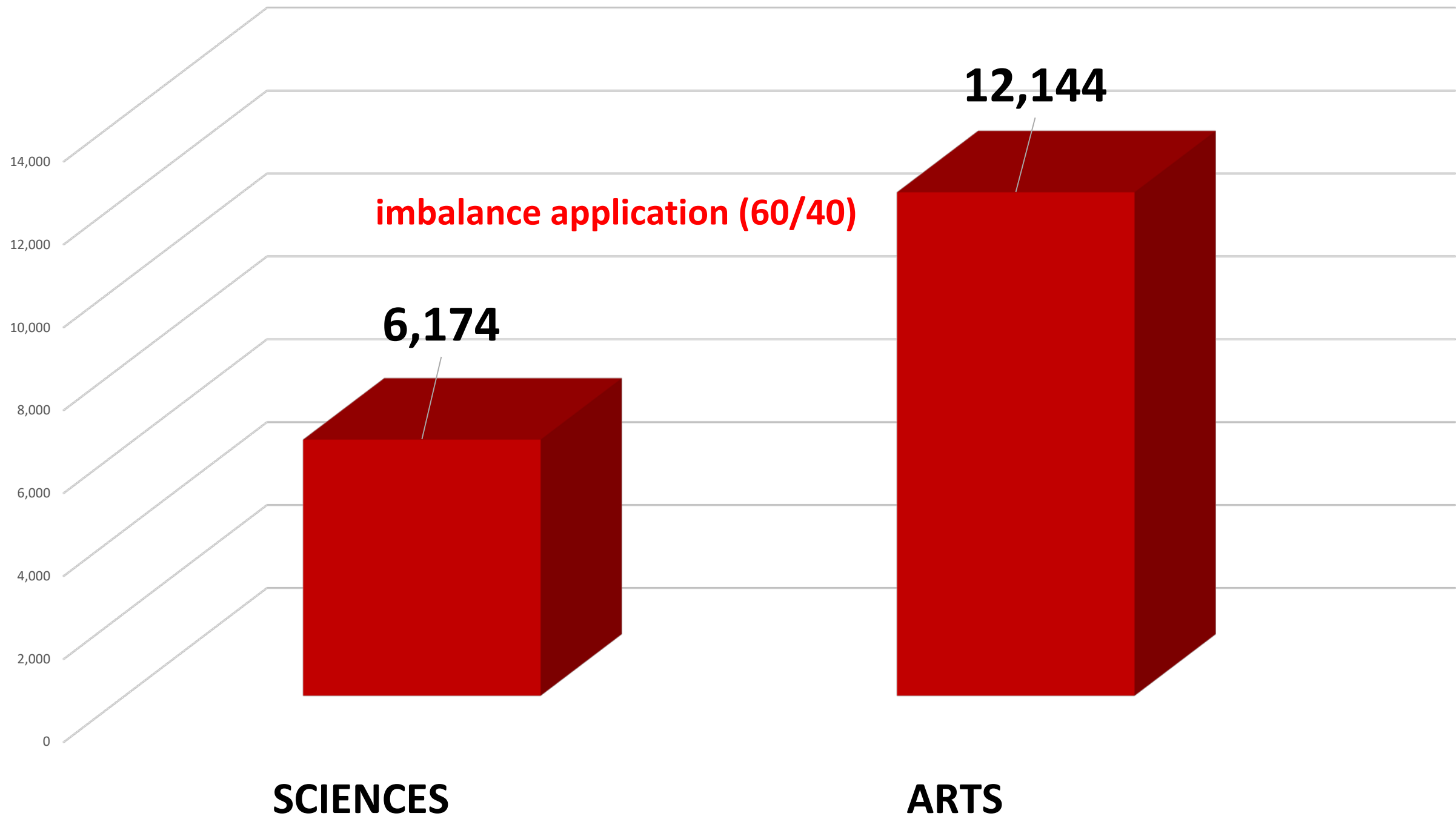

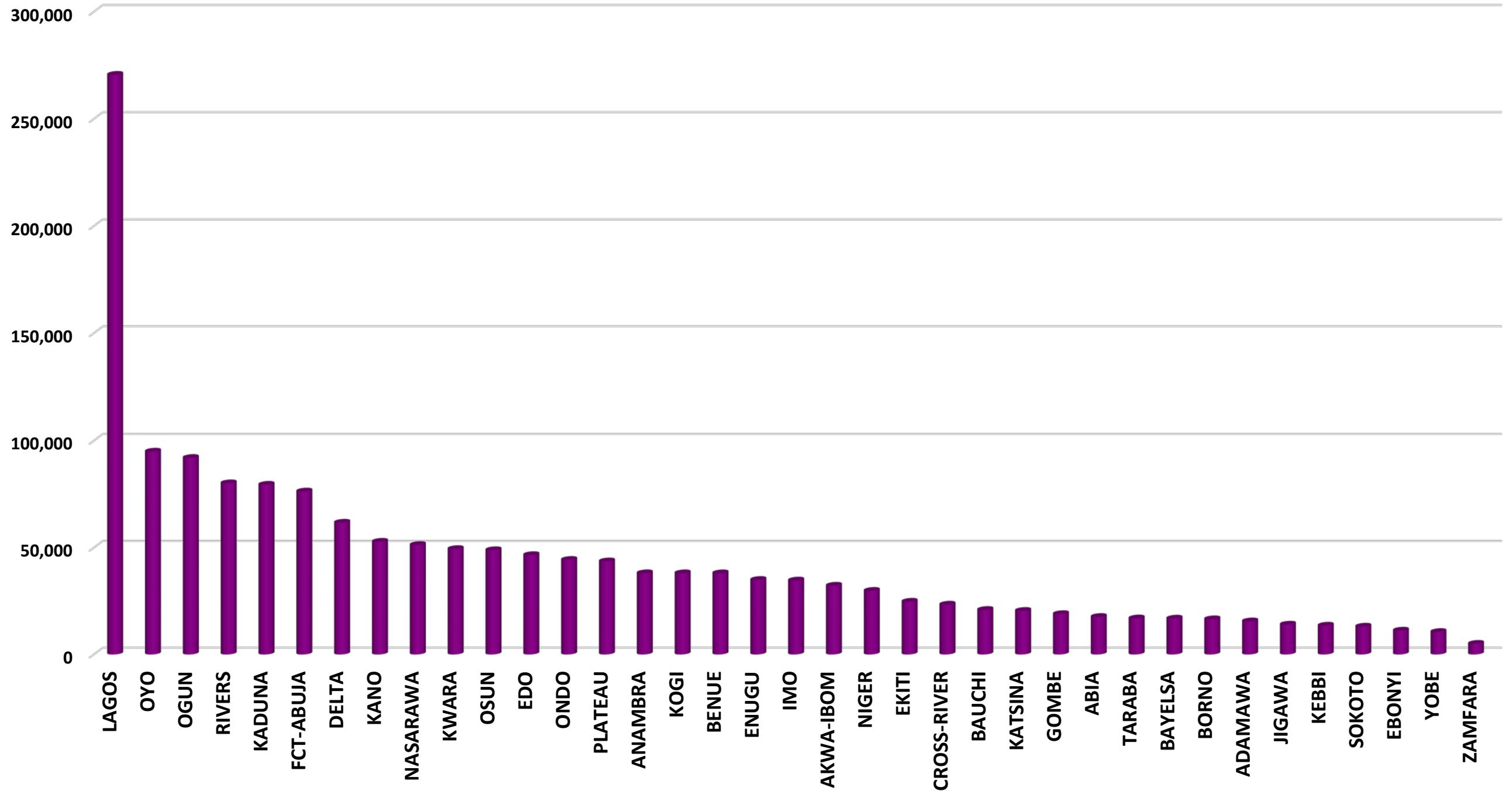

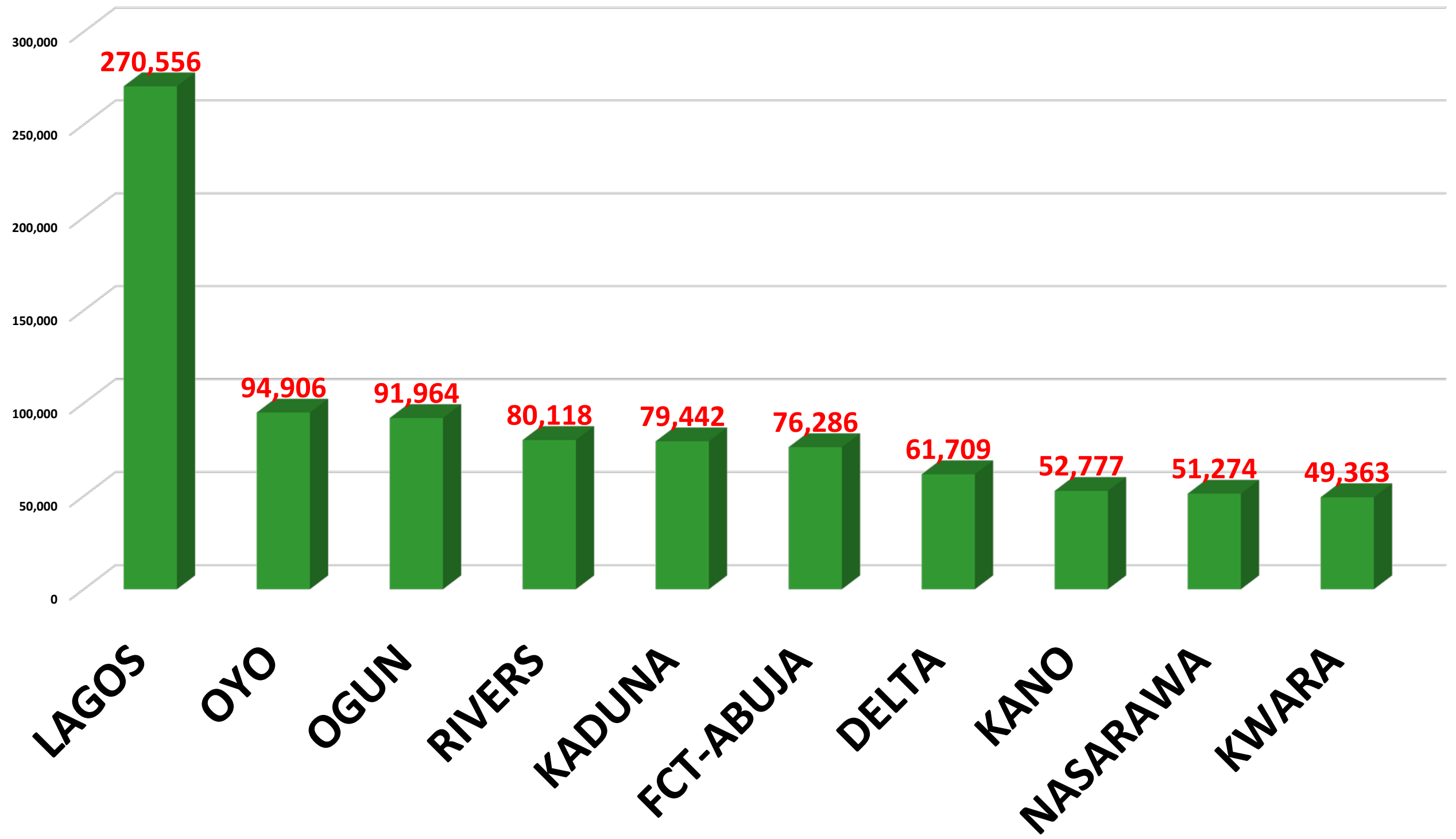

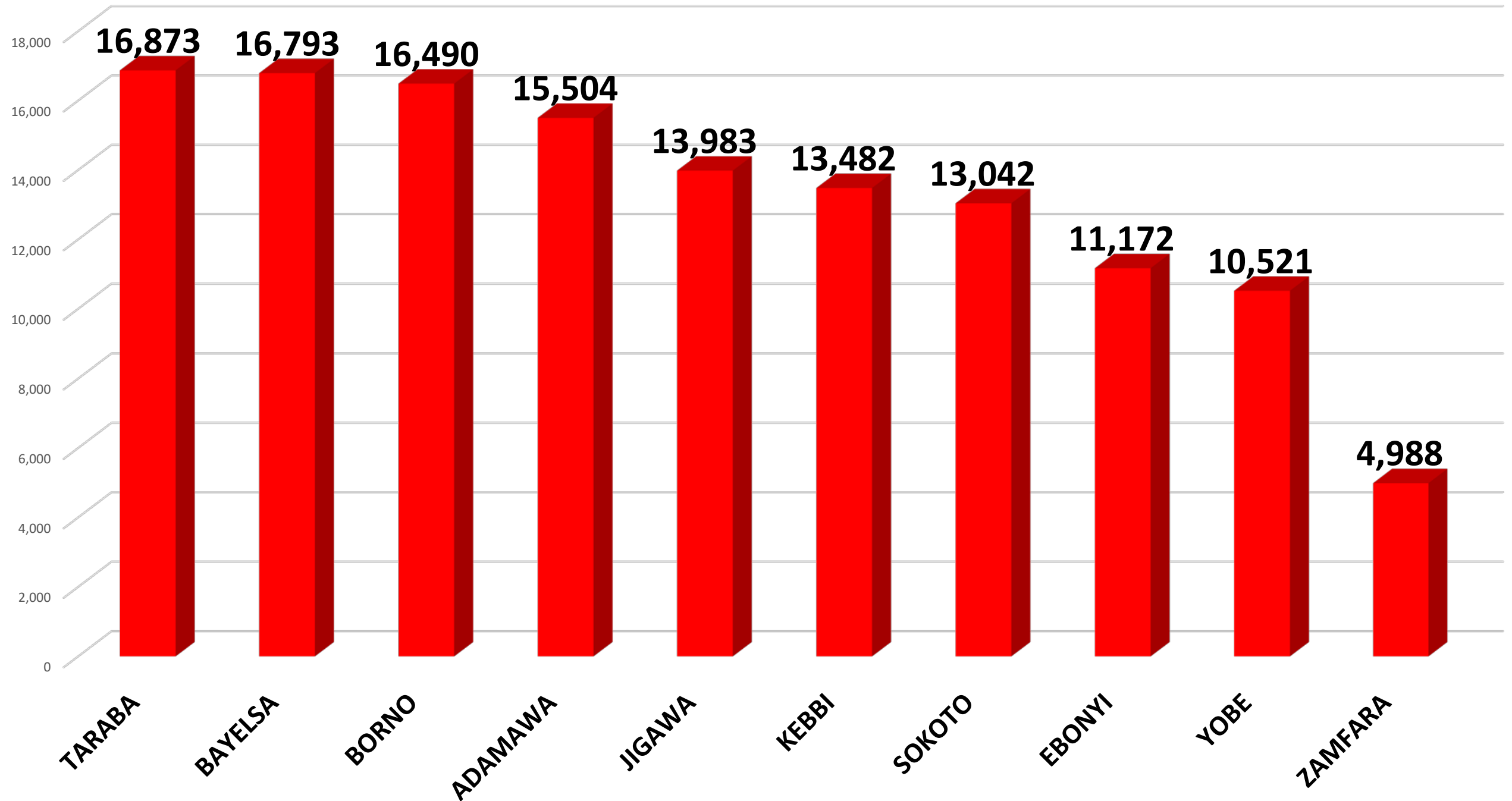
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2023 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF EXAMINATION

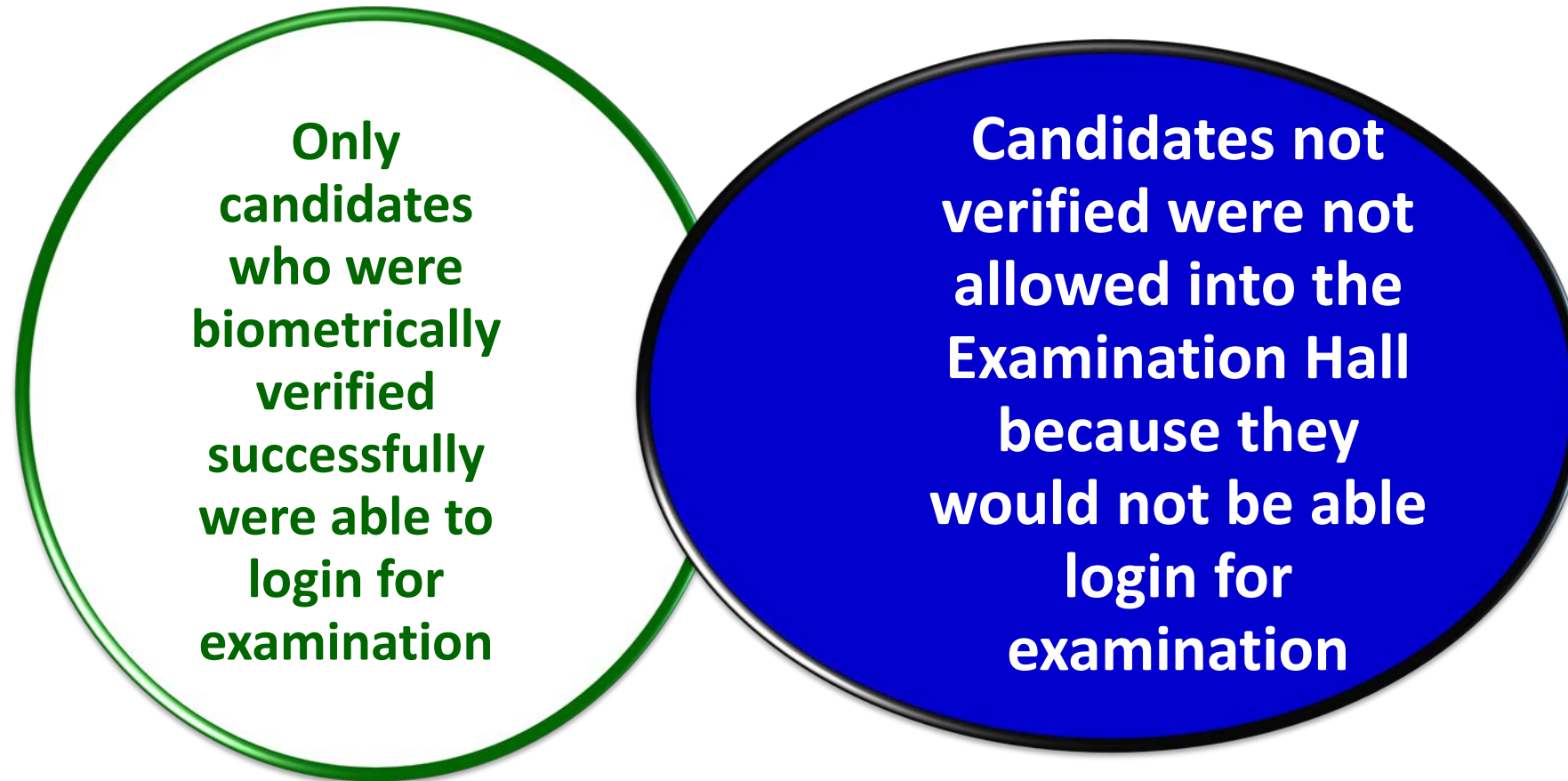


2023 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATE OF EXAMINATION (LOWEST TEN)

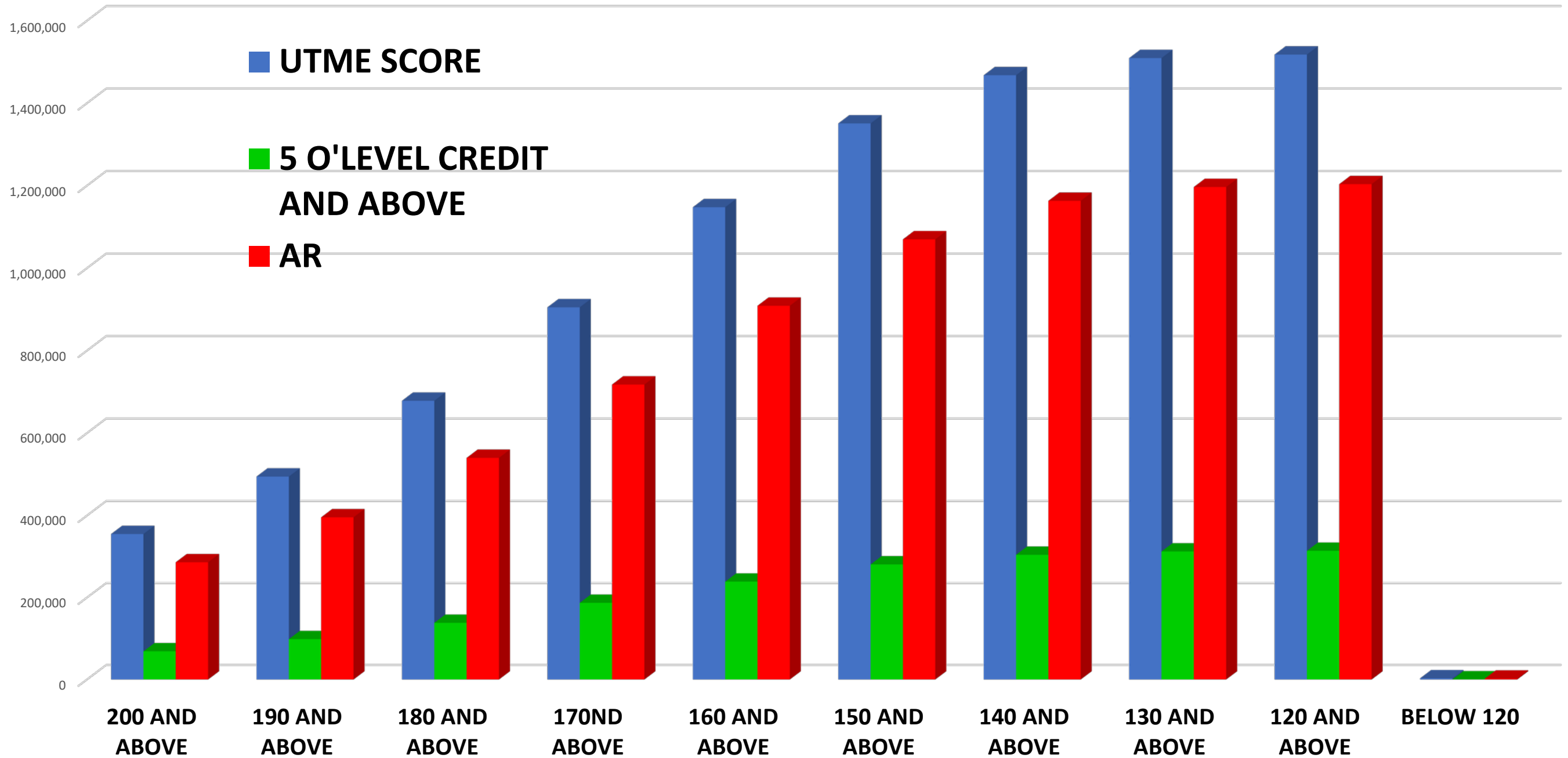

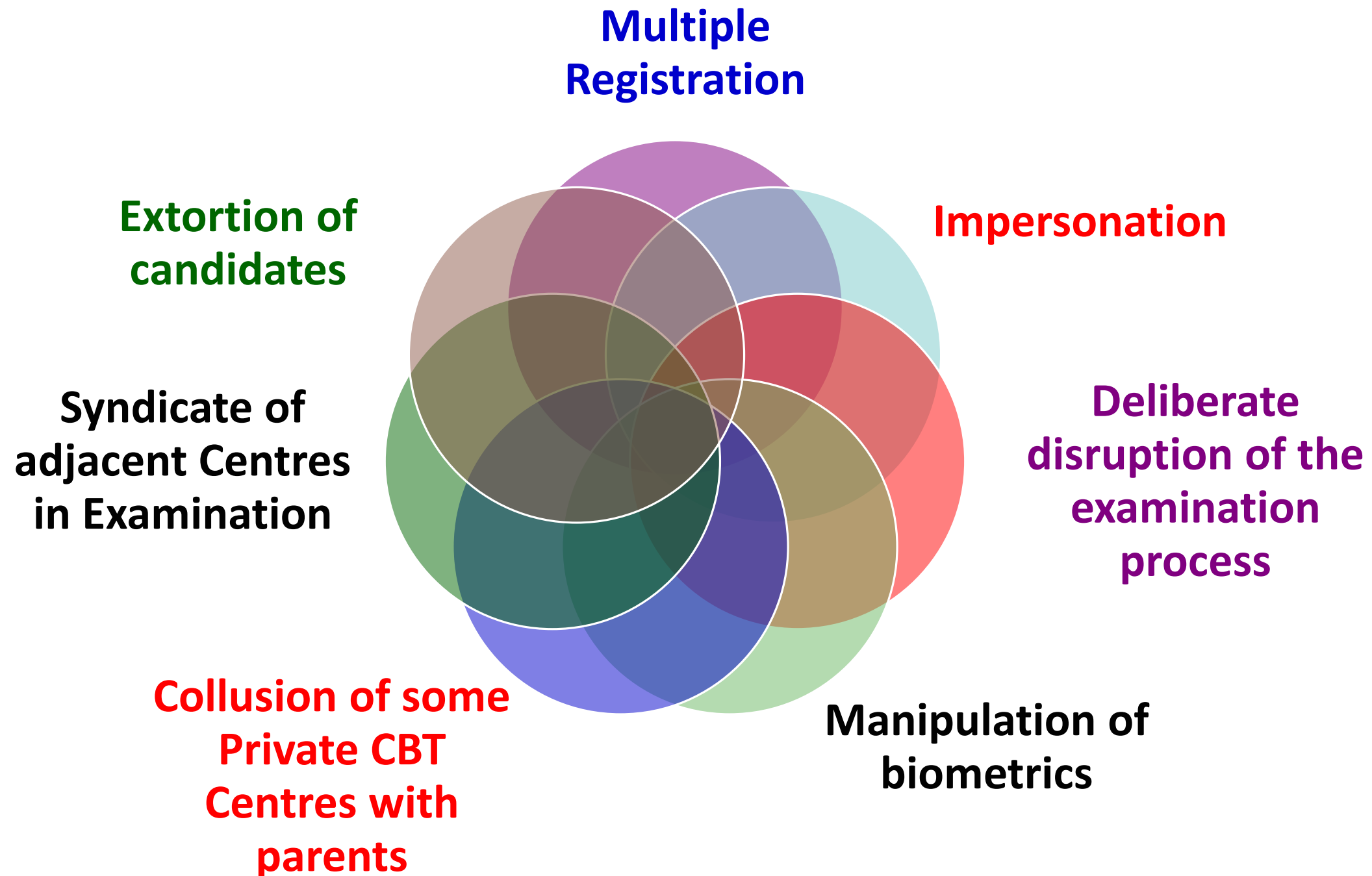

STRATEGIES OF MALPRACTICE



CURBING MALPRACTICE:

Institutions are not to capture new (or allow substitution) of photographs and finger prints

Capturing of fresh facial and finger biometric images of candidates encourages impersonation and substitution of paid examination takers with real candidates who must have engaged the paid examination takers for the SSCE and UTME

Concerted efforts by JAMB, other educational assessment bodies and the NYSC have implicated tertiary institutions (few of them) in the scandal

JAMB would make available (and for free) images and biometric of candidates



EXAMINATION MALPRACTICE

Role of Private School Operators



- ✓ There is need to continuously check the activities of the Operators of Private Schools
- ✓ WAEC recently identified 56 rogue website operators that leaked its 2023 May/June WASSCE
 - No fewer than 15 persons have been arrested including School Proprietors

Institutions must download available candidates' O' level results per programme before they can initiate admission process for each programme

No Download of Results, No Admission

FEATURES ON CAPS: Movement of Candidates

Before a candidate can be moved or transferred to another programme, there would be a transfer alert (**notification from CAPS**) to the candidate to either accept or reject the movement

If s/he presses YES, s/he moved to the new programme & **MUST** be admitted

At the point of Acceptance, s/he would be notified to do change of programme to be able to print his/her admission letter

If s/he presses NO or SILENT (no response), the candidate remains & cannot be moved anywhere

ACT of JAMB Section 5(1)(c)(iii) “the preferences expressed or otherwise indicated by candidates for certain tertiary institutions and courses”

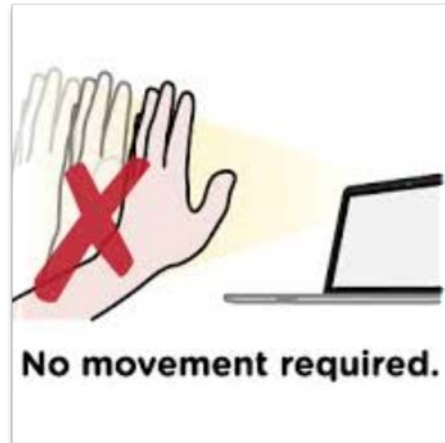

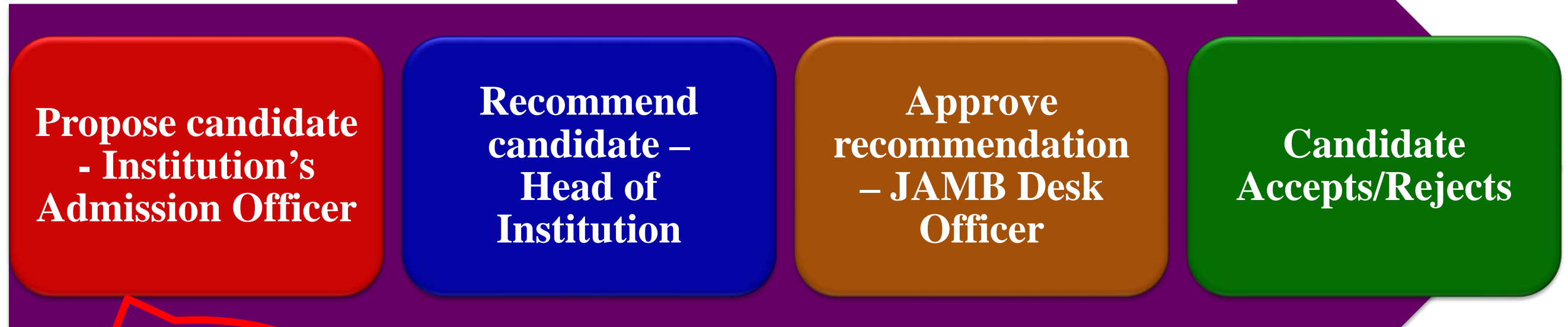

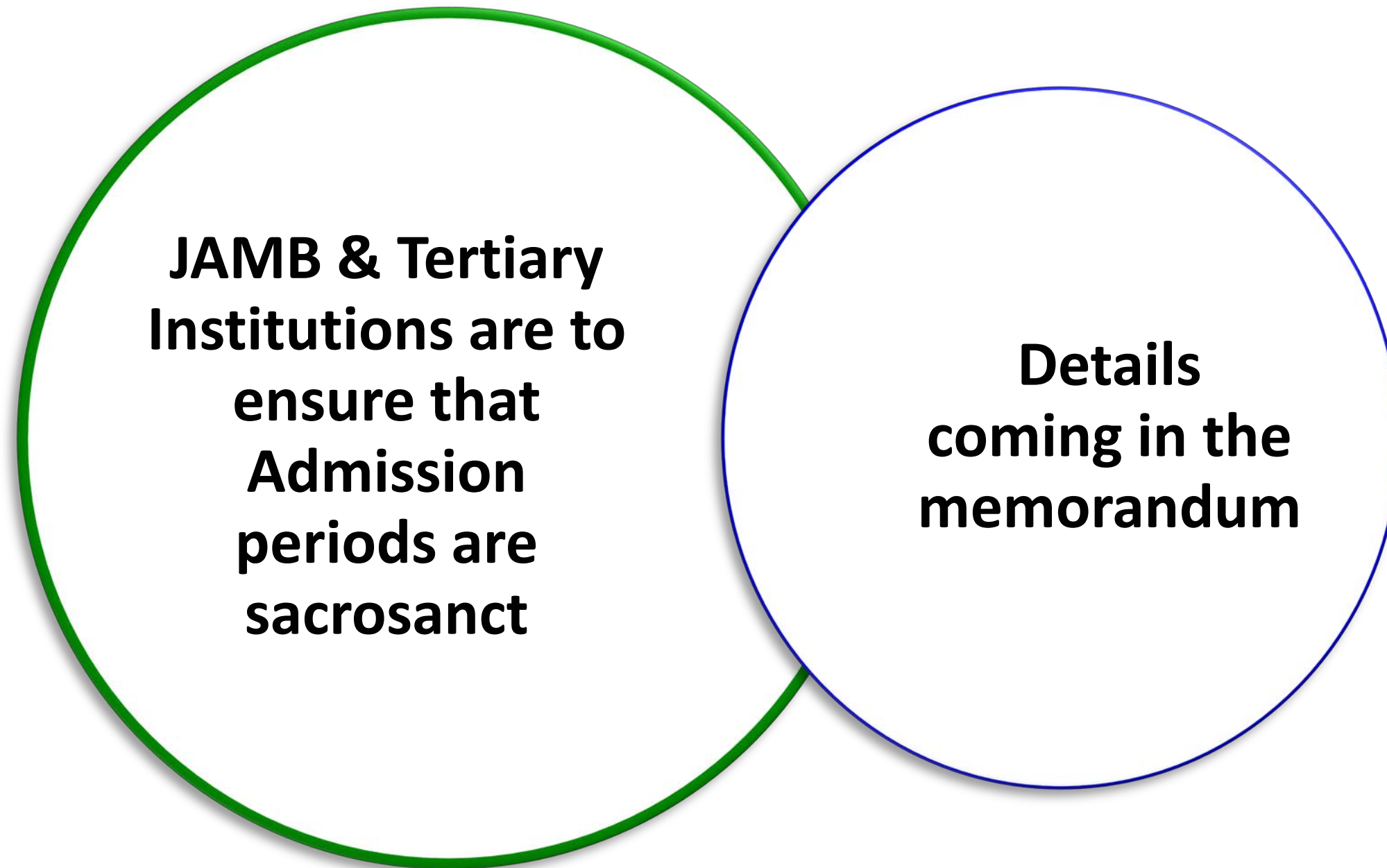

It is abnormal

What is available is National Tolerable Minimum UTME Score (NTMUS)

No institution can consider any candidate with score below it for admission

The Realistic Institutional Admittable Minimum UTME Scores (RIAMUS) is the minimum that Senate/Academic Board of each institution approved for consideration of admission

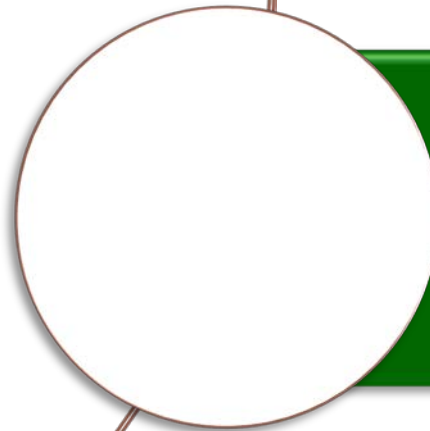

ADMISSION INTO NON-REGULAR MODE OF STUDY

(Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich Programmes)

- ✓ Candidates of Distance Learning, Part-Time, Outreach, Sandwich, etc. programmes are not required to sit for the UTME
- ✓ They apply and their applications processed the same way just as the DE candidates
- ✓ They belong to a separate matriculation list
- ✓ They are not available for mobilisation by NYSC
- ✓ **They can only apply for Exemption**

PROFILE EXCLUSIVE TO CANDIDATES: NO THIRD-PARTY INTERFERENCE

The Board has banned all third-party interactions on its portal for any of its services

- cases have been reported with conflicting authorisation for changes on candidates' data, majorly between candidates and their parents or guardians

Fraudsters taking advantage of the naivety of some candidates to collect their vital access codes to effect unauthorised changes on their profiles

Consequently, nobody, including parents or guardians or any proxy, would have access to transact any business on candidate's profile because fingerprint (or OTP) would be required

It has a tracking number that is issued once a ticket is raised. If not attended to, the number can be use as evidence to track the officer scheduled who would be sanctioned

- ✓ Make a realistic requests including UTME subjects combination & O' level credit passes
- ✓ Remedial students must also have minimum institutional score
- ✓ Head of institutions or Registrars should personally make such requests
- ✓ JAMB received requests for lowering of minimum scores from Institutions to be able to attract enough candidates

FALSE ALARM - Admission into MBBS, UNIZIK

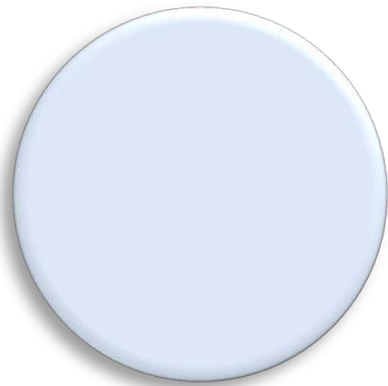
A Parent accused Unizik that admission into MBBS has been hijacked

He claimed his child was not considered for admission, though qualified

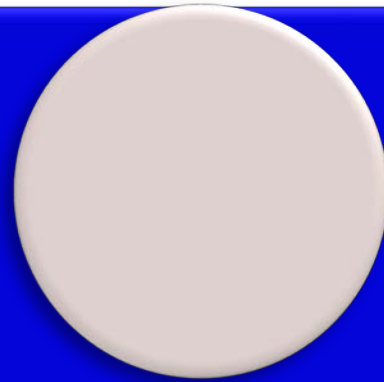
- ✓ The candidate is from Imo State and a catchment area of the institution
- ✓ The merit cut off mark for MBBS is **78.67**
- ✓ His ranking order on CAPS is number 61 and aggregate score of **77.40%**
- ✓ The ranking order of the last candidate admitted on catchment from Imo state on CAPS is 54 and aggregate score of **77.93%**
- ✓ Candidate did not meet up with the cut-off mark set by the institution for MBBS
- ✓ JAMB's policy is to deal directly with the candidates and educate them on the process

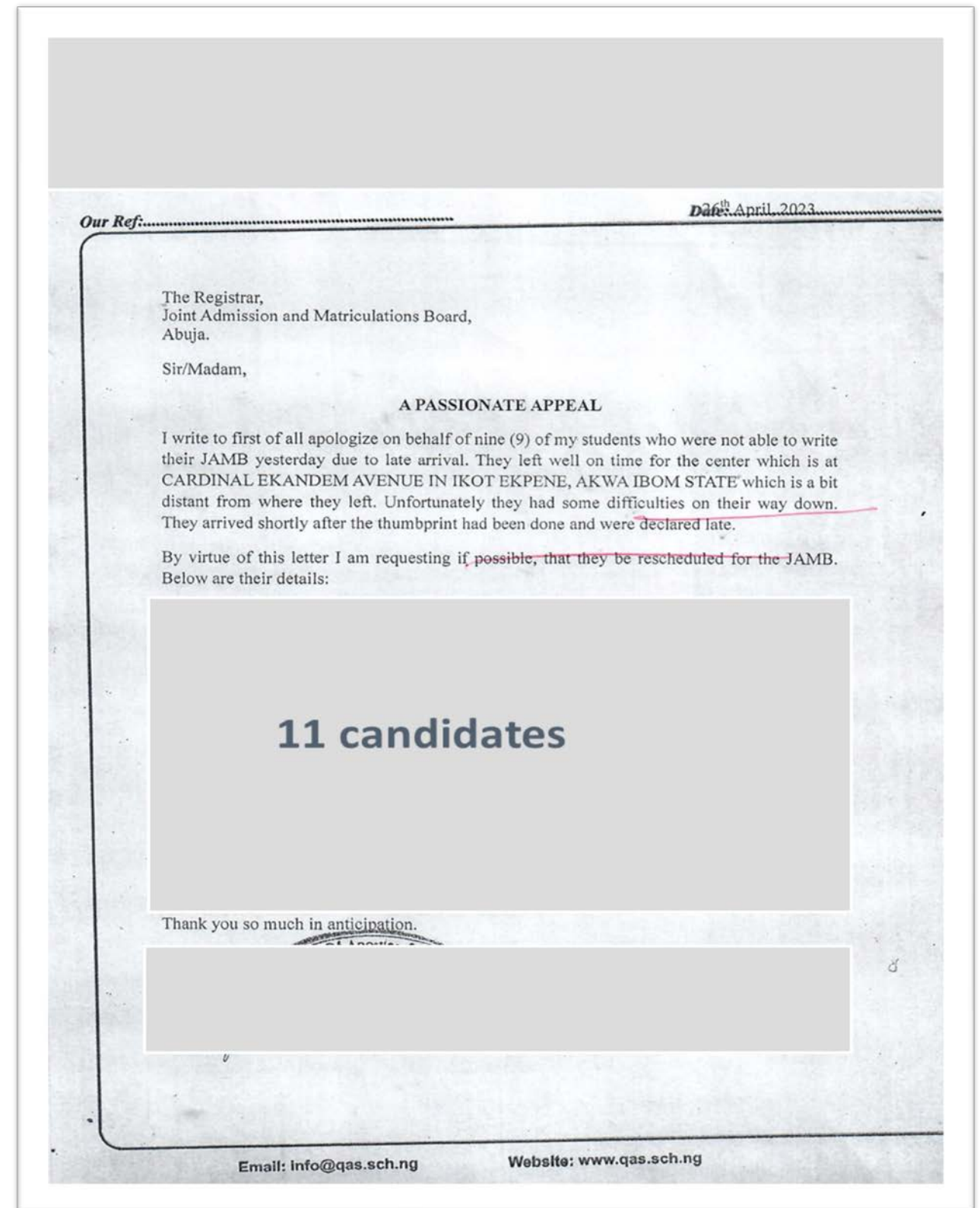
INTRUSION OF SCHOOLS ON BEHALF OF ABSENTEE CANDIDATES



A Principal wrote on behalf of **11 candidates** that JAMB should rescheduled 2023 UTME for the candidates



He claimed the candidates had some difficulties on their way down and “they arrived shortly after the thumbprint had been done and were declared late”

INTRUSION OF SCHOOL PRINCIPALS AND OTHER INTERLOPERS

Seizing Candidates Examination Slip by the School Officials



A candidate was scheduled to write 9:00a.m. UTME at ETC Nigeria Ltd, JKK Lagos

He was outside from 6:00a.m. waiting for the 2p.m. examination when his contemporaries were in the hall writing the examination



His notification slip was seized by the school and handed to him on the examination day with a wrong information that he was to sit for the examination at 2p.m.



He did not read the notice until when asked to check at 2p.m. He missed the examination

CHALLENGES OF THE BOARD CONT.

ANOTHER INTRUSION OF SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

- ✓ A Principal wrote on behalf of candidates from his School to be rescheduled.
- ✓ He claimed the candidates' "systems failed at the middle of the examination and were unable to complete their question"
- ✓ The truth is that the
 - first candidate has **174** responses out of 180
 - second candidate has **176** responses out of 180
 - third candidate has **140** responses out of 180
- ✓ The complaint cannot be justified
 -it's just an attempt of the Proprietor of the Private School to hoodwink the Board and justify the huge fees

INTRUSION OF SCHOOLS ON BEHALF OF ABSENTEE CANDIDATES

- ✓ A Principal wrote for “a passionate appeal to reschedule UTME examination for **(2023.....694EF)** and **(2023.....169CA)**”
- ✓ He claimed the two candidates were unable to arrive at the examination venue due to heavy rain that persisted for hours on the day of the examination
- ✓ He wanted examination rescheduled for the two students **“so that they can demonstrate their knowledge and abilities”**
- ✓ **How did the other candidates get to the examination centres in the town?**

INTRUSION OF SCHOOLS – REGISTERING FOR CANDIDATES

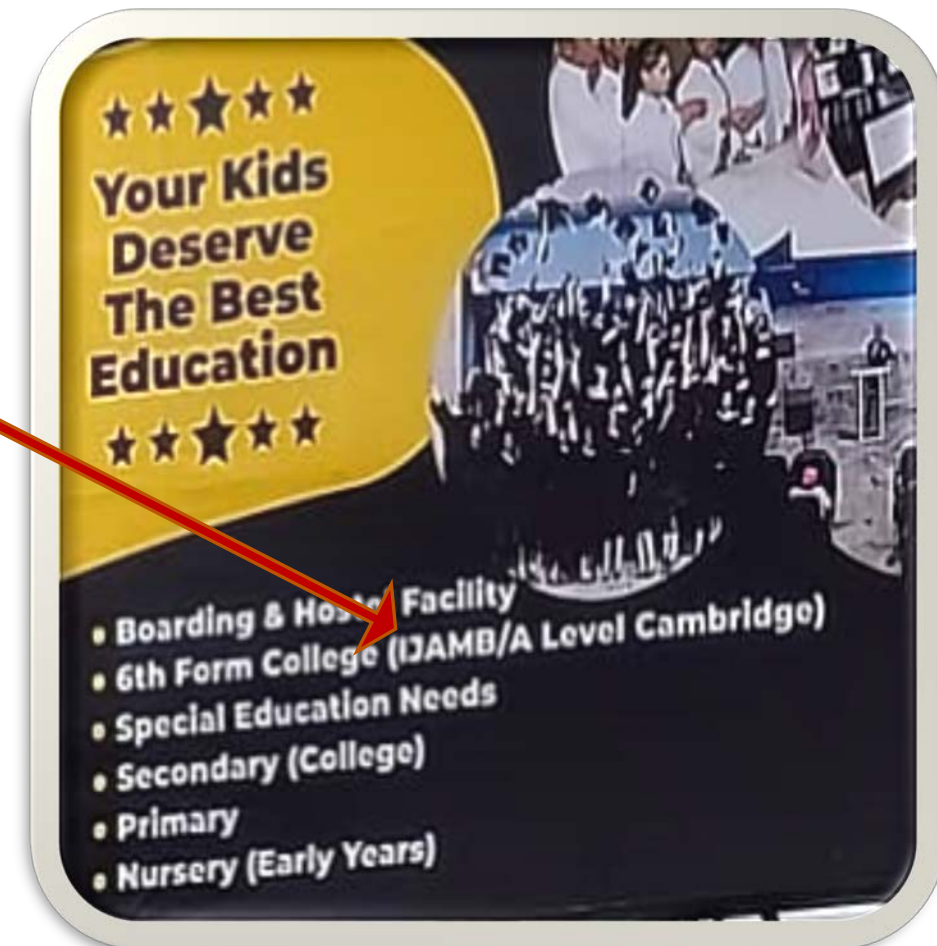
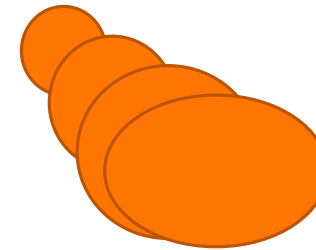

- ✓ JAMB received an appeal by a parliamentarian on behalf of a candidate
- ✓ He claimed that “the IT person in charge of her school chose a wrong a centre in error during the 2023 registration process, and efforts to adjust same have proved abortive”
- ✓ The truth about these Schools is that they collect extra fees from these candidates and compile their details
 - In the process, they commit irreversible errors
 - Mix-up data of candidates

INTRUSION OF HOSPITALS ON BEHALF OF ABSENTEE CANDIDATE

- ✓ A Medical Director wrote “an appeal for rescheduling of a candidate (2023.....111EF), 16 years”
- ✓ He claimed the candidate was presented to his hospital on **24/04/2023** with the complaints of Severe epigastric pains, vomiting of blood and fever for over 6 hours prior to presentation
- ✓ The candidate was discharged on the 26th April, 2023, which was the day of his examination at 6:30a.m.
- ✓ The letter delivered to the Board on **19th May, 2023**, and backdated to **26th April, 2023**
 - the Board had taken decision to reschedule candidates who were present at the examination venue but had genuine problem to be rescheduled

CHALLENGES OF THE BOARD CONT.

PARENTS' INVOLVEMENT (20230....43DA)

- ✓ A **Deaf and lame candidate** wishing to study Law at the University of Ilorin
- ✓ She registered at JAMB Office in Kaduna
- ✓ She had no Literature in English, which is a pre-requisite for Law
- ✓ Unknown to her, her registration template was altered at the instance of her Step-Father
- ✓ The Step-Father does not want her to go far from home
- ✓ Result on the template she filled was changed to Awaiting Result
- ✓ Law changed to Sociology
- ✓ UNILORIN changed to Kaduna State University
- ✓ Candidate raised ticket and complained of discrimination
- ✓ **JAMB had to reversed the changes to her choices**

ABSENTEE CANDIDATE REQUESTING FOR RESCHEDULE

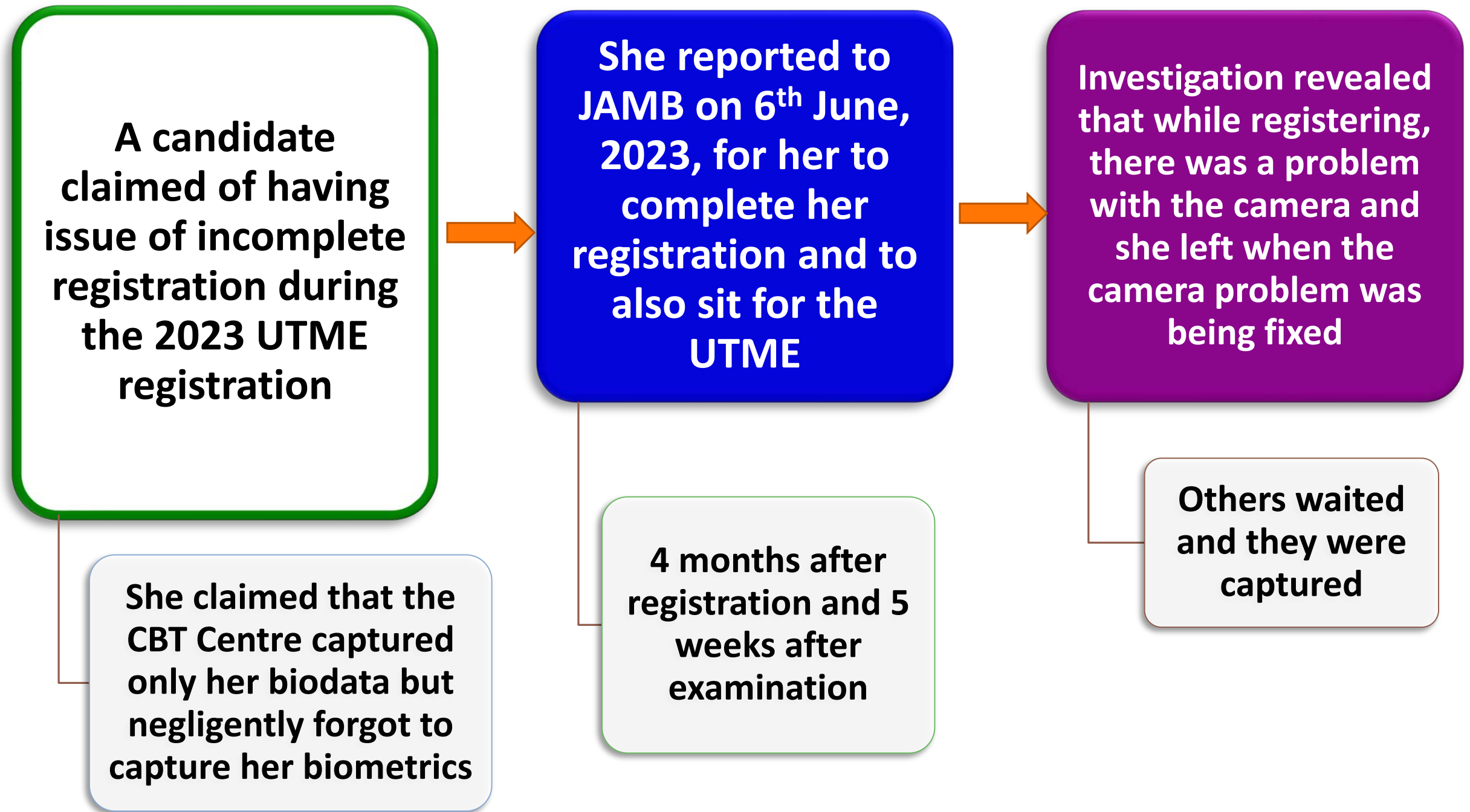

A GENUINE AND SUCCESSFUL PROTEST

A candidate **(2022..096GA)** petitioned the Board that she was denied admission by the Federal University Oye-Ekiti

The Quota for the Programme (Radiology) is 207 and all had been filled

Her aggregate score is **63.35** as against **31.35** recorded for her in CAPS, which is for UTME score only

SUCCESS

The error was corrected and she was admitted

CHALLENGES OF THE BOARD CONT.

SELF-INFLICTED PROBLEMS ON CONDONEMENT OF UNDISCLOSED ADMISSION (2017 – 2020)



**What we
discovered**

- ✓ Some candidates were already admitted in other institutions and refused to accept the admission.
 - They were then 'admitted' outside CAPS by another institution
 - With the 2017-2020 waiver, the institution proposed them for condonement and they failed
 - Reason why the application is throwing up error messages was the candidates exist elsewhere

- ✓ These category of candidates must go back to the institution that admitted them and delete the previous admission before they can be condoned
 - Administrative fee could be imposed by the institution for wasting of its quota

PROPOSALS FROM THE VCs AND RECTORS

Condonement of Undisclosed Illegal Institutional Admission (CUIIA)

- ✓ The AVCNU at a meeting (21st September, 2022) with JAMB pleaded that JAMB should change the name -Undisclosed Illegal Institutional Admission- on admission Letter
 - JAMB accepted and requested the VCs to suggest a name for the illegal admissions to the Board
 - JAMB is yet to receive a response from the VCs
- ✓ The Rectors requested JAMB to change the caption “Condonement of Illegitimate Admission” on regularization form to “Condonement of Admission outside CAPS”
- ✓ The VCs were very helpful in proposing that the Matriculation Lists on which purported undisclosed illegal admission are based should be pre-submitted to JAMB for cross-checking
 - Very helpful but yet to be done
 - The promised formal letter is still being awaited
- ✓ **JAMB expectantly looks forward to it**

WAITING PERIOD TO ACCEPT ADMISSION

- ✓ How long does a candidate have to accept an admission being offered to him/her?
- ✓ Every candidate is now required to accept his/her admission within **2 weeks** from the date of approval by JAMB
- ✓ We propose that:
 - If not accepted at the expiration of the period, the admission should be reversed automatically
 - The institution is also notified & quota is released
 - The candidate is returned back to the pool with an **indicator** of “previously admitted but no acceptance”.
- ✓ **This is for decision of the heads of Institutions**



STATISTICS OF UPGRADE FROM UTME to DE

About **30%** of candidates seeking upgrade from UTME to DE with fresh good A/Level results obtain less than 160 UTME marks for the same year

This should set us thinking about the emerging proliferation "**6th Form**" phenomenon

Some of the candidates have **no O/Level qualifications for the A/Level subjects** they are sitting for in the same year

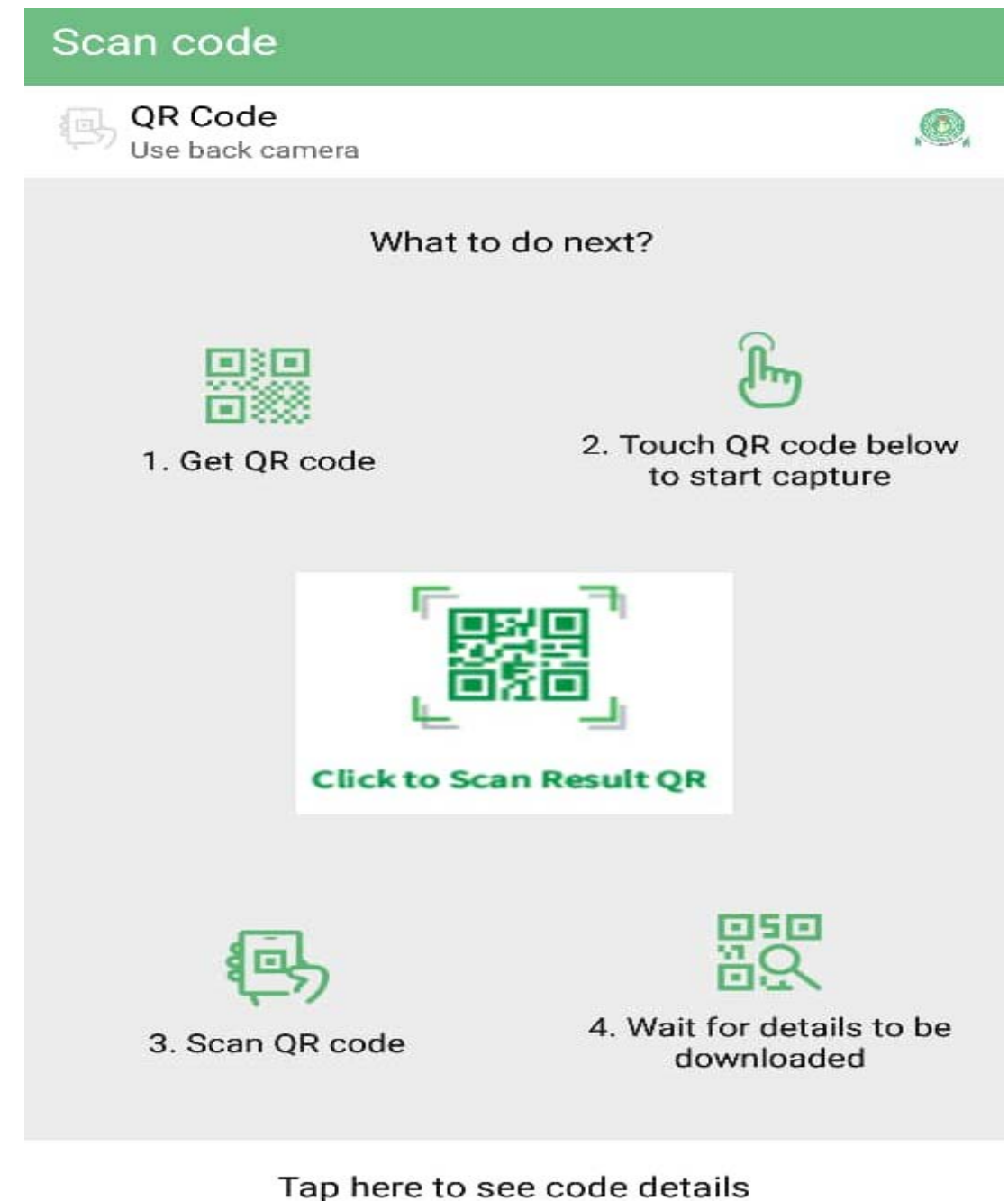
This is contrary to the standard

HOW TO DETECT FAKE RESULT SLIPS AND ADMISSION LETTERS

JAMB QR SCANNER

- ✓ Download the “**JAMB QR Scanner**” on your phone or similar devices from Apple and Google Play Stores (scans everything)
- ✓ Used to verify the security features on documents such as name, registration number, institution/programme



VERIFICATION OF DIRECT ENTRY QUALIFICATION

Expulsion of 27 Students by Federal University, Gusau, Zamfara State

- ✓ **JAMB, in March, 2023, requested institutions to verify the qualifications of candidates admitted through Direct Entry**
- ✓ **Federal University, Gusau, Zamfara State identified **27 Students** whose certificates were found to be faked/forged**
 - The affected students comprised of both UTME and DE entrants
 - 20 were UTME entrants for the years 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2018
 - The 27 students were immediately expelled from the University
- ✓ **We appreciate the commitment demonstrated by the Federal University, Gusau, Zamfara State**

- ✓ Establishment of mobile examinational malpractice tribunal to deal with the criminal aspect while institutions handles the misconduct
